14	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
15	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
16	context clearly indicates otherwise:

18	"Law enforcement officer." [An officer of the United States,
19	the Commonwealth or a political subdivision thereof, another

state or political subdivision thereof or who is empowered by 1 law to conduct investigations of or to make arrests for offenses 2 enumerated in this chapter or an equivalent crime in another 3 jurisdiction, a sheriff or deputy sheriff and any attorney 4 authorized by law to prosecute or participate in the prosecution 5 of the offense.] <u>A member of the Pennsylvania State Police, an</u> 6 7 individual employed as a police officer who holds a current_ certificate under 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D (relating to 8 municipal police education and training), a sheriff or a deputy 9 10 sheriff. * * * 11 Section 2. The definitions of "college," "police 12 department," "police officer" and "university" in section 2162 13 14 of Title 53 are amended to read: 15 § 2162. Definitions. 16 The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter 17 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

20 "College." A college which has a campus police department, as used in section 2416 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, 21 22 No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, certified by 23 the Office of Attorney General as a criminal justice agency under the definition of "criminal justice agency" in 18 Pa.C.S. 24 25 § 9102 (relating to definitions). [The term does not include the State System of Higher Education and its member institutions.] 26 * * * 27

28 "Police department." Any of the following:

(1) A public agency of a political subdivision havinggeneral police powers and charged with making arrests in

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connection with the enforcement of the criminal or traffic
 laws. This paragraph includes the sheriff's office in a
 county of the second class.

A campus police or university police department, as 4 (2) 5 used in section 2416 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, 6 No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, certified 7 by the Office of Attorney General as a criminal justice 8 agency under the definition of "criminal justice agency" in 9 18 Pa.C.S. § 9102 (relating to definitions). [This paragraph 10 does not include a campus police or university police department of the State System of Higher Education and its 11

(3) A railroad or street railway police department
formed with officers commissioned under 22 Pa.C.S. Ch. 33
(relating to railroad and street railway police) or any prior
statute providing for such commissioning.

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(4) The Capitol Police.

(7) A county park police force under section 2511(b) of

23 "Police officer." Any of the following:

(1) A full-time or part-time employee assigned to
 criminal or traffic law enforcement duties of any of the
 following:

27 (i) A police department of a county, city, borough,28 town or township.

30 (iii) Any campus or university police department,

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1 including the State System of Higher Education and its 2 member institutions. 3 (iv) The Capitol Police. The Harrisburg International Airport Police. 4 (V) (vi) An airport authority police department. 5 A deputy sheriff of a county of the second class. 6 (2) 7 (3) A security officer of a first class city housing 8 authority or a police officer of a second class city housing 9 authority. AUTOMATIC CERTIFICATION. 25 * * * 26 27 (E) SCHOOL POLICE OFFICER CERTIFICATION. -- NOTWITHSTANDING 28 ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW TO THE CONTRARY, A SCHOOL POLICE 29 OFFICER, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 1301-C OF THE ACT OF MARCH 14, 1949 (P.L.30, NO.14), KNOWN AS THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CODE OF 1949, 30 20210HB1988PN3592

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SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO MAINTAIN CERTIFICATION IF THE SCHOOL POLICE 1 2 OFFICER MEETS THE FOLLOWING: 3 (1) SATISFACTORILY COMPLETED THE BASIC EDUCATIONAL AND TRAINING REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SUBCHAPTER. 4 5 (2) SATISFACTORILY COMPLETED THE MINIMUM NUMBER OF IN-6 SERVICE TRAINING HOURS ESTABLISHED BY THE COMMISSION AND 7 REQUIRED TO MAINTAIN CERTIFICATION. 8 (3) EITHER: 9 (I) HAS AN ACTIVE CERTIFICATION ON OR AFTER THE 10 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBSECTION; OR 11 (II) WAS PREVIOUSLY CERTIFIED AS A SCHOOL POLICE <---12 OFFICER BY THE COMMISSION, WHICH CERTIFICATION LAPSED WITHIN THE LAST TWO YEARS, AND HAS BEEN EMPLOYED, WITH NO 13 14 LAPSE IN SERVICE, AS A SCHOOL POLICE OFFICER IN THIS 15 COMMONWEALTH UNDER SECTION 1302-C OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOL 16 CODE OF 1949. 17 Section 3 4. Campus police, as defined in section 2001-A(20) <--18 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the 19 Public School Code of 1949, who have successfully completed the 20 basic training course from the commission and obtained a

21 psychological evaluation for employment as a law enforcement

22 officer before the effective date of this section shall be

23 automatically certified by the Municipal Police Officers'

24 Education and Training Commission.
