## AN ACT

Amending the act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699), 1 entitled "An act relating to the regulation of the practice 2 of pharmacy, including the sales, use and distribution of 3 drugs and devices at retail; and amending, revising, consolidating and repealing certain laws relating thereto," further providing for definitions; and providing for 6 collection and disposal of drugs by retail community pharmacies. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: 11 Section 1. Section 2 of the act of September 27, 1961 12 (P.L.1700, No.699), known as the Pharmacy Act, is amended by 13 adding a definition to read: 14 Section 2. Definitions. -- As used in this act: \* \* \* 15 16 (20) "Retail community pharmacy" means an independent 17 pharmacy, chain pharmacy, supermarket pharmacy or mass 18 merchandiser pharmacy that is licensed as a pharmacy in this 19 Commonwealth and dispenses medications to the general public at retail prices. The term does not include a pharmacy that

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- 1 <u>dispenses prescription medications to patients primarily through</u>
- 2 the mail, nursing home pharmacies, long-term care facility
- 3 pharmacies, hospital pharmacies, nonresident pharmacies,
- 4 <u>clinics</u>, <u>charitable</u> or <u>not-for-profit pharmacies</u>, <u>government</u>
- 5 pharmacies or pharmacy benefit managers.
- 6 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 7 Section 4.2. Collection and Disposal of Drugs by Retail
- 8 Community Pharmacies. -- (a) A retail community pharmacy shall
- 9 <u>install and maintain a drug collection receptacle onsite where</u>
- 10 <u>unused or expired drugs may be anonymously deposited by members</u>
- 11 of the public. The drug collection receptacle shall be made
- 12 <u>accessible to the public during the pharmacy's ordinary business</u>
- 13 hours. The retail community pharmacy shall pay all costs related
- 14 to the installation and maintenance of a drug collection
- 15 <u>receptacle.</u>
- (b) A retail community pharmacy shall accept controlled
- 17 <u>substances listed under schedules II, III, IV and V of the act</u>
- 18 of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as "The Controlled
- 19 <u>Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act," noncontrolled</u>
- 20 substances and over-the-counter medicines in a drug collection
- 21 <u>receptacle</u>.
- 22 (c) Within one year after the effective date of this
- 23 section, a retail community pharmacy located in this
- 24 <u>Commonwealth shall have installed a drug collection receptacle</u>
- 25 and shall be in compliance with all Federal laws applicable to
- 26 <u>this section</u>.
- 27 (d) Drugs deposited in a collection receptacle shall be
- 28 <u>destroyed or otherwise disposed of as provided in Federal law.</u>
- 29 Disposal may include on-site destruction or transport or
- 30 <u>transfer to a person or entity authorized to accept controlled</u>

- 1 <u>substances for the purpose of destroying the controlled</u>
- 2 <u>substance</u>.
- 3 (e) The board shall promulgate rules and regulations to
- 4 <u>implement the provisions of this section.</u>
- 5 (f) A retail community pharmacy found to be in violation of
- 6 this section shall be subject to a civil penalty of two hundred
- 7 <u>fifty dollars (\$250) for each violation.</u>
- 8 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
