AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto," in pupils and attendance, further 5 providing for definitions and for exceptions to compulsory 6 attendance. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 1326 of the act of March 10, 1949 11 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is 12 amended to read: 1.3 Section 1326. Definitions. -- The term "Commonwealth secondary 14 school diploma," as used in this article, shall mean a secondary 15 school diploma issued by the Department of Education to an applicant who is a resident of this Commonwealth, does not 16 17 possess a secondary school diploma and satisfies one of the 18 following: (1) Presents evidence of full matriculation and the 19

satisfactory completion of a minimum of one (1) full year or

thirty (30) semester hours of study at an accredited institution

- 1 <u>of postsecondary education.</u>
- 2 (2) Earns a passing score as determined by the Department of
- 3 Education on the high school level tests of general educational
- 4 <u>development while not enrolled in a public, licensed private,</u>
- 5 registered accredited or licensed nonpublic secondary school. A
- 6 person eighteen (18) years of age or older may qualify for
- 7 <u>general educational development testing upon request. A person</u>
- 8 between sixteen (16) and eighteen (18) years of age may qualify
- 9 for general educational development testing upon the issuance of
- 10 a court order or at the written request of one of the following:
- 11 (i) An employer who requires a high school equivalency
- 12 <u>credential for job opportunities.</u>
- 13 (ii) An official of an accredited institution of
- 14 postsecondary education which accepts applicants on the basis of
- 15 general educational development test scores.
- 16 (iii) A recruiting officer of a branch of the armed forces
- 17 that requires a high school equivalency credential for entry of
- 18 new recruits.
- 19 (iv) The director of a State institution on behalf of
- 20 residents, patients or inmates.
- 21 The term "compulsory school age," as hereinafter used, shall
- 22 mean the period of a child's life from the time the child's
- 23 parents elect to have the child enter school, which shall be not
- 24 later than at the age of eight (8) years, until the age of
- 25 [seventeen (17)] eighteen (18) years. The term shall not include
- 26 any child who holds a certificate of graduation from a regularly
- 27 accredited senior high school.
- 28 The term "migratory child," wherever used in this subdivision
- 29 of this article, shall include any child domiciled temporarily
- 30 in any school district for the purpose of seasonal employment,

- 1 but not acquiring residence therein, and any child accompanying
- 2 his parent or guardian who is so domiciled.
- 3 Section 2. Section 1330(1) of the act is amended to read:
- 4 Section 1330. Exceptions to Compulsory Attendance. -- The
- 5 provisions of this act requiring regular attendance shall not
- 6 apply to any child who--
- 7 (1) Has attained the age of sixteen (16) years, and who is
- 8 regularly engaged in any useful and lawful employment or service
- 9 during the time the public schools are in session, and who holds
- 10 an employment certificate issued according to law, and, in the
- 11 case of a child who withdraws from school, who is actively
- 12 pursuing a Commonwealth secondary school diploma in accordance
- 13 with regulations which shall be promulgated by the State Board
- 14 of Education;

- 16 Section 3. The regulations required by section 1330(1) of
- 17 the act shall be promulgated within 18 months of the effective
- 18 date of this section.
- 19 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
