AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Older Adult Mentor Volunteer Program; and
- 2 providing for duties of the Department of Education, the
- 3 State Board of Education, intermediate units and public
- 4 school entities.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Older Adult
- 9 Mentor Volunteer Program (MVP) Act.
- 10 Section 2. Legislative intent.
- 11 The intent of this act is to facilitate the exchange of
- 12 knowledge between generations, using the experience and wisdom
- 13 of retired older adults to enrich the lives and futures of this
- 14 Commonwealth's young people.
- 15 Section 3. Definitions.
- 16 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 17 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

- 1 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 2 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 3 Commonwealth.
- 4 "Intermediate unit." An intermediate unit established under
- 5 Article IX-A of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 6 as the Public School Code of 1949.
- 7 "Older adult." An individual who is 60 years of age or
- 8 older.
- 9 "Program." The Older Adult Mentor Volunteer Program (MVP)
- 10 established in section 4.
- "School entity." A public school district, INTERMEDIATE <--
- 12 UNIT, charter school, REGIONAL CHARTER SCHOOL or area <--
- 13 vocational-technical school.
- 14 "State board." The State Board of Education.
- 15 Section 4. Establishment. OLDER ADULT MENTOR VOLUNTEER PROGRAM. <--
- 16 (A) ESTABLISHMENT. -- The Older Adult Mentor Volunteer Program
- 17 (MVP) is established in furtherance of expanding opportunities
- 18 for qualified older adult volunteers to work directly with
- 19 students before, during or after school hours, in school
- 20 buildings and facilities and on school grounds. The purpose of
- 21 the program is to:
- 22 (1) Enable older adults to impart the wisdom that they
- have accrued to the next generation and to share their unique
- 24 professions, skills and experiences with students.
- 25 (2) Provide opportunities for students to explore areas
- of interest and develop skills, knowledge and experience in a
- variety of subjects, trades and hobbies.
- 28 (B) PARTICIPATION.--
- 29 (1) NO SCHOOL ENTITY SHALL BE REQUIRED TO UTILIZE THE
- 30 SERVICES OF QUALIFIED MVP VOLUNTEERS OR TO PARTICIPATE IN THE

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- 1 PROGRAM BEYOND THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 7(B).
- 2 (2) THE PROGRAM SHALL NOT SUPERSEDE OR RESTRICT ANY
- 3 SCHOOL DISTRICT VOLUNTEER PROGRAMS OPERATING OUTSIDE OF THE
- 4 PROGRAM.
- 5 Section 5. Guidelines.
- 6 The department, in consultation with the State board, shall
- 7 develop guidelines for the program. The guidelines shall ensure
- 8 the development of a program which will use the wisdom and
- 9 talents of older adults to enhance the personal, educational and
- 10 professional experiences of students. The guidelines shall
- 11 include the following:
- 12 (1) The respective roles of school entities and
- intermediate units in program implementation and evaluation.
- 14 (2) Policies and procedures for operation of the program
- by school entities in coordination with intermediate units.
- 16 (3) Identification of methods for use in fostering
- 17 participation in the program.
- 18 (4) Development and dissemination of application forms.
- 19 Section 6. Registry.
- The department shall develop and maintain, in coordination
- 21 with intermediate units, a central registry of older adult
- 22 volunteers to facilitate matching older adult volunteers with
- 23 students. The department shall provide electronic access to the
- 24 registry to intermediate units and school entities.
- 25 Section 7. Application procedures.
- 26 (a) General rule. -- An interested older adult may apply for
- 27 participation in the program by submitting an application to an
- 28 intermediate unit. The applicant shall indicate the school
- 29 entity or school entities for which the applicant proposes to
- 30 volunteer.

- 1 (b) Duties of intermediate units, school entities and State
- 2 and local agencies. -- Intermediate units, school entities and
- 3 area agencies on aging shall furnish program applications to
- 4 older adults upon request. Applications may also be submitted
- 5 electronically through the publicly accessible Internet websites
- 6 of the department and the Department of Aging. A school entity
- 7 or a State or local agency, other than an intermediate unit,
- 8 that receives an application shall forward the application to
- 9 the appropriate intermediate unit for review and processing.
- 10 (c) Review.--Upon receipt of an application, an intermediate
- 11 unit shall review the application and, subject to 23 Pa.C.S. §
- 12 6344.2 (relating to volunteers having contact with children),
- 13 shall approve the application and add the applicant to the
- 14 registry.
- 15 (d) Compliance with policies. -- An older adult volunteer must
- 16 comply with the applicable policies of the school entity for
- 17 which the volunteer has applied to serve.
- 18 Section 8. Orientation and training.
- 19 A school entity that uses the services of older adult
- 20 volunteers shall link older adults with students according to
- 21 academic interests, professional pursuits, hobbies, skills or an
- 22 identified need for an enriching exchange with an older adult
- 23 volunteer.
- 24 Section 9. Public awareness program.
- 25 The department shall undertake efforts to make older adults,
- 26 students and school entities aware of the existence and purpose
- 27 of the program. The department and school entities shall also
- 28 undertake efforts aimed at recruiting older adult volunteers.
- 29 School entities shall identify students that may benefit from
- 30 the program.

- 1 Section 10. Effective date.
- 2 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
