Section 7122 (relating to altered, forged or 9 10 counterfeit documents and plates). * * * 11 12 (b) Suspension. --13 (1)The department shall suspend the operating privilege 14 of any driver for six months upon receiving a certified record of the driver's conviction of or an adjudication of 15 16 delinquency based on any offense under the following provisions: 17 18 Section 3367 (relating to racing on highways). 19 Section 3714(b) [(relating to careless driving)] or 20 (c.1). Section 3734 (relating to driving without lights to 21 22 avoid identification or arrest). 23 Section 3736 (relating to reckless driving). 24 Section 3743 (relating to accidents involving damage 25 to attended vehicle or property). * * * 26 § 3303. Overtaking vehicle on the left. 27 28 (a) General rule. -- The following rules shall govern the overtaking and passing of vehicles proceeding in the same 29 direction, subject to the limitations, exceptions and special 30

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rules stated in this chapter:

* * * 2 The driver of a motor vehicle overtaking a 3 (3) [pedalcycle] vulnerable highway user, other than a 4 5 pedestrian, proceeding in the same direction shall pass to the left of the [pedalcycle] vulnerable highway user within 6 7 not less than four feet at a careful and prudent reduced 8 speed. * * * 9 Section 3. Title 75 is amended by adding a section to read: 10 11 § 3303.1. Vehicles passing pedestrians on a highway. (a) General rule.--The following rules shall govern the 12 13 passing of pedestrians on a highway when vehicles are proceeding 14 in the same or opposite direction: 15 (1) If a pedestrian is walking on a highway or on a shoulder adjacent to a highway, the driver of a motor vehicle 16 17 shall safely pass a pedestrian on the pedestrian's left side within not less than four feet, but the driver is not 18 19 required to exit the laned roadway or yield to the pedestrian 20 to achieve the four-foot requirement. 21 (2) If a pedestrian is walking on a highway or on a 22 shoulder adjacent to a highway and the only option for the 23 driver of a motor vehicle to safely pass a pedestrian is on the right side of the pedestrian, the driver of a motor 24 25 vehicle shall safely pass on the pedestrian's right side within not less than four feet, but the driver is not 26 27 required to exit the laned roadway or yield to the pedestrian to achieve the four-foot requirement. 28 29 (b) Construction. -- Nothing within this section shall be construed to relieve a pedestrian of the requirements of section 30

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3542 (relating to right-of-way of pedestrians in crosswalks), 1 2 3543 (relating to pedestrians crossing at other than crosswalks) 3 or 3544 (relating to pedestrians walking along or on highway). Penalty for violation of subchapter. 6 7 Any person violating any provision of this subchapter is guilty of a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be 8 sentenced to pay a fine of [\$10] \$25. 9 10 § 3714. Careless driving. 11 (a) General rule. -- Any person who drives a vehicle in 12 careless disregard for the safety of persons or property is 13 quilty of careless driving, a summary offense. 14 Unintentional death. -- [If] Except as provided in (b) subsection (b.1), if the person who violates this section 15 16 unintentionally causes the death of another person as a result of the violation, the person shall, upon conviction, be 17 18 sentenced to pay a fine of \$500. 19 (b.1) Death involving a vulnerable highway user.--If the person who violates this section unintentionally causes the 20 death of a vulnerable highway user as a result of the violation, 21 the person shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of 22 23 not less than \$500 and not more than \$5,000.
