10	Section 1. Section 201(12) of the act of November 24, 1998
11	(P.L.882, No.111), known as the Crime Victims Act, is amended
12	and the section is amended by adding a paragraph to read:
13	Section 201. Rights.
14	Victims of crime have the following rights:
15	* * *
16	(2.1) To not be excluded from any criminal proceeding
17	unless the court, based on the record before it, determines
18	that testimony by the victim would be materially altered if
19	the victim heard other testimony at the proceeding. Before
20	making a determination, the court shall make every effort to

- 1 permit the fullest attendance possible by the victim and
- 2 shall consider reasonable alternatives to the exclusion of
- 3 the victim. The reason for any exclusion shall be clearly
- 4 <u>stated on the record.</u>

- 6 (12) To be notified of the details of the final
- 7 disposition of the case of a juvenile consistent with 42

- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
