1 2 3 4	Amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in service and facilities, providing for master meter system and submetering program for landlord ratepayers.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Chapter 15 of Title 66 of the Pennsylvania
8	Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subchapter to read:
9	SUBCHAPTER C
10	MASTER METER SYSTEM AND SUBMETERING

16	<u>§ 1551. Declaration of policy.</u>
17	The General Assembly finds and declares that it is the policy
18	of the Commonwealth to encourage access for tenants and landlord
19	ratepayers to energy technologies and efficiency through

1	programs which offer master meter systems and submetering			
2	options.			
3	<u>§ 1552. Definitions.</u>			
4	The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter_			
5	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the			
6	context clearly indicates otherwise:			
7	"Conversion." The process of converting a residential			
8	building from the use of a multimeter system to a master meter			
9	system.			
10	"Energy efficiency." A reduction in overall consumption,			
11	measured in kilowatt hours, or the shifting of an amount of			
12	energy during a specified period of time, measured as demand in			
13	<u>kilowatts.</u>			
14	"Master meter system." A system by which public utility and			
15	electric generation services for a single residential building			
16	are billed through a commercial public utility account. The term			
17	<u>does not include a multimeter system.</u>			
18	"Multimeter system." A system by which each tenant holds an			
19	individual public utility account. The term does not include a			
20	<u>master meter system.</u>			
21	"Residential building." A building containing one or more			
22	dwelling units occupied by one or more tenants. The term does			
23	not include nursing homes, hotels and motels or any dwelling of			
24	which the landlord ratepayer is the only resident.			
25	"Submetering." Meters owned by a landlord ratepayer and			
26	installed for the purpose of billing individual tenant usage or			
27	energy efficiency.			
28	"Tenant." Any person or group of persons who are			
29	contractually obligated to make rental payments to the landlord			
30	ratepayer pursuant to a rental arrangement, including, but not			
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1	limited to, an oral or written lease with the landlord ratepayer
2	for a dwelling unit in a residential building or mobile home
3	park which is provided gas, electric, steam, sewer or water as
4	an included service under the rental agreement and who are not
5	the ratepayers of the utility which supplied the gas, electric,
6	steam, sewer or water service.
7	§ 1553. Master meter system and submetering program.
8	(a) EstablishmentThe commission shall establish a program
9	for a landlord ratepayer or the landlord ratepayer's designated
10	agent for the use of a master meter system or submetering.
11	(b) CriteriaThe commission shall ensure that the program
12	established under subsection (a) complies with the following
13	<u>criteria:</u>
14	(1) Allows a landlord ratepayer with an option to choose
15	a master meter service from a public utility for the landlord
16	ratepayer's residential property in accordance with section
17	1313 (relating to price upon resale of public utility
18	services).
19	(2) Ensures that a master meter system has certified and
20	tested meters for tenant bill accuracy.
21	(3) Has at least one technology option to allow a tenant
22	to control the tenant's usage, which may include the ability
23	to shift energy consumption to a different time or an overall
24	reduction in energy usage or a guarantee of total bill
25	savings less than the amount under section 1313. A public
26	utility may include demand or energy efficiency from a master
27	meter system as a reduction for the purpose of shared saving
28	or lost distribution revenue programs as determined by the
29	commission.
30	(4) Verifies a lease agreement prior to a conversion.

1	(5) Includes applicable requirements for disconnection,
2	including notice and required payment plan requirements.
3	(6) Mandates registration for a designated agent used by
4	<u>a landlord ratepayer for billing.</u>
5	(7) Has standards for the purchase or lease of equipment
6	for contracts between a landlord ratepayer and a public
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
