## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, providing for credit for employment at congregate care facility.

  The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 11 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 12 section to read:
- 13 <u>Section 1507. Credit for Employment at Congregate Care</u>
- 14 Facility.--(a) A student who is in grade eleven or twelve at a
- 15 school entity or nonpublic school and who is employed, either on
- 16 <u>a paid or voluntary basis, at a congregate care facility may</u>
- 17 <u>earn one elective credit toward graduation for each three</u>
- 18 hundred fifty (350) hours worked at the congregate care
- 19 <u>facility</u>, for a maximum of two elective credits toward
- 20 graduation.

- 1 (b) The school entity or nonpublic school, in coordination
- 2 with the Department of Education, shall develop an application
- 3 process and form for the student seeking elective credit under
- 4 this section. The following apply:
- 5 (1) The application form shall require the following
- 6 information:
- 7 (i) The name of the student.
- 8 (ii) The name, address and telephone number of the
- 9 congregate care facility at which the student is employed.
- 10 (iii) The name of any individual supervising the student at
- 11 the congregate care facility.
- 12 <u>(iv) The nature of the student's employment at the</u>
- 13 <u>congregate care facility.</u>
- 14 <u>(v) The number of hours that the student is employed at the</u>
- 15 <u>congregate care facility.</u>
- 16 (2) The school entity or nonpublic school shall establish
- 17 deadlines for submission of the application and any conditions
- 18 that the student must meet to obtain any elective credit toward
- 19 graduation, including verification of the number of hours worked
- 20 at the congregate care facility.
- 21 (3) Before any elective credit may be awarded to the
- 22 student, the school entity or nonpublic school must approve the
- 23 <u>student's application and the student must satisfy all the</u>
- 24 requirements under this section.
- 25 (c) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 26 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 27 <u>the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 28 "Congregate care facility" shall mean any of the following:
- 29 (1) A long-term care nursing facility as defined in section
- 30 802.1 of the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the

- 1 "Health Care Facilities Act."
- 2 (2) A personal care home or an assisted living residence,
- 3 licensed by the Department of Human Services under the act of
- 4 June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the "Human Services
- 5 Code."
- 6 "Nonpublic school" shall mean a nonprofit school, other than
- 7 a public school in this Commonwealth, wherein a resident of this
- 8 <u>Commonwealth may legally fulfill the compulsory school</u>
- 9 attendance requirements of this article and which meet the
- 10 requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (Public
- 11 Law 88-352, 42 U.S.C. § 2000 et seq.).
- "School entity" shall mean a public school, including a
- 13 charter school or cyber charter school, intermediate unit or
- 14 area career and technical school operating within this
- 15 Commonwealth.
- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
