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1 Section 2201. Effective date. 2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 3 hereby enacts as follows: 4 PART I 5 GENERAL PROVISIONS 6 Section 101. Short title. 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General Appropriation Act of 2018. 8 Section 102. Definitions. 9 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 12 13 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant 14 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, 15 16 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, 17 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians, marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and 18 other assistants in any department, board or commission. 19 20 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, 21 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and 22 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and 23 24 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel, 25 26 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation, 27 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and 28 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on 29 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of 30 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment

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insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on 1 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee 2 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth 3 4 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or 5 6 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of 7 8 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned 9 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred 10 11 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall 12 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside 13 hospital, provided, that in no case shall the State institution 14 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State 15 medical assistance program. 16

(a) General Fund.--The following sums set forth in this act, 5 6 or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter 7 named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial 8 Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, 9 10 wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly 11 elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, 12 for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public 13 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and 14 15 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by 16 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 17 18 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 19 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 20 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

21 (b) State Lottery Fund. -- The following sums set forth in 22 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 23 specifically appropriated from the State Lottery Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department 24 25 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 26 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 27 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 28 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as 29 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 30

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of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

Tobacco Settlement Fund.--The following sums set forth 5 (C) 6 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Tobacco Settlement Fund to 7 the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of 8 the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 9 10 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 11 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 12 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as 13 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 14 15 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 16 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 17 18 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

4 (e) Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund.--The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may 5 6 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund to the several 7 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 8 9 Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services 10 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and 11 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by 12 this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set 13 forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and for the 14 15 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. 16

17 The State Stores Fund.--The following sums set forth in (f) 18 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 19 specifically appropriated from The State Stores Fund to the 20 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 21 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 22 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 23 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of 24 25 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 26 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 27 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 28 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 29 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. 30

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the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 1 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 2 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 3 4 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 5 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 6 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 7 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 8 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 9 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. 10 11 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.

12 The following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 13 14 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to 15 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses 16 of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for 17 18 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and for the payment of 19 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal 20 year ending June 30, 2018. Unless otherwise stated, the 21 appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal 22 year.

23 Section 106. Block grants.

(a) Appropriation.--The following sums set forth in this
act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
specifically appropriated from the block grant (BG) funds to the
several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department
of the Commonwealth for the purposes and under the restrictions
for which the funds are provided for the fiscal year beginning
July 1, 2018.

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1 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small 2 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small 3 cities and communities that have a high concentration of 4 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their 5 low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet 6 community development needs.

(c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services 7 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and 8 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on 9 10 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the 11 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In 12 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements 13 14 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to 15 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

(d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The
Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is
for the provision of preventive health and other health services
related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,
comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health
education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic
violence services.

Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The 23 (e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to 24 25 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in 26 planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for 27 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with special health care needs and in providing health services for 28 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health 29 30 care.

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1 (f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant. -- The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help 2 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income 3 4 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds 5 6 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds received pursuant to a Presidential release of contingency funds 7 shall be exempt from the 15% requirement. 8

9 (g) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block 10 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible 11 persons.

12 (h) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health 13 Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of 14 services to adults with serious mental illness or children with 15 serious emotional disturbance.

(i) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block
Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs
to combat alcohol and drug abuse.

(j) Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant.--The Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant (CCDFBG) is for the provision of direct child care or to increase the quality and availability of child care for low-income families.

(k) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant.-The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant (TANFBG)
provides funds for the provision of cash grants, child care,
training and support services, child welfare and administration
for eligible families and individuals.

28 Section 107. Appropriations to Pennsylvania Higher Education29 Assistance Agency.
