AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled, as reenacted, "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating 3 and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and 4 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 7 8 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 10 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 12 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 13 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 14 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 15 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," in 16 licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and 17 brewed beverages, providing for national event permit. 18 19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 20 hereby enacts as follows: 21 The act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known 22 as the Liquor Code, reenacted and amended June 29, 1987 (P.L.32, 23 No.14) is amended by adding a section to read: 24 Section 408.17. National Event Permit. -- (a) Upon 25 application of the chief executive of a national political party

conducting its national convention in this Commonwealth, or his

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- 1 or her designee, or the official host committee of the national
- 2 <u>convention</u>, the board may issue a national event permit or
- 3 permits for events directly connected to the convention.
- 4 (b) The application shall include an application fee of
- 5 <u>five-thousand dollars (\$5,000). No additional fee shall be</u>
- 6 required for any subsequent application.
- 7 (c) The board shall approve the application unless doing so
- 8 would clearly be against the public interest. If the board
- 9 approves the application, the board shall determine the
- 10 location, date and hours that the permit shall be in effect.
- 11 More than one location may be licensed at one time.
- 12 <u>(d) The permit shall have the same rights and restrictions</u>
- 13 <u>as a special occasion permit issued under section 408.4, except</u>
- 14 <u>as follows:</u>
- 15 (1) The permit shall not be subject to the hours restriction
- 16 <u>under section 408.4(k)</u>, the days restrictions under section
- 17 408(i) or the notice requirements under section 408.4(j).
- 18 (2) The permit may be issued to a location that is already
- 19 licensed by the board so long as the board clearly states which
- 20 permit or license is in effect.
- 21 (3) The permit holder may accept, import, possess or resell
- 22 <u>donated alcohol acquired from licensed and unlicensed entities</u>
- 23 so long as it receives board approval prior to doing so. The
- 24 <u>donated alcohol does not need to come to rest at a Pennsylvania</u>
- 25 Liquor Store prior to its use by the permit holder, unless the
- 26 board so directs.
- 27 (4) If the proposed location is subject to a conditional
- 28 <u>licensing agreement that imposes additional conditions on the</u>
- 29 sale and service of alcohol at that location, the board may in
- 30 its discretion waive some or all of those conditions while the

- 1 permit is in effect.
- 2 (5) No sales for off-premises consumption may occur unless
- 3 the premises is already licensed by the board. In those cases,
- 4 sales for off-premises consumption shall be subject to the same
- 5 rights and restrictions as are imposed on the underlying
- 6 <u>license.</u>
- 7 (e) A copy of each approved permit shall be made available
- 8 to the public on the board's publicly accessible Internet
- 9 <u>website.</u>
- 10 (f) This section shall expire on July 29, 2016, and no
- 11 permit shall remain in effect after that date.
- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
