## AN ACT

9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. Section 7308(a) of Title 35 of the Pennsylvania
11	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
12	§ 7308. Laws suspended during emergency assignments.
13	(a) Commonwealth agenciesIn the case of a declaration of
14	a state of emergency by the Governor, Commonwealth agencies may
15	implement their emergency assignments without regard to
16	procedures required by other laws (except mandatory
17	constitutional requirements and the requirements under 62
18	Pa.C.S. (relating to procurement) pertaining to the performance
19	of public work, entering into contracts, incurring of
20	obligations, employment of temporary workers, rental of

equipment, purchase of supplies and materials and expenditures
 of public funds.

4 Section 2. Sections 106.1(b)(6), (7) and (8) and 516 of 5 Title 62 are amended to read:

6 § 106.1. Public access to procurement records.

8 (b) Public posting and availability of procurement 9 information.--The purchasing agency shall post the following 10 procurement documents on the department's or, in the case of an 11 independent agency, its own publicly accessible Internet website 12 or otherwise make available in the manner indicated below:

14 (6) The written determinations required by section [516]
15 <u>516(f)</u> (relating to emergency procurement) shall be posted in
16 advance, if feasible, but no later than seven calendar days
17 after authorization by the department or independent
18 purchasing agency.

(7) A contract resulting from a procurement under this
 part or, in the case of section 516(e), an invoice THAT IS
 NOT REQUIRED TO BE FILED WITH THE TREASURY DEPARTMENT UNDER
 SECTION 1701(A) OF THE RIGHT-TO-KNOW LAW, shall be posted as
 soon as practicable upon its full execution by the
 Commonwealth.

(8) Requests under section 515 or 516 to extend a
contract for which no further options, renewals or extensions
are available in the contract shall be posted for seven
calendar days for public comment prior to approval of the
request by the department or independent purchasing agency.
Upon approval of a request by the department or an

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independent purchasing agency, the signed and written determination required under section 515(b) or [516] <u>516(f)</u> shall be posted.

5 § 516. Emergency procurement.

[The head of a purchasing agency may make or authorize others 6 7 to make an emergency procurement when there exists a threat to public health, welfare or safety or circumstances outside the 8 control of the agency create an urgency of need which does not 9 permit the delay involved in using more formal competitive 10 11 methods. Whenever practical, in the case of a procurement of a 12 supply, at least two quotes shall be solicited. A written determination of the basis for the emergency and for the 13 14 selection of the particular contractor shall be included in the procurement file. No written contract may be required. The 15 16 supplier of the supply, service or construction may be paid 17 based on the emergency approval and approved invoice.] 18 (a) Authorization. -- The head of a purchasing agency may make 19 an emergency procurement for supply, service or construction 20 under this section. 21 (b) Requests by Commonwealth agencies.--For an emergency procurement in which the department acts as the agent for a 22 23 Commonwealth agency, the Secretary of General Services may only 24 make an emergency procurement upon the written request of the head of the Commonwealth agency- OR A SINGLE DEPUTY OF THE HEAD <--25 26 OF THE COMMONWEALTH AGENCY DESIGNATED IN WRITING TO ACT ON 27 BEHALF OF THE HEAD OF THE COMMONWEALTH AGENCY. 28 (c) Emergencies. -- The head of a purchasing agency may only 29 make an emergency procurement when all of the following occur: 30 (1) There exists a threat to public health, welfare or <--

15	(d) QuotesThe head of a purchasing agency shall solicit
16	no fewer than two quotes for an emergency procurement, unless
17	the head of the purchasing agency determines, in writing, that
18	the circumstances of the emergency specified under subsection
19	(c) make the solicitation of no fewer than two quotes
20	impractical.
21	(e) InvoicesThe head of a purchasing agency may authorize
22	the payment of the consideration for the supply, service or
23	construction for an emergency procurement based on an approved
24	invoice if the head of the purchasing agency determines, in
25	writing, that the circumstances of the emergency under
26	subsection (c) make the use of a contract impractical.
27	(f) Written determinationsIn making an emergency
28	procurement, the head of a purchasing agency shall make the
29	following written determinations and shall include the written
30	determinations in the procurement file:

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1	(1) The basis for the emergency under subsection (c). $A$ <
2	<u>declaration of disaster emergency under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c)</u>
3	(relating to general authority of Governor) may not serve as
4	the written determination of the basis for the emergency.
5	(2) IF THE EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT RELATES TO A DISASTER <
6	EMERGENCY SUBJECT TO A DECLARATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY
7	<u>under 35 pa.c.s. § 7301(c) (relating to general authority of</u>
