## AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in child custody, providing for gender identification.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 23 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
8	<u>§ 5329.2. Gender identification.</u>
9	(a) Nonconsideration of certain factorsIf a party seeks
10	any form of custody of a child, the court, in determining the
11	best interest of the child, may not consider the refusal of the
12	party to:
13	(1) use the preferred pronouns of the child; or
14	(2) consent to gender affirmation treatment, gender
15	transition, genital gender reassignment surgery or nongenital
16	gender reassignment surgery.
17	(b) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
18	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this

1	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
2	"Biological sex." The biological indication of male and
3	female in the context of reproductive potential or capacity,
4	such as sex chromosomes, naturally occurring sex hormones,
5	gonads and nonambiguous internal and external genitalia present
6	at birth, without regard to an individual's psychological,
7	chosen or subjective experience of gender.
8	"Gender." The psychological, behavioral, social and cultural
9	aspects of being male or female.
10	"Gender affirmation treatment." Includes any medical service
11	that seeks to surgically or chemically alter or remove healthy
12	physical or anatomical characteristics or features of an
13	individual that are typical for the individual's biological sex,
14	in order to instill or create physiological or anatomical
15	characteristics that resemble a sex different from the
16	individual's biological sex, including genital gender
17	reassignment surgery or nongenital gender reassignment surgery
18	performed for the purpose of assisting the individual with a
19	gender transition.
20	"Gender transition." The process in which an individual goes
21	from identifying with and living as a gender that corresponds to
22	the biological sex of the individual to identifying with and
23	living as a gender different from the biological sex of the
24	individual. The term may involve social, legal or physical
25	changes.
26	"Genital gender reassignment surgery." A medical procedure
27	performed for the purpose of assisting an individual with a
28	gender transition, including any of the following:
29	(1) A surgical procedure such as:
30	(i) penectomy, orchiectomy, vaginoplasty,

1	clitoroplasty or vulvoplasty for biologically male_
2	patients; or
3	(ii) hysterectomy or ovariectomy for biologically
4	female patients.
5	(2) Reconstruction of the fixed part of the urethra with
6	<u>or without a metoidioplasty.</u>
7	(3) Phalloplasty, vaginectomy, scrotoplasty or
8	implantation of erection or testicular prostheses for
9	biologically female patients.
10	"Nongenital gender reassignment surgery." A medical
11	procedure performed for the purpose of assisting an individual
12	with a gender transition, including any of the following:
13	(1) A surgical procedure for a biologically male
14	patient, such as augmentation mammoplasty, facial
15	feminization surgery, liposuction, lipofilling, voice
16	surgery, thyroid cartilage reduction, gluteal augmentation,
17	hair reconstruction or various aesthetic procedures.
18	(2) A surgical procedure for a biologically female
19	patient, such as subcutaneous mastectomy, voice surgery,
20	liposuction, lipofilling, pectoral implants or various
21	aesthetic procedures.
22	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
