## AN ACT

- Amending Title 58 (Oil and Gas) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in unconventional gas well fee, repealing 2 expiration; providing for imposition of tax, for registration, for meters, for assessments, for time for assessment, for extension of assessment period, for 3 5 reassessments, for interest, for penalties, for criminal 7 acts, for abatement of additions or penalties, for bulk and auction sales, for collection upon failure to request 8 reassessment, review or appeal, for tax liens, for tax suit 9 reciprocity, for service, for refunds, for refund petition, 10 for rules and regulations, for recordkeeping, for 11 examinations, for unauthorized disclosure, for cooperation 12 with other governments, for bonds and for deposit of 13 proceeds; and making an appropriation. 14 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 14 § 4301. Scope of chapter.
- This chapter relates to taxation of the severance of natural
- 16 gas.
- 17 § 4302. Definitions.
- 18 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 19 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 20 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 21 "Average price of natural gas." The arithmetic mean of the
- 22 market price for arm's-length transactions as reported to the
- 23 department for the previous reporting period. Within 20 days
- 24 after the end of each reporting period the department shall
- 25 calculate and publish the average price of natural gas from
- 26 returns received in the prior reporting period based on the
- 27 total units of gas severed and the total gross value of gas
- 28 reported by all producers for all arm's-length transactions on
- 29 returns filed with the department.
- 30 "Department." The Department of Revenue of the Commonwealth.

- 1 "Gross value." All of the following, calculated prior to the
- 2 payment of any royalties or other payments to a lessor and
- 3 without any other deduction or credit:
- 4 (1) The volume-weighted average market price for an
- 5 <u>arm's-length transaction that a producer receives at the</u>
- 6 point of sale for natural gas during a reporting period.
- 7 (2) The average price of natural gas if:
- 8 <u>(i) the natural gas is not sold in an arm's-length</u>
- 9 <u>transaction</u>, as reported by the producer or as determined
- by the department;
- 11 <u>(ii) if the natural gas is exchanged for something</u>
- 12 <u>other than cash; or</u>
- 13 <u>(iii) if there is no sale or exchange between the</u>
- 14 <u>time of severance and the end of the reporting period</u>
- during which the natural gas was severed.
- 16 "Natural gas." As defined in section 2301 (relating to
- 17 definitions).
- 18 "Person." Any natural person, a corporation, fiduciary,
- 19 association or other entity. The term includes the Commonwealth
- 20 and any political subdivision, instrumentality and authority of
- 21 the Commonwealth.
- 22 "Producer." As defined in section 2301 (relating to
- 23 definitions).
- "Reporting period." A calendar month in which natural gas is
- 25 severed.
- 26 "Sever." Extract or otherwise remove natural gas from the
- 27 <u>soil or water of this Commonwealth.</u>
- 28 <u>"Taxpayer." A person subject to the tax imposed by this</u>
- 29 chapter.
- 30 "Unconventional gas well." As defined in section 2301

- 1 (relating to definitions).
- 2 "Unit." A thousand cubic feet of natural gas measured at the
- 3 wellhead at a temperature of 60 degrees Fahrenheit and an
- 4 <u>absolute pressure of 14.73 pounds per square inch in accordance</u>
- 5 with American Gas Association Standards and according to Boyle's
- 6 Law for the measurement of gas under varying pressures with
- 7 deviations as follows:
- 8 (1) The average absolute atmospheric pressure shall be
- 9 <u>assumed to be 14.4 pounds to the square inch, regardless of</u>
- 10 <u>elevation or location of point of delivery above sea level or</u>
- 11 <u>variations in atmospheric pressure.</u>
- 12 (2) The temperature of the gas passing the meters shall
- be determined by the continuous use of a recording
- 14 <u>thermometer installed to properly record the temperature of</u>
- 15 gas flowing through the meters. The arithmetic average of the
- 16 <u>temperature recorded each 24-hour day shall be used in</u>
- 17 computing gas volumes. If a recording thermometer is not
- installed, or is installed and not operating properly, an
- 19 <u>average flowing temperature of 60 degrees Fahrenheit shall be</u>
- 20 <u>used in computing gas volume.</u>
- 21 (3) The specific gravity of the gas shall be determined
- 22 annually by tests made by the use of an Edwards or Acme
- 23 gravity balance, or at intervals as found necessary in
- 24 practice. Specific gravity determinations shall be used in
- 25 computing gas volumes.
- 26 (4) The deviation of the natural gas from Boyle's Law
- 27 <u>shall be determined by annual tests or at other shorter</u>
- intervals as found necessary in practice. The apparatus and
- 29 <u>method used in making the test shall be in accordance with</u>
- 30 recommendations of the National Bureau of Standards or Report

- No. 3 of the Gas Measurement Committee of the American Gas
- 2 Association. The results of the tests shall be used in
- 3 computing the volume of gas delivered under this chapter.
- 4 "Wellhead meter." A meter that measures the volume of
- 5 <u>natural gas severed from an unconventional gas well.</u>
- 6 § 4303. Imposition of tax.
- 7 (a) Establishment.--Beginning July 1, 2014, there shall be
- 8 <u>levied a natural gas severance tax payable on every</u>
- 9 <u>unconventional gas well that is required to pay the fee payable</u>
- 10 under Chapter 23 (relating to unconventional gas well fee).
- 11 (b) Rate. -- The tax imposed in subsection (a) shall be 2% of
- 12 the gross value of units severed at the wellhead during a
- 13 reporting period, plus 3¢ per unit severed.
- 14 (c) Return and payment. -- Every producer subject to the
- 15 provisions of this chapter shall file a return with the
- 16 <u>department</u>, on a form prescribed by the department, which shall
- 17 include the following:
- 18 <u>(1) The total number of natural gas units severed by the</u>
- 19 producer for the reporting period broken down into:
- (i) the number of such units sold by the producer
- 21 during the reporting period in arm's-length transactions;
- 22 (ii) the number of such units sold by the producer
- 23 <u>during the reporting period in nonarm's-length</u>
- transactions or exchanged for something other than cash;
- 25 and
- 26 (iii) the number of such units not yet sold or
- 27 exchanged as of the end of the reporting period.
- 28 (2) The gross value of the units identified in paragraph
- 29 (1).
- 30 (3) The amount of tax due under subsection (b).

- 1 (4) Other information reasonably required by the
- 2 <u>department</u>.
- 3 (d) Filing. -- The return required by subsection (c) shall be
- 4 <u>filed with the department within 15 days following the end of a</u>
- 5 reporting period. The tax is due on the day the return is
- 6 required to be filed under this subsection and shall become
- 7 <u>delinquent if not remitted to the department by the required</u>
- 8 <u>date. A producer shall commence filing the returns required</u>
- 9 <u>under subsection (c) within 75 days following the effective date</u>
- 10 of this section. The initial return shall include the
- 11 <u>information required by subsection (c) for the reporting periods</u>
- 12 that occurred between July 1, 2014, and the 75th day following
- 13 the effective date of this section. An initial return that
- 14 requires a calculation based upon the average price of natural
- 15 gas shall be due within 15 days following the first full
- 16 reporting period for which such data is available.
- 17 § 4304. Registration.
- 18 (a) Application. -- Before a producer severs natural gas or
- 19 continues to sever natural gas in this Commonwealth after the
- 20 date occurring 60 days following the effective date of this
- 21 section, the producer shall apply to the department for a
- 22 registration certificate. The department may charge an
- 23 application fee to cover the administrative costs associated
- 24 with the application and registration process.
- 25 (b) Issuance.--Except as provided in subsection (c), after
- 26 the receipt of an application and the required application fee,
- 27 the department shall issue a registration certificate to the
- 28 producer. The registration certificate is nonassignable. A
- 29 registrant is required to renew the registration certificate on
- 30 a staggered renewal system established by the department. After

- 1 the initial staggered renewal period, a registration certificate
- 2 <u>is valid for a period of five years.</u>
- 3 (c) Refusal, suspension or revocation.--
- 4 (1) The department may refuse to issue, suspend or
- 5 revoke a registration certificate if the applicant or
- 6 <u>registrant has not filed required State tax reports and paid</u>
- 7 <u>State taxes not subject to a timely perfected administrative</u>
- 8 <u>or judicial appeal or an authorized deferred payment plan.</u>
- 9 (2) The department shall notify the applicant or
- 10 registrant of a refusal, suspension or revocation. The notice
- shall contain a statement that the refusal, suspension or
- 12 <u>revocation may be made public. The notice shall be made by</u>
- first class mail.
- 14 (3) An applicant or registrant aggrieved by the
- determination of the department may file an appeal under the
- provisions for administrative appeals in the act of March 4,
- 17 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971. In
- 18 the case of a suspension or revocation which is appealed, the
- 19 registration certificate shall remain valid pending a final
- 20 outcome of the appeals process. Notwithstanding any other
- 21 provision of law, if no appeal is taken or if an appeal is
- taken and denied at the conclusion of the appeal process, the
- 23 department may disclose, by publication or otherwise, the
- identity of a producer and the fact that the producer's
- 25 registration certificate has been refused, suspended or
- 26 revoked under this subsection. Disclosure may include the
- 27 basis for refusal, suspension or revocation.
- 28 (d) Violation.--
- 29 <u>(1) A person that severs natural gas in this</u>
- 30 Commonwealth in violation of subsection (a) commits a summary

- offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a
- 2 fine not less than \$300 nor more than \$1,500 or, in default
- 3 <u>of the payment, to imprisonment for not less than five days</u>
- 4 <u>nor more than 30 days.</u>
- 5 (2) For purposes of this subsection, each day in which
- 6 <u>natural gas is severed shall constitute a separate violation.</u>
- 7 (3) The penalties imposed by this subsection shall be in
- 8 addition to any other penalties imposed by this chapter.
- 9 <u>(4) The Secretary of Revenue may designate employees of</u>
- the department to enforce the provisions of this subsection.
- 11 The employees shall exhibit proof of and be within the scope
- of the designation when instituting proceedings as provided
- by the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure.
- 14 (e) Failure to obtain registration certificate. -- Failure to
- 15 <u>obtain or hold a valid registration certificate does not relieve</u>
- 16 <u>a person from liability for the tax imposed by this chapter.</u>
- 17 § 4305. Meters.
- 18 A producer shall provide for and maintain a discrete wellhead
- 19 meter where natural gas is severed. A producer shall ensure that
- 20 the meters are maintained according to industry standards. Any
- 21 wellhead meter installed after the effective date of this
- 22 <u>section shall be a digital meter.</u>
- 23 § 4306. Assessments.
- 24 (a) Authorization and requirement. -- The department is
- 25 <u>authorized and shall make inquiries</u>, <u>determinations and</u>
- 26 assessments of the tax imposed under this chapter, including
- 27 <u>interest</u>, additions and penalties imposed under this chapter.
- 28 (b) Notice.--The notice of assessment and demand for payment
- 29 shall be mailed to the taxpayer. The notice shall set forth the
- 30 basis of the assessment. The department shall send the notice of

- 1 <u>assessment to the taxpayer at its registered address via</u>
- 2 <u>certified mail if the assessment increases the taxpayer's tax</u>
- 3 liability by \$300. Otherwise, the notice of assessment may be
- 4 <u>sent via regular mail.</u>
- 5 § 4307. Time for assessment.
- 6 (a) Requirement. -- An assessment as provided under section
- 7 4306 (relating to assessments) shall be made within three years
- 8 after the date when the return provided for by section 4303(c)
- 9 (relating to imposition of tax) is filed or the end of the year
- 10 in which the tax liability arises, whichever shall occur last.
- 11 For the purposes of this subsection and subsection (b), a return
- 12 <u>filed before the last day prescribed for the filing period shall</u>
- 13 <u>be considered as filed on the last day.</u>
- 14 (b) Exception. -- If the taxpayer underpays the correct amount
- 15 of the tax due by 25% or more, the tax may be assessed within
- 16 six years after the date the return was filed.
- 17 (c) Intent to evade. -- Where no return is filed or where the
- 18 taxpayer files a false or fraudulent return with intent to evade
- 19 the tax imposed by this chapter, the assessment may be made at
- 20 any time.
- 21 (d) Erroneous credit or refund. -- Within three years of the
- 22 granting of a refund or credit or within the period in which an
- 23 <u>assessment or reassessment may have been issued by the</u>
- 24 department for the taxable period for which the refund was
- 25 granted, whichever period shall occur last, the department may
- 26 issue an assessment to recover a refund or credit made or
- 27 <u>allowed erroneously.</u>
- 28 § 4308. Extension of assessment period.
- Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter, the
- 30 assessment period may be extended in the event a taxpayer has

- 1 provided written consent before the expiration of the period
- 2 provided in section 4307 (relating to time for assessment) for a
- 3 tax assessment. The amount of tax due may be assessed at any
- 4 <u>time within the extended period. The period may be extended</u>
- 5 <u>further by subsequent written consents made before the</u>
- 6 <u>expiration of the extended period.</u>
- 7 § 4309. Reassessments.
- 8 <u>A taxpayer against whom an assessment is made may petition</u>
- 9 the department for a reassessment under Article XXVII of the act
- 10 of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of
- 11 1971.
- 12 § 4310. Interest.
- 13 The department shall assess interest on any delinquent tax at
- 14 the rate prescribed under section 806 of the act of April 9,
- 15 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code.
- 16 § 4311. Penalties.
- 17 The department shall enforce the following penalties:
- 18 (1) A penalty against a producer without a registration
- 19 certificate required under section 4304 (relating to
- registration). The penalty shall be \$1 for every unit severed
- 21 without a valid registration certificate. The department may
- 22 assess this penalty separately from or in conjunction with
- 23 <u>any assessment of the natural gas severance tax.</u>
- 24 (2) A penalty against a producer for failure to timely
- file a return as required under section 4303(c) (relating to
- 26 imposition of tax). The penalty shall be 5% of the tax
- 27 <u>liability to be reported on the return for each day beyond</u>
- the due date that the return is not filed.
- 29 (3) In addition to the penalty under paragraph (2), a
- 30 penalty against the producer for a willful failure to timely

- file a return. The penalty shall be 200% of the tax liability
- 2 <u>required to be reported on the return.</u>
- 3 (4) A penalty against a producer for failure to timely
- 4 pay the tax as required by section 4303(d). The penalty shall
- 5 <u>be 5% of the amount of tax due for each day beyond the</u>
- 6 payment date that the tax is not paid.
- 7 § 4312. Criminal acts.
- 8 (a) Fraudulent return. -- Any person with intent to defraud
- 9 the Commonwealth, who willfully makes or causes to be made a
- 10 return required by this chapter which is false, is quilty of a
- 11 misdemeanor and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a
- 12 fine of not more than \$2,000 or to imprisonment for not more
- 13 than three years, or both.
- 14 (b) Other crimes.--
- 15 (1) Except as otherwise provided by subsection (a), a
- person is quilty of a misdemeanor and shall, upon conviction,
- 17 be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000 and costs
- of prosecution or to imprisonment for not more than one year,
- or both, for any of the following:
- 20 (i) Willfully failing to timely remit the tax to the
- department.
- 22 (ii) Willfully failing or neglecting to timely file
- 23 <u>a return or report required by this chapter.</u>
- 24 (iii) Refusing to timely pay a tax, penalty or
- 25 interest imposed or provided for by this chapter.
- 26 (iv) Willfully failing to preserve its books, papers
- and records as directed by the department.
- 28 (v) Refusing to permit the department or its
- 29 authorized agents to examine its books, records or
- 30 papers.

1	(vi) Knowingly making any incomplete, false or
2	fraudulent return or report.
3	(vii) Preventing or attempting to prevent the full
4	disclosure of the amount of natural gas severance tax
5	due.
6	(viii) Providing any person with a false statement
7	as to the payment of the tax imposed under this chapter
8	with respect to any pertinent facts.
9	(ix) Making, uttering or issuing a false or
10	<u>fraudulent statement.</u>
11	(2) The penalties imposed by this section shall be in
12	addition to other penalties imposed by this chapter.
13	§ 4313. Abatement of additions or penalties.
14	Upon the filing of a petition for reassessment or a petition
15	for refund by a taxpayer as provided under this chapter,
16	additions or penalties imposed upon the taxpayer by this chapter
17	may be waived or abated, in whole or in part, where the
18	petitioner establishes that he acted in good faith, without
19	negligence and with no intent to defraud.
20	§ 4314. Bulk and auction sales.
21	A person that sells or causes to be sold at auction, or that
22	sells or transfers in bulk, 51% or more of a stock of goods,
23	wares or merchandise of any kind, fixtures, machinery,
24	equipment, buildings or real estate involved in a business for
25	which the person holds a registration certificate or is required
26	to obtain a registration certificate under the provisions of
27	this chapter shall be subject to the provisions of section 1403
28	of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The
29	Fiscal Code.
30	§ 4315. Collection upon failure to request reassessment, review

- 1 <u>or appeal.</u>
- 2 (a) Power of department. -- The department may collect the tax
- 3 imposed under this chapter:
- 4 (1) If an assessment of the tax is not paid within 30
- 5 <u>days after notice to the taxpayer when no petition for</u>
- 6 reassessment has been filed.
- 7 (2) Within 60 days of the reassessment, if no petition
- 8 for review has been filed.
- 9 (3) If no appeal has been made, within 30 days of:
- 10 <u>(i) the Board of Finance and Revenue's decision of a</u>
- 11 <u>petition for review; or</u>
- 12 <u>(ii) the expiration of the board's time for acting</u>
- 13 <u>upon the petition.</u>
- 14 <u>(4) In all cases of judicial sales, receiverships,</u>
- 15 <u>assignments or bankruptcies.</u>
- 16 (b) Prohibition.--In a case for the collection of taxes
- 17 under subsection (a), the taxpayer against whom they were
- 18 assessed shall not be permitted to set up a ground of defense
- 19 that might have been determined by the department, the Board of
- 20 Finance and Revenue or the courts, provided that the defense of
- 21 failure of the department to mail notice of assessment or
- 22 reassessment to the taxpayer and the defense of payment of
- 23 assessment or reassessment may be raised in proceedings for
- 24 collection by a motion to stay the proceedings.
- 25 § 4316. Tax liens.
- 26 (a) Lien imposed.--If any taxpayer neglects or refuses to
- 27 pay the tax imposed under this chapter for which the taxpayer is
- 28 liable under this chapter after demand, the amount, including
- 29 <u>interest</u>, <u>addition</u> or <u>penalty</u>, <u>together</u> <u>with additional costs</u>
- 30 that may accrue, shall be a lien in favor of the Commonwealth

- 1 upon the real and personal property of the taxpayer, but only
- 2 <u>after the same has been entered and docketed of record by the</u>
- 3 prothonotary of the county where the property is situated. The
- 4 <u>department may, at any time, transmit to the prothonotaries of</u>
- 5 the respective counties certified copies of all liens imposed by
- 6 this section. It shall be the duty of the prothonotary receiving
- 7 the lien to enter and docket the same of record to the office of
- 8 the prothonotary. The lien shall be indexed as judgments are now
- 9 indexed. No prothonotary shall require as a condition precedent
- 10 to the entry of the lien the payment of costs incidental to its
- 11 <u>entry</u>.
- 12 (b) Priority of lien and effect on judicial sale. -- Except
- 13 for the costs of the sale and the writ upon which the sale was
- 14 made and real estate taxes and municipal claims against the
- 15 property, a lien imposed under this section shall have priority
- 16 from the date of its recording and shall be fully paid and
- 17 satisfied out of the proceeds of any judicial sale of property
- 18 subject to the lien, before any other obligation, judgment,
- 19 claim, lien or estate to which the property may subsequently
- 20 become subject, but shall be subordinate to mortgages and other
- 21 liens existing and duly recorded or entered of record prior to
- 22 the recording of the lien.
- 23 (c) No discharge by sale on junior lien. -- In the case of a
- 24 judicial sale of property subject to a lien imposed under this
- 25 section, upon a lien or claim over which the lien imposed under
- 26 this section has priority, the sale shall discharge the lien
- 27 <u>imposed under this section to the extent only that the proceeds</u>
- 28 are applied to its payment, and the lien shall continue in full
- 29 force and effect as to the balance remaining unpaid. There shall
- 30 be no inquisition or condemnation upon any judicial sale of real

- 1 <u>estate made by the Commonwealth under the provisions of this</u>
- 2 chapter. The lien shall continue as provided in the act of April
- 3 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, and a writ
- 4 of execution may directly issue upon the lien without the
- 5 <u>issuance and prosecution to judgment of a writ of scire facias</u>,
- 6 provided that not less than ten days before issuance of any
- 7 <u>execution on the lien, notice of the filing and the effect of</u>
- 8 the lien shall be sent by registered mail to the taxpayer at its
- 9 <u>last known post office address, provided further that the lien</u>
- 10 shall have no effect upon any stock of goods, wares or
- 11 merchandise regularly sold or leased in the ordinary course of
- 12 <u>business</u> by the taxpayer against whom the lien has been entered,
- 13 <u>unless and until a writ of execution has been issued and a levy</u>
- 14 made upon the stock of goods, wares and merchandise.
- 15 (d) Penalty. -- A prothonotary who intentionally violates this
- 16 <u>section commits a misdemeanor of the third degree and shall,</u>
- 17 upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than
- 18 \$1,000 and costs of prosecution or to imprisonment for not more
- 19 than one year, or both.
- 20 (e) Priority. -- Except as provided in this chapter, the
- 21 distribution, voluntary or compulsory, in receivership,
- 22 bankruptcy or otherwise of the property or estate of any person,
- 23 <u>all taxes imposed by this chapter which are due and unpaid and</u>
- 24 are not collectible under the provisions of section 225 of the
- 25 act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code
- 26 of 1971, shall be paid from the first money available for
- 27 <u>distribution in priority to all other claims and liens, except</u>
- 28 as the laws of the United States may give priority to a claim to
- 29 the Federal Government. A person charged with the administration
- 30 or distribution of the property or estate who violates the

- 1 provisions of this section shall be personally liable for the
- 2 taxes imposed by this chapter which are accrued and unpaid and
- 3 chargeable against the person whose property or estate is being
- 4 <u>administered or distributed.</u>
- 5 (f) Other remedies. -- Subject to the limitations contained in
- 6 this chapter as to the assessment of taxes, nothing contained in
- 7 this section shall be construed to restrict, prohibit or limit
- 8 the use by the department in collecting taxes due and payable of
- 9 another remedy or procedure available at law or equity for the
- 10 collection of debts.
- 11 § 4317. Tax suit reciprocity.
- 12 The courts of the Commonwealth shall recognize and enforce
- 13 <u>liabilities for natural gas severance or extraction taxes</u>
- 14 <u>lawfully imposed by any other state, provided that the other</u>
- 15 state recognizes and enforces the tax imposed under this
- 16 <u>chapter.</u>
- 17 § 4318. Service.
- 18 A producer is deemed to have appointed the Secretary of the
- 19 Commonwealth its agent for the acceptance of service of process
- 20 or notice in a proceeding for the enforcement of the civil
- 21 provisions of this chapter, and service made upon the Secretary
- 22 of the Commonwealth as agent shall be of the same legal force
- 23 and validity as if the service had been personally made upon the
- 24 producer. Where service cannot be made upon the producer in the
- 25 manner provided by other laws of this Commonwealth relating to
- 26 service of process, service may be made upon the Secretary of
- 27 the Commonwealth. In that case, a copy of the process or notice
- 28 shall be personally served upon any agent or representative of
- 29 the producer who may be found within this Commonwealth or, where
- 30 no agent or representative may be found, a copy of the process

- 1 or notice shall be sent via registered mail to the producer at
- 2 the last known address of its principal place of business, home
- 3 office or residence.
- 4 § 4319. Refunds.
- 5 Under Article XXVII of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6,
- 6 No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, the department
- 7 shall refund all taxes, interest and penalties paid to the
- 8 Commonwealth under the provisions of this chapter to which the
- 9 <u>Commonwealth is not rightfully entitled. The refunds shall be</u>
- 10 made to the person or the person's heirs, successors, assigns or
- 11 other personal representatives who paid the tax, provided that
- 12 <u>no refund shall be made under this section regarding a payment</u>
- 13 <u>made by reason of an assessment where a taxpayer has filed a</u>
- 14 petition for reassessment under section 2702 of the Tax Reform
- 15 Code of 1971 to the extent the petition is adverse to the
- 16 taxpayer by a decision which is no longer subject to further
- 17 review or appeal. Nothing in this chapter shall prohibit a
- 18 taxpayer who has filed a timely petition for reassessment from
- 19 amending it to a petition for refund where the petitioner paid
- 20 the tax assessed.
- 21 § 4320. Refund petition.
- 22 (a) General rule. -- Except as provided for in subsection (b),
- 23 the refund or credit of tax, interest or penalty provided for by
- 24 <u>section 4319 (relating to refunds) shall be made only where the</u>
- 25 person who has paid the tax files a petition for refund with the
- 26 department under Article XXVII of the act of March 4, 1971
- 27 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, within the
- 28 time limits of section 3003.1 of the Tax Reform Code of 1971.
- 29 (b) Natural gas severance tax. -- A refund or credit of tax,
- 30 interest or penalty paid as a result of an assessment made by

- 1 the department under section 4306 (relating to assessment) shall
- 2 be made only where the person who has paid the tax files with
- 3 the department a petition for a refund with the department under
- 4 Article XXVII of the Tax Reform Code of 1971 within the time
- 5 <u>limits of section 3003.1 of the Tax Reform Code of 1971. The</u>
- 6 <u>filing of a petition for refund under the provisions of this</u>
- 7 <u>subsection shall not affect the abatement of interest, additions</u>
- 8 or penalties to which the person may be entitled by reason of
- 9 <u>his payment of the assessment.</u>
- 10 § 4321. Rules and regulations.
- 11 The department is charged with the enforcement of the
- 12 provisions of this chapter and is authorized and empowered to
- 13 prescribe, adopt, promulgate and enforce rules and regulations
- 14 not inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter relating to
- 15 any matter or thing pertaining to the administration and
- 16 <u>enforcement of the provisions of this chapter and the collection</u>
- 17 of taxes, penalties and interest imposed by this chapter. The
- 18 department may prescribe the extent, if any, to which any of the
- 19 rules and regulations shall be applied without retroactive
- 20 effect.
- 21 § 4322. Recordkeeping.
- 22 (a) General rule. -- Every person liable for any tax imposed
- 23 by this chapter, or for the collection of the tax, shall keep
- 24 records, including those enumerated in subsection (b), render
- 25 statements, make returns and comply with the rules and
- 26 regulations as the department may prescribe regarding matters
- 27 pertinent to the person's business. Whenever it is necessary,
- 28 the department may require a person, by notice served upon the
- 29 person or by regulations, to make returns, render statements or
- 30 keep records as the department deems sufficient to show whether

- 1 or not a person is liable to pay tax under this chapter.
- 2 (a.1) Records. -- Records to be maintained are:
- 3 (1) Wellhead meter charts for each reporting period and
- 4 <u>the meter calibration and maintenance records. If turbine</u>
- 5 <u>meters are in use, the maintenance records will be made</u>
- 6 <u>available to the department upon request.</u>
- 7 (2) Records, statements and other instruments furnished
- 8 <u>to a producer by a person to whom the producer delivers for</u>
- 9 sale, transport or delivery of natural gas.
- 10 (3) Records, statements and other instruments as the
- 11 <u>department may prescribe by regulation.</u>
- 12 (b) Records of nonresidents. -- A nonresident who does
- 13 <u>business in this Commonwealth as a producer shall keep adequate</u>
- 14 records of the business and of the tax due as a result. The
- 15 records shall be retained within this Commonwealth unless
- 16 retention outside this Commonwealth is authorized by the
- 17 department. The department may require a taxpayer who desires to
- 18 retain records outside this Commonwealth to assume reasonable
- 19 out-of-State audit expenses.
- 20 (c) Keeping of separate records. -- A producer who is engaged
- 21 in another business or businesses which do not involve the
- 22 severing of natural gas taxable under this chapter shall keep
- 23 separate books and records of the businesses so as to show the
- 24 taxable severing of natural gas under this chapter separately
- 25 from other business activities not taxable hereunder. If any
- 26 person fails to keep separate books and records, the person
- 27 shall be liable for a penalty equaling 100% of tax due under
- 28 this chapter for the period where separate records were not
- 29 maintained.
- 30 § 4323. Examinations.

- 1 The department or any of its authorized agents are authorized
- 2 to examine the books, papers and records of any taxpayer in
- 3 order to verify the accuracy and completeness of any return made
- 4 or, if no return was made, to ascertain and assess the tax
- 5 imposed by this chapter. The department may require the
- 6 preservation of all books, papers and records for any period
- 7 <u>deemed proper by it but not to exceed three years from the end</u>
- 8 of the calendar year to which the records relate. Every taxpayer
- 9 <u>is required to give to the department or its agent the means,</u>
- 10 facilities and opportunity for examinations and investigations
- 11 under this section. The department is further authorized to
- 12 <u>examine any person, under oath, concerning the taxable severing</u>
- 13 of natural gas by any taxpayer or concerning any other matter
- 14 relating to the enforcement or administration of this chapter,
- 15 and to this end may compel the production of books, papers and
- 16 records and the attendance of all persons whether as parties or
- 17 witnesses whom it believes to have knowledge of relevant
- 18 matters. The procedure for the hearings or examinations shall be
- 19 the same as that provided by the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343,
- 20 No.176), known as The Fiscal Code.
- 21 § 4324. Unauthorized disclosure.
- 22 Any information gained by the department as a result of any
- 23 return, examination, investigation, hearing or verification
- 24 required or authorized by this chapter shall be confidential
- 25 except for official purposes and except in accordance with
- 26 proper judicial order or as otherwise provided by law, and any
- 27 person unlawfully divulging the information shall be guilty of a
- 28 misdemeanor and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a
- 29 fine of not more than \$1,000 and costs of prosecution or to
- 30 imprisonment for not more than one year, or both.

- 1 § 4325. Cooperation with other governments.
- 2 Notwithstanding the provisions of section 4317 (relating to
- 3 tax suit reciprocity), the department may permit the
- 4 <u>Commissioner of the Internal Revenue Service of the United</u>
- 5 States, the proper officer of any state or the authorized
- 6 representative of either of them to inspect the tax returns of
- 7 any taxpayer, or may furnish to the commissioner or officer or
- 8 to either of their authorized representative an abstract of the
- 9 return of any taxpayer, or supply him with information
- 10 concerning any item contained in any return or disclosed by the
- 11 report of any examination or investigation of the return of any
- 12 taxpayer. This permission shall be granted only if the laws of
- 13 the United States or another state grant substantially similar
- 14 privileges to the proper officer of the Commonwealth charged
- 15 with the administration of this chapter.
- 16 § 4326. Bonds.
- 17 <u>(a) Taxpayer to file bond.--The department may require a</u>
- 18 nonresident natural person or any foreign corporation,
- 19 association, fiduciary or other entity, not authorized to do
- 20 <u>business within this Commonwealth or not having an established</u>
- 21 place of business in this Commonwealth and subject to the tax
- 22 imposed by section 4303 (relating to imposition of tax), to file
- 23 a bond issued by a surety company authorized to do business in
- 24 this Commonwealth and approved by the Insurance Commissioner as
- 25 to solvency and responsibility, in amounts as it may fix, to
- 26 secure the payment of any tax or penalties due or which may
- 27 <u>become due from a nonresident natural person, corporation,</u>
- 28 association, fiduciary or other entity whenever it deems it
- 29 <u>necessary to protect the revenues obtained under this chapter.</u>
- 30 The department may also require a bond of a person petitioning

- 1 the department for reassessment in the case of any assessment
- 2 over \$500 or where, in its opinion, the ultimate collection is
- 3 in jeopardy. For a period of three years, the department may
- 4 require a bond of any person who has, on three or more occasions
- 5 within a 12-month period, either filed a return or made payment
- 6 to the department more than 30 days late. In the event the
- 7 <u>department determines a taxpayer is required to file a bond, it</u>
- 8 shall give notice to the taxpayer specifying the amount of the
- 9 bond required. The taxpayer shall file the bond within five days
- 10 after notice is given by the department unless, within five
- 11 days, the taxpayer shall request in writing a hearing before the
- 12 <u>Secretary of Revenue or his representative. At the hearing, the</u>
- 13 necessity, propriety and amount of the bond shall be determined
- 14 by the Secretary of Revenue or his representative. The
- 15 <u>determination shall be final and the taxpayer shall comply with</u>
- 16 <u>it within 15 days after notice is mailed to the taxpayer.</u>
- 17 (b) Securities in lieu of bond.--In lieu of the bond
- 18 required by this section securities approved by the department
- 19 or cash in a prescribed amount may be deposited. The securities
- 20 or cash shall be kept in the custody of the department. The
- 21 department may apply the securities or cash to the tax imposed
- 22 by this chapter and interest or penalties due without notice to
- 23 the depositor. The securities may be sold by the department to
- 24 pay the tax and/or interest or penalties due at public or
- 25 private sale upon five days' written notice to the depositor.
- 26 (c) Failure to file bond. -- The department may file a lien
- 27 under section 4316 (relating to tax liens) against any taxpayer
- 28 who fails to file a bond when required to do so under this
- 29 section. All funds received upon execution of the judgment on
- 30 the lien shall be refunded to the taxpayer with 3% interest,

- 1 should a final determination be made that it does not owe any
- 2 payment to the department.
- 3 § 4327. Appropriation.
- 4 The amount of the proceeds from the tax imposed by this
- 5 chapter as shall be necessary for the payment of refunds,
- 6 <u>enforcement or administration under this chapter is hereby</u>
- 7 appropriated to the department for those purposes.
- 8 <u>§ 4328. Deposit of proceeds.</u>
- 9 The proceeds of the tax imposed under section 4303 (relating
- 10 to imposition of tax) and penalties and interest imposed under
- 11 this chapter, less the amounts appropriated under section 4327
- 12 (relating to appropriation) shall be deposited into the General
- 13 <u>Fund.</u>
- 14 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
