AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), entitled "An 1 act relating to health care; prescribing the powers and 2 duties of the Department of Health; establishing and 3 providing the powers and duties of the State Health Coordinating Council, health systems agencies and Health Care Policy Board in the Department of Health, and State Health 6 Facility Hearing Board in the Department of Justice; 7 providing for certification of need of health care providers 8 and prescribing penalties," in licensing of health care facilities, providing for surgical smoke evacuation systems. 10 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 12 hereby enacts as follows: 13 Section 1. The act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known 14 as the Health Care Facilities Act, is amended by adding a 15 section to read: Section 809.3. Surgical smoke evacuation systems. 16 17 (a) General rule. -- On or before January 1, 2025, an 18 ambulatory surgical facility or hospital shall adopt and
- 20 the use of a smoke evacuation system for each procedure that

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- 1 (b) Compliance. -- The department shall ensure compliance with
- 2 this section during any on-site inspection and in response to
- 3 any complaint received relating to a violation of this section.
- 4 (c) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 5 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 6 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 7 "Smoke evacuation system." Smoke evacuation equipment and
- 8 technologies designed to capture, filter and remove surgical
- 9 smoke at the site of origin and to prevent surgical smoke from
- 10 making ocular contact or contact with the respiratory tract of
- 11 an individual.
- 12 "Surgical smoke." The surgical plume that is generated from
- 13 the use of an energy-generating surgical device. The term
- 14 includes smoke plume, bio-aerosols, laser-generated airborne
- 15 contaminants and lung damaging dust.
- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
