AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in school finances, further providing for distress in school districts of the first class; in grounds and buildings, further providing for public hearing prior to closing school; and, in pupils and attendance, providing for conditions for closing schools.
10	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
11	hereby enacts as follows:
12	Section 1. Sections 696(i)(6) and 780 of the act of March
13	10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of
14	1949, are amended to read:
15	Section 696. Distress in School Districts of the First
16	Class* * *
17	(i) In addition to all powers granted to the superintendent
18	by law and a special board of control under section 693 and
19	notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the School Reform
20	Commission shall have the following powers:
21	* * *

(6) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this act, to
close or reconstitute a school, including the reassignment,
suspension or dismissal of professional employes[.], except that
<u>a school in a school district of the first class may not be</u>
<u>closed except as provided in sections 780, 1311 and 1311.1.</u>

7 Section 780. Public Hearing Prior to Closing School. -- In the 8 event of a permanent closing of a public school or substantially all of a school's facilities, the board of school directors 9 10 shall hold a public hearing on the question not less than three 11 (3) months prior to the decision of the board relating to the 12 closing of the school. Notwithstanding any provision of this act_ 13 or regulation, the board of school directors or a special board 14 of control in a school district of the first class shall hold a separate hearing for each school that is proposed to be 15 16 permanently closed in the school district and for each school 17 designated to receive an increase of thirty per centum (30%) or 18 more in student enrollment as the result of a school being 19 permanently closed. Notice of the hearing shall be given in a 20 newspaper of general circulation in the school district at least 21 fifteen (15) days prior to the date of such hearings. The board 22 of school directors or a special board of control in a school 23 district of the first class shall conspicuously post notice of 24 the hearing on the school district's publicly accessible Internet website, if a website is maintained. The published and 25 26 posted notice must contain the date, time, place and purpose of 27 the hearing and must be in English and Spanish. 28 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read: 29 Section 1311.1. Conditions for Closing Schools.--(a) In determining whether a school is permanently closed under section 30

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1	1311 and the students transferred to another school in the
2	school district, the board of school directors of a school
3	district or a special board of control exercising the authority
4	of a board of school directors in a school district of the first
5	class under section 696 shall:
6	(1) Prepare, or cause to be prepared, a thorough study of
7	each school proposed to be permanently closed. The study shall
8	focus primarily on the welfare of the students to be affected by
9	the proposed closure at both the school to be permanently closed
10	and the school to which the students will be transferred and
11	shall include, but may not be limited to, an evaluation of the
12	following:
13	(i) Enrollments, including any anticipated increase or
14	decrease in student enrollment based on both historical and
15	current projections, and the capacity of the school to which the
16	students from the school proposed to be closed will be
17	transferred to accommodate additional students.
18	(ii) A summary of any known or anticipated inconvenience or
19	hardship, including safety concerns, walking hazards or
20	transportation factors, which may affect the transfer of
21	students enrolled in the school proposed to be permanently
22	closed to another school in the school district.
23	(iii) Any known or projected cost of providing additional
24	school facilities.
25	(iv) Information on school closure counseling services
26	available to students enrolled in each school proposed to be
27	permanently closed.
28	(v) Information on student enrollment or population
29	characteristics such as ethnicity, special needs, free and
30	reduced lunch and English language learners.

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1	(vi) Description and comparison of the learning climate,
2	academic performance and special and innovative programming of
3	both the school proposed to be permanently closed and the school
4	to which the students will be transferred in the school
5	<u>district.</u>
6	(vii) The physical condition of the school facility of both
7	the school proposed to be permanently closed and the school to
8	which the students will be transferred in the school district,
9	including technological capacity or other educationally
10	innovative features.
11	(viii) The actual operating costs of the school proposed to
12	be permanently closed.
13	(ix) A summary of the anticipated financial impact that
14	would result from permanently closing the school.
15	(x) Information on the proximity of the school proposed to
16	be closed to other schools in the school district.
17	(xi) A summary of all procedures developed and implemented
18	to ensure community involvement and actual community input
19	regarding the criteria to be considered in the decision-making
20	process by community members representing parents, students,
21	social services, civic organizations, neighborhood businesses
22	and State and local government officials.
23	(xii) A summary of the anticipated disposition of the school
24	building, including any plans for the sale or lease of the
25	school building, and plans for the ongoing maintenance and
26	security of the closed school building.
27	(xiii) Any other information or factors the board of school
28	directors or special board of control deems relevant.
29	(2) Conduct public hearings in accordance with section 780
30	for each school which is proposed to be closed in the school

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1	district as well as for each school designated to receive an	
2	increase of thirty per centum (30%) or more in student	
3	enrollment as the result of school closures.	
4	(b) When a board of school directors or a special board of	
5	control in a school district of the first class finally	
6	determines that a school will be permanently closed in a school	
7	district, the following shall apply:	
8	(1) School closure counseling services shall be provided to	
9	students enrolled in a school proposed to be permanently closed	
10	in the school district and may be provided to such students on a	
11	temporary or as-needed basis and shall be provided in accordance	
12	with the school district's policies and procedures governing	
13	counseling services.	
14	(2) School closure counseling services required under this	
15	subsection shall be made available to all students enrolled in a	
16	school subject to closure within thirty (30) days of the final	
17	decision to permanently close the school.	
18	(3) For the purposes of this subsection, the term "school	
19	<u>closure counseling services" shall mean group or individual</u>	
20	counseling provided to students enrolled in a school proposed to	
21	be permanently closed in order to help the students transition	
22	emotionally and physically to a new school in the school	
23	<u>district.</u>	
24	(c) A board of school directors or a special board of	
25	control in a school district of the first class may authorize	
26	the use of school guidance counselors employed by the school	
27	district or professional counselors licensed in accordance with	
28	the provisions of the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39),	
29	known as the "Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and	
30	Professional Counselors Act," to provide school closing	
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- 1 counseling services authorized under this section.
- 2 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
