## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 5 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 7 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 12 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 17 18 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 19 20 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined," in judicial administration, further providing 21 for surcharge and fee and providing for investigation and 22 23 prosecution of Internet crimes against children; and establishing the Internet Crimes Against Children Restricted 24 25 Account.

- 26 This act shall be referred to as Alicia's Law.

- 1 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 2 <u>Section 2803-E. Investigation and prosecution of Internet</u>
- 3 crimes against children.
- 4 (a) Establishment of task force. -- The Attorney General may
- 5 <u>establish a task force to investigate and prosecute violations</u>
- 6 of 18 Pa.C.S. Ch. 31 (relating to sexual offenses) committed
- 7 <u>against individuals under 18 years of age using the Internet. A</u>
- 8 <u>task force established under this subsection shall meet the</u>
- 9 requirements of 34 U.S.C. § 21114 (relating to duties and
- 10 <u>functions of task forces</u>).
- 11 (b) Designation of task forces. -- No later than 60 days after
- 12 the effective date of this subsection and each January 1
- 13 thereafter, the Attorney General shall designate all task forces
- 14 in this Commonwealth that meet the requirements of 34 U.S.C. §
- 15 21114, including a task force established under subsection (a).
- 16 The Attorney General shall transmit notice of the list of the
- 17 task force designations under this section to the Legislative
- 18 Reference Bureau for publication in the next available issue of
- 19 the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- 20 <u>(c) Funding.--</u>
- 21 (1) The Internet Crimes Against Children Restricted
- 22 Account is established as a restricted account in the General
- 23 <u>Fund.</u>
- 24 (2) Money in the Internet Crimes Against Children
- 25 Restricted Account may only be used to provide grants and
- financial support for task forces designated under subsection
- 27 <u>(b)</u>.
- 28 (3) Money in the Internet Crimes Against Children
- 29 Restricted Account may only be used upon appropriation by the
- 30 General Assembly.

1 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
