9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. Section 1.1 of the act of November 24, 2004
11	(P.L.1270, No.153), referred to as the Pennsylvania Amber Alert
12	System Law, is amended to read:
13	Section 1.1. Duties of Pennsylvania State Police.
14	(a) Protocols and proceduresThe Pennsylvania State Police
15	shall establish such protocols and procedures as are necessary
16	for the effective operation of each system and shall educate
17	and inform local law enforcement agencies and the public with
18	regard to the availability of each system.
19	(b) Particularly vulnerable childrenThis subsection shall

1	apply to particularly vulnerable children. If a parent or family
2	member reports that a child of the parent or family member has
3	been abducted by a nonparent or nonfamily member, there shall be
4	a presumption, absent immediately available clear evidence to
5	the contrary, that the child is in imminent danger of serious
6	bodily injury or death and the Missing Endangered Person
7	Advisory System shall be immediately activated without
8	additional investigation prior to activation of the Pennsylvania
9	Amber Alert System. This provision shall be known as the "Nalani
10	Johnson Rule" to protect this Commonwealth's particularly
11	vulnerable children from harm.
12	(c) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
13	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
14	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
15	"Family member." A grandparent, aunt, uncle or adult sibling
16	of a particularly vulnerable child.
17	"Particularly vulnerable child." A child under 13 years of
18	age.
19	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
