Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
Statutes, in registration of vehicles, further providing for
person with disability plate and placard.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1338(c) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania

- 10 (c) Health care provider's statement.--
- 11 (1) Any person applying for a special plate or parking
- 12 placard for persons with disabilities must present a
- 13 statement, certified by a physician, podiatrist,
- 14 chiropractor, optometrist, physician assistant, licensed
- 15 <u>physical therapist</u> or certified registered nurse practitioner
- licensed or certified to practice in this Commonwealth or in
- a contiguous state, that the person with a disability is
- disabled as provided in subsection (a).
- 19 (2) Any person applying for a renewal of registration of

- 1 a special plate for persons with disabilities must comply
- with this subsection. Once a person with a disability has
- 3 been duly certified by a physician, podiatrist, chiropractor,
- 4 optometrist, physician assistant, licensed physical therapist
- 5 or certified registered nurse practitioner as being disabled,
- as provided in subsection (a), the applicant need not submit
- 7 a certification for subsequent renewals of registration for a
- 8 special plate for persons with disabilities. A person who was
- 9 issued a person with disability plate under this section and
- 10 no longer qualifies for one shall not be charged a
- 11 replacement fee for a regular registration plate upon payment
- of the regular registration fee.
- 13 (3) In lieu of a health care provider's statement, a
- person applying for a special plate or parking placard may
- present a statement from a police officer certifying that the
- person does not have full use of a leg, or both legs, or is
- 17 blind.
- 18 (4) The department shall phase out existing handicapped
- 19 placards as soon as practicable and issue a new series to
- 20 persons who comply with this section.
