1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in transfers of credits between institutions of higher education, further providing for definitions, for duties of public institutions of higher education and State-related institutions, for Transfer and Articulation Oversight Committee and for duties of department.
11	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
12	hereby enacts as follows:
13	Section 1. Section 2001-C of the act of March 10, 1949
14	(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,
15	amended November 6, 2017 (P.L.1142, No.55), is amended to read:
16	Section 2001-C. Definitions.
17	The following words and phrases when used in this article
18	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
19	context clearly indicates otherwise:
20	"Advanced Placement Program." A program authorized by the

college board that allows a student to study college-level 1 2 subjects while enrolled in high school and to receive advanced 3 placement and college credit for earning a qualified score on the course-related Advanced Placement Program exam. 4

5 "Career, technical or applied courses." Courses usually offered as part of an associate degree curriculum designed to 6 7 prepare students for entry-level professions, not for transfer 8 to baccalaureate programs for advanced studies.

9 "College-Level Examination Program." A set of standardized 10 tests developed by the college board for various subjects, and 11 on which a qualifying score can be used to earn college credit. 12 "Community college." An institution created pursuant to 13 Article XIX-A or the act of August 24, 1963 (P.L.1132, No.484), known as the Community College Act of 1963. 14

15 "Credit for prior learning." College-level credit granted 16 toward the award of a postsecondary degree or certificate for experiential learning that can be demonstrated through various 17 18 means of assessment to be the equivalent of learning gained 19 through formal collegiate instruction, including an Advanced 20 Placement Program exam, International Baccalaureate Diploma 21 Program exam, a College-Level Examination Program exam and 22 Dantes Subject Standardized Tests.

23 "Dantes Subject Standardized Tests." A set of subject exams 24 approved by the American Council on Education that tests 25 knowledge of both lower-level and upper-level college material. 26 ["Degree objective courses." Courses required for completion of a major in a subject area.] 27

28 "Department." The Department of Education of the 29 Commonwealth.

30 "Developmental or remedial courses." Courses typically 20180HB2159PN3279

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consisting of reading, writing and math designed to prepare
 students for college-level courses and that are not
 transferable.

4 "Equivalent courses." Courses determined to have generally
5 equivalent content and level as determined by the faculty of an
6 institution of higher education consistent with the policy at
7 each institution <u>of higher education</u>.

8 "Foundation courses." Courses required to be completed by 9 students that provide an academic foundation for the degree, 10 general education or advanced study in a major.

"Independent institution of higher education." An 11 12 institution of higher education which is operated not for 13 profit, located in and incorporated or chartered by the 14 Commonwealth and entitled to confer degrees as set forth in 24 Pa.C.S. § 6505 (relating to power to confer degrees) and to 15 apply to itself the designation "college" or "university" as 16 provided for by the standards and qualifications prescribed by 17 18 the State Board of Education pursuant to 24 Pa.C.S. Ch. 65 19 (relating to private colleges, universities and seminaries).

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"Industry-recognized credential." A credential that:

21 (1) is sought or accepted by employers within the

22 <u>industry or sector involved as a recognized, preferred or</u>

23 required credential for recruitment, screening, hiring,

24 retention or advancement purposes;

25 (2) where appropriate, is endorsed by a nationally 26 recognized trade association or organization representing a 27 significant part of the industry or sector; and 28 (3) is approved by the department.

29 "Institution of higher education." Any of the accredited

3 (a) Agreements.--Each [public] institution of higher education and [State-related institution] public school shall 4 provide the Transfer and Articulation Oversight Committee and 5 the department with copies of all articulation agreements for 6 7 inclusion in the electronic database or software program and 8 portal provided for under section 2005-C(4) within 180 days of the effective date of this section and within 30 days of 9 10 entering into any subsequent articulation agreement.

11 (b) Reporting requirements.--The following shall apply to 12 reporting requirements:

(1) Each [public] institution of higher education [and State-related institution] shall submit to the department a series of interim reports that describe the status of the institution's articulation agreements, which shall include all of the following:

(i) The number of students who have transferred to
the [public] institution of higher education [or Staterelated institution] by institution of origin within the
last academic year or since submittal of the
institution's last interim report required under this
section.

24 (ii) The total number of credits completed by25 transfer students at the institution of origin.

26 (iii) The total number of credits from each
27 institution of origin that transferred to the [public]

3 (i) Articulation agreements and agreements that award credit for an industry-recognized credential 4 entered into by [public institutions of higher education 5 6 and institutions that elect to participate under section 7 2006-C.] institutions of higher education, public schools 8 and institutions described under clause (C). The following shall apply: 9 10 (A) The department shall extract transfer 11 information from each articulation agreement and each 12 agreement that awards credit for an industry-13 recognized credential and enter the information into 14 the electronic database or software program and portal and provide a meaningful, user-friendly and 15 16 interactive search engine for access to the

17 <u>information</u>.

18(B) The department shall, within 60 days of19receiving an articulation agreement or agreement that20awards credit for an industry-recognized credential,21update the database and post each articulation22agreement and each agreement that awards credit for23an industry-recognized credential on its publicly24accessible Internet website.

25 <u>(C) An institution which is not subject to the</u> 26 <u>duties under section 2003-C may submit to the</u> 27 <u>department any articulation agreement or agreement</u> 28 <u>that awards credit for an industry-recognized</u> 29 <u>credential into which the institution enters. Each</u> 30 <u>submitted articulation agreement and each agreement</u>
