## AN ACT

Amending Title 62 (Procurement) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in diverse and disadvantaged businesses, further providing for definitions and for woman-owned business, minority-owned business or veteran-owned business and establishing the HUB Zone Business Procurement Program.
The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. The definition of "diverse and disadvantaged
businesses" in section 2201 of Title 62 of the Pennsylvania
Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is amended by
adding definitions to read:
§ 2201. Definitions.
The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
context clearly indicates otherwise:
"Contract-specific goal." A goal established under section
2203 (relating to HUB Zone Business Procurement Program) for use
of HUB zone businesses on a specific procurement.
"Diverse and disadvantaged businesses." A woman-owned

1	business, a minority-owned business $[or]_{L}$ a veteran-owned
2	business <u>or a HUB zone business</u> .
3	"Good faith efforts." The practices or activities instituted
4	by a bidder or offeror to promote and ensure participation by
5	HUB zone businesses in a procurement in order to meet a
6	<u>contract-specific goal.</u>
7	"HUB zone." A historically underutilized business zone.
8	"HUB zone business." A for-profit business located in a HUB
9	zone of this Commonwealth that satisfies the qualification
10	criteria specified at 13 CFR Pt. 126 Subpt. B (relating to
11	requirements to be a certified HUBZone small business concern).
12	"HUB Zone Program." The HUB Zone Business Procurement
13	Program established under section 2203(a).

15	"Utilization schedule." A document, submitted by a bidder or
16	offeror as part of a bid or proposal, in which a bidder or
17	offeror outlines HUB zone business participation for a contract
18	and identifies the dollar value or percentages of the work to be
19	performed.

27	(c) ListsThe department shall compile, maintain and make
28	available source lists of businesses verified by the department
29	as a diverse or disadvantaged business for the purpose of
30	encouraging procurement from those businesses and for the

4	Section 3. Title 62 is amended by adding a section to read:
5	<u>§ 2203. HUB Zone Business Procurement Program.</u>
6	(a) EstablishmentThe HUB Zone Business Procurement
7	Program is established within the department for the purpose of
8	ensuring that executive agencies and independent agencies for
9	which the department acts as purchasing agency enter into
10	contracts with HUB zone businesses as provided under this
11	section. The department shall administer the HUB Zone Program.
12	The department's duties shall include:
13	(1) Formulating, proposing and implementing policy and
14	regulations for the development, implementation and
15	monitoring of the HUB Zone Program.
16	(2) Providing information and assistance to HUB zone
17	businesses relating to the HUB Zone Program, including
18	special training programs for HUB zone businesses to learn
19	how to do business with executive agencies and independent
20	agencies for which the department acts as purchasing agency
21	and serving as a liaison to community, contractors,
22	professionals and supplier groups, associations and
23	organizations.
24	(3) Ensuring that HUB zone businesses are solicited on
25	procurements for which the HUB zone businesses may be suited.
26	(4) Establishing contract-specific goals, in
27	collaboration with the purchasing agency, based upon relevant
28	factors, including the availability of HUB zone businesses to
29	meet the scope of work of the procurement.
30	(5) In collaboration with the purchasing agency,

1	reviewing utilization schedules, considering requests for
2	waivers of contract-specific goals based upon a showing of
3	good faith efforts and evaluating the extent to which
4	contract-specific goals were achieved.
5	(6) Monitoring contracts to evaluate compliance with
6	contract-specific goals and commitments.
7	(7) Receiving, reviewing and acting upon complaints and
8	suggestions concerning the HUB Zone Program.
9	(8) Evaluating the effectiveness and utility of the HUB
10	Zone Program.
11	(b) HUB zone business procurementThe following shall
12	apply:
13	(1) Within six months of the effective date of this
14	paragraph, each executive agency and independent agency for
15	which the department acts as purchasing agency shall
16	establish contract-specific goals that ensure that each
17	contract entered into by the purchasing agency garners:
18	(i) Twenty percent participation from HUB zone
19	businesses on contracts totaling at least \$100,000 and
20	<u>not more than \$750,000.</u>
21	(ii) Twenty percent participation from HUB zone
22	businesses on contracts totaling more than \$750,000.
23	(2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply to contracts:
24	(i) where no qualified HUB zone business exists; or
25	(ii) which have received a waiver under subsection
26	<u>(C)</u>
27	(3) To satisfy requirements under paragraph (1), a
28	purchasing agency may award contracts directly to prime HUB
29	zone business contractors or indirectly to HUB zone business
30	subcontractors.

1	(c) Request for a full or partial waiver and good faith
2	effortsNotwithstanding any provision of this title, bidders
3	or offerors may request a partial or full waiver of a contract-
4	specific goal for HUB zone business participation. A bidder or
5	offeror requesting a partial or full waiver shall submit, in
6	writing, a report detailing efforts to meet the contract-
7	specific goal as required by the solicitation. In reviewing a
8	bidder's or offeror's written request for a partial or full
9	waiver of a contract-specific goal, the purchasing agency, based
10	on the recommendation of the department, shall determine if a
11	bidder or offeror has made good faith efforts to meet the
12	contract-specific goal and to what extent the waiver request
13	should be granted. In determining if a bidder or offeror has
14	made good faith efforts, the purchasing agency and the
15	department may consider levels of participation by HUB zone
16	businesses by other bidders or offerors.
17	(d) ComplianceThe department shall perform compliance
18	reviews and monitor contracts with HUB zone businesses on a
19	monthly basis.
20	(e) Payment verification reportsA purchasing agency shall
21	submit payment verification reports to the department to assist
22	with monitoring compliance and to determine if the prime
23	contractor met the prime contractor's overall contract-specific
24	goal and any subgoals that were established for the contract.
25	Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
