## AN ACT

Amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1 Statutes, in game or wildlife protection, further providing 2 for regulations; in hunting and furtaking, repealing 3 provisions relating to hunting on Sunday prohibited, providing for hunting on Sunday, repealing provisions relating to trespass on private property while hunting and to hunting on Sunday without written permission, providing for the offense of trespass on private land while hunting or 7 8 furtaking and for the offense of hunting, trapping or taking game or wildlife without written permission and further 10 providing for training dogs on small game; in special 11 licenses and permits, further providing for field dog trials; 12 and imposing penalties. 13 14 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 15 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 2102(b)(2) of Title 34 of the 16 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: 17 18 § 2102. Regulations. \* \* \* 19 20 (b) Seasons, possession, bag limits and devices. --\* \* \* 21 22 If in any year the commission fails to establish 23 seasons or bag limits or fails to establish other hunting or

- 1 furtaking regulations under authority of this title, the open
- 2 seasons and bag limits for game or furbearers, [Sundays
- 3 excepted, unless otherwise provided by this title, and all
- 4 other hunting or furtaking regulations adopted under
- 5 authority of this title, shall be the same as set by
- 6 regulation of the commission for the previous license year,
- 7 and all seasons shall open and close one calendar day earlier
- 8 than the previous license year. In the event the commission
- 9 fails to establish seasons and bag limits for a license year
- 10 beginning in a leap year, the seasons shall open and close
- two calendar days earlier than the previous license year.

- 13 Section 2. Section 2303 of Title 34 is repealed:
- 14 [§ 2303. Hunting on Sunday prohibited.
- 15 (a) General rule. -- Except as otherwise provided in this
- 16 title, it is unlawful for any person to hunt for any furbearer
- or game on Sunday.
- (b) Construction of section. -- This section shall not be
- 19 construed to prohibit:
- 20 (1) The training of dogs.
- 21 (2) The participation in dog trials as provided for in
- this title.
- (3) The removal of lawfully taken game or wildlife from
- traps or the resetting of the traps on Sunday.
- (b.1) Exceptions. -- Subsection (a) shall not apply to:
- 26 (1) The hunting of foxes.
- 27 (2) The hunting of coyotes.
- 28 (3) Any hunting which occurs on noncommercial regulated
- 29 hunting grounds holding a valid permit under section 2928(b)
- (2) (relating to regulated hunting grounds permits).

- 1 (4) Hunting on three Sundays each calendar year, as 2 follows: One day of Sunday hunting shall be instituted by 3 the commission during the deer rifle season. 4 One day of Sunday hunting shall be instituted 5 (ii) by the commission during the Statewide deer archery 6 7 season. One day of Sunday hunting as determined by the 8 (iii) 9 commission shall be instituted by the commission. 10 Authority to hunt on any Sunday instituted by the commission 11 under this paragraph shall not apply to any person required 12 to secure a hunting license who attempts to hunt on private land without obtaining written permission of the landowner, 13 14 an agent of the landowner or lessee. (c) Penalty. -- A violation of this section is a summary 15 16 offense of the fifth degree.] 17 Section 3. Title 34 is amended by adding a section to read: 18 § 2303.1. Hunting on Sunday. 19 (a) General rule. -- Except as provided in subsection (b), an individual who has secured a hunting license may lawfully hunt 20 21 for any furbearer or game on any day of the week, including Sunday, in accordance with other State law that is not 22 23 inconsistent with this section. 24 (b) Exception. -- Subsection (a) shall not apply to an individual who attempts to hunt on private land without 25 26 obtaining written permission of the owner, an agent of the owner 27 or a lessee of the private land or another authorized person. Section 4. Sections 2314 and 2315 of Title 34 are repealed: 28 29 [§ 2314. Trespass on private property while hunting.
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(a) General rule. -- A person, while engaged in hunting or

- 1 furtaking, commits an offense if, knowing that the person is not
- 2 licensed or privileged to do so, the person:
- 3 (1) enters or remains on any land of another without
- 4 authorization to do so, when the land is posted in a manner
- 5 prescribed by law or reasonably likely to come to the
- 6 person's attention or is fenced or enclosed in a manner
- 7 manifestly designed to exclude trespassers; or
- 8 (2) enters or remains on any land of another without
- 9 authorization and defies an order not to enter or to leave
- that has been personally communicated to the person by the
- owner of the land or other authorized person.
- 12 (b) Applicability. -- This section shall not apply to an
- 13 unarmed person who enters onto posted property for the sole
- 14 purpose of retrieving a hunting dog.
- (c) Penalty. -- An offense under this section shall be graded
- 16 as follows:
- (1) A person who violates subsection (a) (1) commits a
- summary offense of the third degree.
- 19 (2) A person who violates subsection (a) (2) commits a
- misdemeanor.
- 21 (3) A person who commits a second or subsequent
- violation of this section within a seven-year period commits
- a misdemeanor, and the second or subsequent violation shall
- result in forfeiture of the privilege to hunt or take game or
- wildlife anywhere within this Commonwealth for a period of
- one year.
- 27 (d) Enforcement. -- The director shall authorize the police
- 28 department of each municipal corporation to assist in the
- 29 enforcement of this section as necessary, in addition to those
- 30 under section 903 (relating to delegation of enforcement

- 1 powers).
- 2 § 2315. Hunting on Sunday without written permission.
- 3 (a) General rule. -- A person required to secure a hunting
- 4 license to hunt commits an offense if, while engaged in hunting
- 5 on Sunday under section 2303(b.1)(4) (relating to hunting on
- 6 Sunday prohibited), the person enters private land without
- 7 obtaining written permission of the landowner, an agent of the
- 8 landowner or lessee.
- 9 (b) Penalty.--A person who violates subsection (a) commits a
- 10 summary offense of the third degree.]
- 11 Section 5. Title 34 is amended by adding sections to read:
- 12 § 2316. Trespass on private land while hunting or furtaking.
- 13 (a) Offense defined. -- An individual, while engaged in
- 14 <u>hunting or furtaking, commits an offense if, knowing that the</u>
- 15 <u>individual</u> is not licensed or privileged to do so or using dogs
- 16 for the hunting or furtaking, the individual does any of the
- 17 following:
- 18 <u>(1) Enters or remains on private land without</u>
- 19 <u>authorization to do so, if the private land is posted in a</u>
- 20 manner prescribed by law or reasonably likely to come to the
- 21 individual's attention.
- 22 (2) Enters or remains on private land without
- 23 authorization to do so and defies an order not to enter or an
- 24 order to leave that has been personally communicated to the
- 25 individual by the owner, an agent of the owner or a lessee of
- the private land or another authorized person.
- 27 (3) Enters or remains on private land without
- 28 <u>authorization to do so, if the private land is fenced or</u>
- 29 enclosed in a manner manifestly designed to exclude
- 30 trespassers.

1	(4) Subject to subsection (d)(1), enters or remains on
2	private land without authorization to do so, if notice
3	against trespass is given by the placement of identifying
4	purple paint marks on trees or posts on the private land as
5	prescribed by 18 Pa.C.S. § 3503(b)(1)(vi) (relating to
6	<pre>criminal trespass).</pre>
7	(b) Grading
8	(1) For a first violation:
9	(i) An individual who violates subsection (a)(1),
10	(3) or (4) commits a summary offense of the second degree
11	and may be subject to the forfeiture of the privilege to
12	hunt or take game or wildlife anywhere in this
13	Commonwealth for a period of one year.
14	(ii) An individual who violates subsection (a)(2)
15	commits a summary offense of the third degree.
16	(2) For a second violation:
17	(i) An individual who violates subsection (a)(1),
18	(3) or (4) for a second time commits a summary offense of
19	the first degree and may be subject to the forfeiture of
20	the privilege to hunt or take game or wildlife anywhere
21	in this Commonwealth for a period of two years.
22	(ii) An individual who violates subsection (a)(2)
23	for a second time commits a summary offense of the second
24	degree and may be subject to the forfeiture of the
25	privilege to hunt or take game or wildlife anywhere in
26	this Commonwealth for a period of one year.
27	(3) For a third or subsequent violation:
28	(i) An individual who violates subsection (a)(1),
29	(3) or (4) for a third or subsequent time commits a
30	misdemeanor of the third degree and may be subject to the

4	(ii) An individual who violates subsection (a) (2)
5	for a third or subsequent time commits a summary offense

9	(c) Enforcement The director shall authorize the police
10	department of each municipal corporation, in addition to any
11	person described under section 903 (relating to delegation of
12	enforcement powers) to assist in the enforcement of this section
13	as necessary.
14	(d) Applicability
15	(1) Subsection (a) (4) shall not apply in a county of the
16	first class.

- 6 (a) Offense defined. -- An individual commits an offense if
- 7 the individual enters or remains on private land while engaged
- 8 in the hunting, trapping or taking of game or wildlife, by any
- 9 means or manner or device, including the use of dogs, and fails
- 10 to:
- 11 (1) possess written permission of the owner, an agent of
- 12 <u>the owner or a lessee of the private land or another</u>
- authorized person to use, occupy or access the property; or
- 14 (2) produce the written permission described under
- paragraph (1) upon request to the owner, an agent of the
- owner or a lessee of the private land, another authorized
- 17 person or an officer or other person whose duty is to assist
- in the enforcement of this title.
- 19 <u>(b) Grading.--An offense under subsection (a) constitutes a</u>
- 20 <u>summary offense of the third degree.</u>
- 21 Section 6. Sections 2382(c) and 2943(c) of Title 34 are

- 23 § 2382. Training dogs on small game.

- [(c) Sunday limitation.--It is unlawful to train dogs on
- 26 privately owned property on Sunday. This limitation shall not
- 27 apply to:
- (1) National or State forest land.
- (2) State game lands.
- 30 (3) Privately owned property when the consent of the

- person in charge of the land is first obtained.]
- 2 § 2943. Field dog trials.

- 4 (c) Trials for raccoons.--It is lawful to hold trials or
- 5 meets where dogs may work on drags or live raccoons at any hour,
- 6 if permission is obtained to use privately owned land [when the
- 7 meet or trial is to be held on Sunday]:
- 8 (1) During the period of the year when dog training is
- 9 permitted by this title.
- 10 (2) During the period of the year when dog training is
- 11 prohibited by this title if a raccoon dog field trial permit
- is obtained.

- 14 Section 7. The following shall not affect any fine or other
- 15 penalty imposed for a violation under this title that was
- 16 committed before the effective date of this section:
- 17 (1) The repeal of 34 Pa.C.S. § 2303, 2314 or 2315.
- 18 (2) The addition of 34 Pa.C.S. § 2303.1, 2316 or 2317.
- 19 (3) The amendment of 34 Pa.C.S. § 2382(c) or 2943(c).
- 20 Section 8. The addition of 34 Pa.C.S. §§ 2316 and 2317 shall
- 21 apply to an offense committed on or after the effective date of
- 22 this section.
- 23 Section 9. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 24 (1) This section shall take effect immediately.
- 25 (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 60
- 26 days.
