## AN ACT

Providing AMENDING THE ACT OF MARCH 10, 1949 (P.L.30, NO.14), ENTITLED "AN ACT RELATING TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM, INCLUDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS APPLICABLE AS WELL TO PRIVATE 3 AND PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS; AMENDING, REVISING, CONSOLIDATING AND CHANGING THE LAWS RELATING THERETO," PROVIDING for the posting of annual financial information for public school entities-; IN PUPILS AND ATTENDANCE, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR EDUCATION AND TRAINING OF EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN; IN CHARTER 8 SCHOOLS, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS AND FOR SCHOOL 9 STAFF; IN VOCATIONAL EDUCATION, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR 10 VOCATIONAL EDUCATION EQUIPMENT GRANTS; IN COMMUNITY COLLEGES, 11 FURTHER PROVIDING FOR FINANCIAL PROGRAM AND PAYMENT 12 REIMBURSEMENT; IN DISRUPTIVE STUDENT PROGRAMS, FURTHER 13 PROVIDING FOR APPLICATIONS; IN PRIVATE ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION 14 INSTITUTIONS FOR DISRUPTIVE STUDENTS, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR CONTRACTS WITH PRIVATE ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS; IN 16 FUNDING FOR PUBLIC LIBRARIES, PROVIDING FOR STATE AID FOR 17 18 FISCAL YEAR 2015-2016; AND, IN REIMBURSEMENTS BY COMMONWEALTH AND BETWEEN SCHOOL DISTRICTS, PROVIDING FOR STUDENT-WEIGHTED 19 BASIC EDUCATION FUNDING; FURTHER PROVIDING FOR PAYMENTS TO INTERMEDIATE UNITS, FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION PAYMENTS TO SCHOOL 21 DISTRICTS, FOR EXTRAORDINARY SPECIAL EDUCATION PROGRAM 22 EXPENSES, FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION FUNDING FOR ELIGIBLE STUDENTS 23 WITH DISABILITIES IN COST CATEGORY 3, AND FOR ASSISTANCE TO 24 25 SCHOOL DISTRICTS DECLARED TO BE IN FINANCIAL RECOVERY STATUS OR IDENTIFIED FOR FINANCIAL WATCH STATUS; AND PROVIDING FOR 26 READY-TO-LEARN BLOCK GRANTS. 27

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 1 hereby enacts as follows:
- 2 Section 1. Short title.
- 3 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Public School-

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- 4 Web Accountability and Transparency (SchoolWATCH) Act.
- 5 Section 2. Definitions.
- 6 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 7 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the-
- 8 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 9 "Administrative staff." Employees of a public school entity
- 10 that include, but are not limited to, superintendents, assistant-
- 11 superintendents, deputy superintendents, principals, assistant
- 12 principals, supervisors, managers, directors and coordinators.
- 13 "Area vocational technical school." As defined in section
- 14 1841 of the Public School Code of 1949.
- 15 "Average daily membership." As defined in section 2501 of
- 16 the Public School Code of 1949.
- 17 "Charter school." As defined in section 1703-A of the Public-
- 18 School Code of 1949.
- 19 "Charter school entity." A charter school, cyber charter
- 20 school or regional charter school as defined in section 1703-A-
- 21 of the Public School Code of 1949.
- 22 "Cyber charter school." As defined in section 1703 A of the
- 23 Public School Code of 1949.
- 24 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 25 Commonwealth.
- 26 "Expenditures." As defined in section 602 A of the Public
- 27 School Code of 1949.
- 28 "Facilities acquisition and construction expenditures."
- 29 Expenditures related to the purchase or improvement of land,
- 30 <del>buildings, service systems and built in equipment.</del>

1 "General fund balance." The balance in a public school

2 entity's general fund, which shall not include nonspendable and

- 3 restricted fund balances.
- 4 "Instructional expenditures." Expenditures related to all
- 5 those activities dealing directly with the interaction between
- 6 teachers and students and related costs, which can be directly
- 7 attributed to a program of instruction.
- 8 "Market value/personal income aid ratio." A school-
- 9 district's combined market value and personal income wealth per
- 10 pupil relative to the State average.
- 11 (1) For an area vocational technical school, this amount
- 12 shall be calculated based on the sum of market value and
- 13 personal income wealth data for each of the area vocational-
- 14 technical school's component school districts.
- 15 (2) For a charter school or regional charter school,
- 16 this amount shall be calculated based on the sum of market
- 17 value and personal income wealth data for each school-
- 18 district that granted a charter to the charter school or-
- 19 regional charter school under section 1717-A or 1718-A of the
- 20 Public School Code of 1949.
- 21 (3) For a cyber charter school, this amount shall be
- 22 calculated based on the sum of market value and personal
- 23 income wealth data for the school district in which the cyber-
- 24 charter school's administrative offices are located.
- 25 "Noninstructional expenditures." Expenditures related to
- 26 activities concerned with providing noninstructional services to
- 27 students, staff or the community.
- 28 "Other financing uses." Current debt service expenditures
- 29 and other expenses such as the refunding of debt and transfers
- 30 of money from one fund to another.

1 "Public School Code of 1949." The act of March 10, 1949-(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949. 2 "Public school entity." Financial information to be posted. 18 19 (a) Information. Within 90 days of the effective date of this act and by May 31 of each year thereafter, the department-20 21 shall post all of the following for each public school entity on its publicly accessible Internet website, to the extent the 22 information is available to the department: 23 24 (1) The following financial information for the public-25 school entity for the most recent fiscal year for which the 26 public school entity reported such information to the 27 department: (i) Total expenditures in the following categories: 28 29 (A) Instructional. (B) Support services. 30

8 .	(4) Use existing databases and electronic reporting-
9	systems to the extent possible.
20	(5) Provide for an electronic feature that will allow
21	the public to compare financial information for a minimum of
22	four public school entities.
23	(6) Beginning with information pertaining to the 2012-
24	2013 fiscal year, post the information required under-
25	subsection (a) (1) for at least the most recent three fiscal
26	years for which such information is available to the
27	department, including a trend graph displaying the change in-
28	the amount reported each year from the amount reported in the
29	<del>previous year.</del>
30	(c) Limitation. The department's posting of financial
