AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in reimbursements by Commonwealth and between school districts, further providing for student-weighted basic education funding.
- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. Section 2502.53(b) of the act of March 10, 1949
- 11 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, added
- 12 June 1, 2016 (P.L.252, No.35), is amended to read:
- 13 Section 2502.53. Student-Weighted Basic Education Funding.--
- 14 * * *
- 15 (b) For the 2015-2016 school year [and each school year
- 16 thereafter], the Commonwealth shall pay to each school district
- 17 a basic education funding allocation which shall consist of the
- 18 following:
- 19 (1) An amount equal to the school district's basic education
- 20 funding allocation for the 2013-2014 school year.

- 1 (2) A student-based allocation to be calculated as follows:
- 2 (i) Multiply the school district's student-weighted average
- 3 daily membership by the median household income index and local
- 4 effort capacity index.
- 5 (ii) Multiply the product in subparagraph (i) by the
- 6 [difference between the amount appropriated for the allocation
- 7 of basic education funding to school districts and the amount
- 8 appropriated for the allocation in paragraph (1).] total amount
- 9 distributed to all school districts for basic education funding
- 10 for the 2014-2015 school year.
- 11 (iii) Divide the product in subparagraph (ii) by the sum of
- 12 the products in subparagraph (i) for all school districts.
- 13 <u>(iv)</u> Subtract the amount for each school district as
- 14 calculated according to subparagraph (iii) from the amount
- 15 allocated to each school district for basic education funding
- 16 <u>for the 2014-2015 school year.</u>
- 17 (v) For each school district in which the difference as
- 18 calculated in subparagraph (iv) is greater than zero, the school
- 19 district shall receive an amount distributed as follows:
- 20 (A) Subtract the amount appropriated for the allocation of
- 21 basic education funding for the 2015-2016 school year from the
- 22 amount appropriated for the 2014-2015 school year.
- 23 (B) Multiply the difference from clause (A) by seventy-five
- 24 percent (75%).
- 25 (C) Multiply the product from clause (B) by the positive
- 26 difference from subparagraph (iv) for each qualifying school
- 27 district.
- 28 (D) Divide the product from clause (C) by the sum of the
- 29 positive amounts as calculated under subparagraph (iv) for all
- 30 qualifying school districts.

- 1 (vi) Each school district shall also receive an additional
- 2 amount as follows:
- 3 (A) Multiply the school district's student-weighted average
- 4 <u>daily membership by the median household income index and local</u>
- 5 <u>effort capacity index.</u>
- 6 (B) Subtract the amount appropriated for the allocation of
- 7 basic education funding for the 2015-2016 school year from the
- 8 amount appropriated for the 2014-2015 school year.
- 9 (C) Multiply the difference from clause (B) by twenty-five
- 10 percent (25%).
- 11 (D) Subtract the amount appropriated for the allocation of
- 12 <u>basic education funding for the 2014-2015 school year from the</u>
- 13 amount appropriated for the 2013-2014 school year.
- 14 (E) Add the product from clause (C) and the difference from
- 15 clause (D).
- 16 (F) Multiply the amount for each school district from clause
- 17 (A) by the sum from clause (E).
- (G) Divide the product from clause (F) by the sum of the
- 19 products in clause (A) for all school districts.

- 21 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2016, or
- 22 immediately, whichever is later.
