AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in school health services, further 5 providing for vision screening and examinations. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 1403.1(a), (b)(1) and (e) of the act of 10 March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code 11 of 1949, are amended to read: 12 Section 1403.1. Vision Screening and Examinations. -- (a) (1)Prior to admission to school for the first time, a parent or 13 legal guardian shall present to the school entity or nonpublic 14 15 school certification from a primary care provider or vision 16 screener that the child has passed or failed a vision screening

- 2 ophthalmologist or optometrist within the previous twelve

- 4 (2) The [Advisory Health Board] Department of Health shall
- 5 promulgate regulations to establish vision screening standards
- 6 based on instrument-based vision screening technologies or
- 7 visual acuity testing, taking into consideration national
- 8 guidelines from the American Academy of Pediatrics and American
- 9 Association for Pediatric Ophthalmology and Strabismus.
- 10 (3) To facilitate the prompt implementation of this section,
- 11 the Department of Health shall promulgate temporary regulations.
- 12 The following apply:
- 13 (i) No later than six months after the effective date of
- 14 this subparagraph, the Department of Health shall transmit
- 15 notice of the promulgation of the temporary regulations to the
- 16 Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the next
- 17 available issue of the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- 18 (ii) The temporary regulations shall expire no later than
- 19 two years following the publication of the notice in accordance
- 20 with subparagraph (i).
- 21 (iii) Upon publication of the notice in accordance with
- 22 subparagraph (i), the Department of Health shall post the
- 23 temporary regulations on its publicly accessible Internet
- 24 website.
- 25 (iv) The temporary regulations shall not be subject to any
- 26 of the following:
- 27 (A) Section 612 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
- 28 No.175), known as "The Administrative Code of 1929."
- 29 (B) Sections 201, 202, 203, 204 and 205 of the act of July
- 30 31, 1968 (P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the Commonwealth

- 2 (C) Sections 204(b) and 301(10) of the act of October 15,
- 3 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the "Commonwealth Attorneys
- 4 Act."
- 5 (D) The act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the
- 6 <u>"Regulatory Review Act."</u>
- 7 (v) The authority of the Department of Health to promulgate
- 8 <u>temporary regulations under this paragraph shall expire six</u>
- 9 months after the effective date of this subparagraph.
- 10 Regulations adopted after this period shall be promulgated as
- 11 provided by law.
- 12 (b) (1) Every school year at a school entity or nonpublic
- 13 school, until a child completes the fifth grade and at least
- 14 every two years thereafter until the child graduates from the
- 15 twelfth grade, the child shall have a vision screening performed
- 16 by school health personnel or screeners with specific training
- 17 in vision screening techniques and protocols approved by the
- 18 [Advisory Health Board] Department of Health. The results of the
- 19 vision screening shall be supplied to the parent or legal
- 20 guardian of the child.

- (e) This section shall apply to school years beginning after
- 23 the regulations are promulgated by the [Advisory Health Board]
- 24 Department of Health under subsection (a) (2).

- 26 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
