## AN ACT

2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10	entitled "An act providing for the licensing of chiropractors and the regulation of the practice of chiropractic; establishing the State Board of Chiropractic in the Department of State and providing for its powers and duties; providing for the supervision of colleges of chiropractic, for the examination of applicants, for enforcement and for disciplinary actions; providing penalties; and making repeals," providing for certified chiropractic assistants; in supportive personnel, further providing for supportive personnel; and making editorial changes.
12	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
13	hereby enacts as follows:
14	Section 1. The act of December 16, 1986 (P.L.1646, No.188),
15	known as the Chiropractic Practice Act, is amended by adding a
16	chapter to read:
17	CHAPTER 5A
18	CERTIFIED CHIROPRACTIC ASSISTANTS
19	Section 5A01. Chiropractic assistant certifications.
20	(a) Eligibility To be eligible for certification by the
21	board as a chiropractic assistant, an applicant shall:

Τ	(1) be at least 18 years of age unless otherwise
2	determined by the board;
3	(2) has proved to the satisfaction of the board that the
4	individual is of good moral character and is not unfit or
5	unable to practice as a chiropractic assistant by reason of
6	physical or mental impairment. In assessing the moral
7	character of an individual with a criminal conviction, the
8	board shall conduct an individualized assessment in
9	accordance with 63 Pa.C.S. § 3113 (relating to consideration
10	of criminal convictions);
11	(3) successfully complete a certified chiropractic
12	assistant program adopted by the board that has been approved
13	for the education and training of certified chiropractic
14	assistants by the appropriate nationally recognized
15	accrediting agency; and
16	(4) successfully pass an examination approved by the
17	board, subject to rules and regulations established by the
18	board and administered in accordance with section 812.1 of
19	the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The
20	Administrative Code of 1929. An applicant may not be
21	certified as a certified chiropractic assistant unless the
22	applicant has attained passing scores on the examination
23	under this paragraph as published prior to the administration
24	of the examination.
25	(b) Temporary certification Upon the submission of an
26	application for certification as a chiropractic assistant as
27	provided by the board, the board shall issue a temporary
28	certificate to the applicant who meets the requirements under
29	subsection (a)(1) and (3) and is eligible to take the
30	examination under subsection (a) (4). The board shall issue only

- 1 one temporary certificate under this subsection to an applicant.
- 2 A temporary certificate under this subsection shall expire upon
- 3 the applicant's failure of the first examination under
- 4 <u>subsection (a)(4), or six months after the date of issuance of</u>
- 5 the temporary certificate, whichever occurs first. Issuance of a
- 6 temporary certificate under this subsection shall permit the
- 7 applicant to engage in the practice of chiropractic assistance
- 8 only while under the direct on-premises supervision of a
- 9 <u>licensed chiropractor</u>. Upon the expiration a temporary
- 10 certificate under this subsection, the applicant shall promptly
- 11 return the temporary certificate to the board.
- 12 (c) Second examination. -- If an applicant fails the first
- 13 <u>examination under subsection (a)(4), the applicant for</u>
- 14 <u>certification shall</u>, <u>after the expiration of 60 days from the</u>
- 15 date of the first examination and no later than one year after
- 16 the first examination, have the opportunity to take the
- 17 examination a second time. The board may adopt regulations
- 18 governing the eligibility of applicants who have failed to pass
- 19 two examinations under subsection (a) (4) in order to be admitted
- 20 to subsequent examinations.
- 21 (d) Use of title. -- Only an individual who has been properly
- 22 certified as a chiropractic assistant with the board, in
- 23 accordance with this chapter and the rules and regulations
- 24 promulgated by the board, shall assist a licensed chiropractor
- 25 in the practice of chiropractic as a certified chiropractic
- 26 assistant and use the title "certified chiropractic assistant"
- 27 and the abbreviation "CCA." Until such time as the board
- 28 promulgates rules and regulations governing the certification of
- 29 <u>chiropractic assistants</u>, an individual who is properly
- 30 registered with the board shall be deemed certified for the

- 1 purposes of this section.
- 2 (e) Actions. -- The board shall issue, renew, revoke or
- 3 suspend the certification of a chiropractic assistant in
- 4 accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the
- 5 board. All actions of the board under this subsection shall be
- 6 taken subject to the right of notice, hearing and adjudication
- 7 and the right of appeal in accordance with 2 Pa.C.S. (relating
- 8 to administrative law and procedure).
- 9 (f) Reinstatement.--Unless ordered by a court of competent
- 10 jurisdiction, the board shall not reinstate the certification of
- 11 an individual to practice as a chiropractic assistant that has
- 12 been revoked under subsection (e). The individual may apply for
- 13 <u>certification as a chiropractic assistant after five years have</u>
- 14 <u>elapsed since the date of revocation in accordance with this</u>
- 15 chapter.
- 16 (g) Renewals. -- For each certificate renewal, a chiropractic
- 17 assistant shall complete within the preceding two-year period at
- 18 least 16 hours of continuing chiropractic education, including
- 19 eight hours of in-person learning, as approved by the board in
- 20 accordance with standards and criteria established by the board
- 21 by rules and regulations. A certified chiropractic assistant
- 22 shall provide the board with evidence of the completion of the
- 23 <u>continuing chiropractic education under this subsection. The</u>
- 24 board's rules and regulations shall remain in effect until such
- 25 <u>time as the board establishes by regulations, standards and</u>
- 26 criteria relating to continuing chiropractic education for
- 27 <u>certified chiropractic assistants.</u>
- 28 Section 5A02. Performance of chiropractic acts and services.
- 29 While providing assistance to a licensed chiropractor, a
- 30 certified chiropractic assistant shall only perform patient-

- 1 related chiropractic acts and services that are assigned or
- 2 <u>delegated</u> by and under the supervision of a licensed
- 3 chiropractor. A certified chiropractic assistant may provide
- 4 therapeutic exercise under the supervision of a licensed
- 5 <u>chiropractor</u>. A certified chiropractic assistant may not perform
- 6 evaluations, adjustments, test interpretations or the planning
- 7 or modification of a plan of care for a patient. A licensed
- 8 <u>chiropractor shall be responsible for the performance of acts</u>
- 9 and services by a certified chiropractic assistant.
- 10 Section 5A03. Supervision of certified chiropractic assistants.
- 11 <u>(a) Supervision.--</u>
- 12 (1) A licensed chiropractor shall provide direct, on-
- premises supervision of a certified chiropractic assistant
- 14 <u>until the certified chiropractic assistant submits</u>
- satisfactory evidence to the board of any of the following:
- 16 (i) The certified chiropractic assistant has at
- 17 least 2,000 hours of experience providing patient-related
- acts and services verified by the supervising
- 19 licensed chiropractor.
- 20 (ii) The certified chiropractic assistant has been
- 21 <u>employed as a certified chiropractic assistant for at</u>
- least three of the prior five years.
- 23 (2) If a certified chiropractic assistant submits
- evidence satisfactory to the board under paragraph (1), a
- 25 licensed chiropractor shall provide direct, on-premises
- 26 supervision of the certified chiropractic assistant for at
- 27 <u>least 50% of the hours worked by the certified chiropractic</u>
- assistant during the calendar week.
- 29 (3) A certified chiropractic assistant shall consult
- 30 with the supervising licensed chiropractor in the event of a

- 1 <u>change in the patient's condition that may require the</u>
- 2 <u>assessment of a licensed chiropractor.</u>
- 3 <u>(4) In all practice settings, the initial patient</u>
- 4 <u>contact shall be made by a licensed chiropractor for</u>
- 5 <u>evaluation of the patient and establishment of a plan of</u>
- 6 <u>care.</u>
- 7 (b) Limitation. -- A licensed chiropractor shall not supervise
- 8 more than three certified chiropractic assistants at any time.
- 9 <u>If there is a change of the licensed chiropractor supervising a</u>
- 10 certified chiropractic assistant, the succeeding licensed
- 11 chiropractor shall be responsible for the ongoing supervision of
- 12 the certified chiropractic assistant and shall be considered the
- 13 supervising licensed chiropractor for the purpose of this
- 14 <u>section</u>.
- 15 (c) Telecommunication. -- A licensed chiropractor shall be
- 16 <u>immediately available by telecommunication if not providing</u>
- 17 direct on-premises supervision.
- 18 (d) Emergency situations.--
- 19 (1) In an emergency situation, including a serious
- 20 illness or death of a family member, which causes the
- 21 <u>unanticipated absence of a supervising licensed chiropractor</u>
- for not more than two days per month, a certified
- 23 chiropractic assistant may continue to render services only
- 24 to the patients for which the certified chiropractic
- assistant has previously participated in the intervention for
- an established plan of care. A certified chiropractic
- 27 assistant may continue to render services under this
- 28 paragraph for a period not to exceed the regularly scheduled
- 29 operational hours of each day the supervising licensed
- 30 chiropractor is absent. A supervising licensed chiropractor

- 1 or certified chiropractic assistant shall make every effort
- 2 <u>to obtain the supervision of care specified under this</u>
- 3 paragraph. A supervising licensed chiropractor may only
- 4 <u>utilize the emergency provisions of this paragraph for no</u>
- 5 more than 10 days per year.
- 6 (2) A supervising licensed chiropractor who experiences
- 7 <u>an unanticipated absence under paragraph (1) shall have all</u>
- 8 <u>of the following duties:</u>
- 9 <u>(i) Maintain a written record noting the date and</u>
- the emergency, which shall be available for board review.
- 11 (ii) Submit a report to the board on a biennial
- basis stating each day the supervising licensed
- chiropractor is absent and the reason for the absence.
- 14 Section 2. The heading of Chapter 6 of the act is amended to
- 15 read:
- 16 CHAPTER 6
- 17 UNLICENSED OR UNCERTIFIED SUPPORTIVE PERSONNEL
- 18 Section 3. Section 601 of the act is amended to read:
- 19 Section 601. Supportive personnel.
- 20 (a) Construction. -- Nothing in this act shall prohibit a
- 21 licensed chiropractor from utilizing the assistance of
- 22 unlicensed or uncertified supportive personnel performing under
- 23 the direct on-premises supervision of a licensed chiropractor or
- 24 <u>certified chiropractic assistant</u>, provided that a chiropractor
- 25 may not delegate any activity or duty to such unlicensed or
- 26 <u>uncertified</u> individuals which requires formal education or
- 27 training in the practice of chiropractic or the knowledge and
- 28 skill of a licensed chiropractor or certified chiropractic
- 29 assistant.
- 30 (b) Definitions.--As used in this section, the term "direct

- 1 <u>on-premises supervision" means supervision conducted while being</u>
- 2 physically present onsite and immediately available for
- 3 <u>direction</u>.
- 4 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
