6	Section 1. Section 3132 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
7	Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding subsections to read:
8	§ 3132. Female mutilation.

10	(d.1) Additional penaltyIn addition to any other penalty
11	provided by law, the professional license of a physician found
12	guilty of an offense under this section shall be permanently
13	revoked upon conviction.
14	(d.2) Civil actionThe following shall apply:
15	(1) In addition to any other cause of action provided
16	under law, an individual who is a victim of female mutilation
17	may bring a civil action against any person that participated
18	in the female mutilation of the individual in the court of
19	common pleas of the county where the individual resides or

1	where any of the alleged violations of this section occurred.
2	(2) Notwithstanding any other law, an individual shall
3	bring a civil action under paragraph (1) within six years.
4	(d.3) Education and outreachThe following shall apply:
5	(1) The Department of Health shall develop educational
6	training and outreach opportunities regarding female
7	mutilation for at-risk communities, as determined by the
8	Department of Health.
9	(2) The educational training developed under paragraph
10	(1) shall assist the following professionals to identify and
11	address female mutilation:
12	(i) Law enforcement officers.
13	(ii) Social workers.
14	<u>(iii) Teachers.</u>
15	(iv) Guidance counselors.
16	(v) Any other individual identified by the
17	Department of Health.

19	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
