AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 5 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and 17 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 18 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 19 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," in Independent Fiscal Office, further providing 21 22 for revenue estimates. 23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 24 hereby enacts as follows: 25 Section 1. Section 605-B(e) of the act of April 9, 1929 26 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929,

amended June 28, 2019 (P.L.101, No.15), is amended to read:

(e) Proposed change in law. --

change in law affecting revenues and receipts, including increases in regulatory fees, proposed or considered as part of the annual State budget. If the proposed change in law will have a fiscal impact in excess of [\$10,000,000] \$25,000,000 \$50,000,000 in any fiscal year, the estimate shall be prepared on the basis of assumptions that estimate the probable behavioral responses of taxpayers, businesses and other persons to the proposed changes and shall include a statement identifying those assumptions. The information may be used to revise the revenue estimate under subsection (a.1).

(2) The office shall prepare, if requested by an officer listed in section 615-B(a), a revenue estimate of any change in law affecting revenues and receipts, including increases in regulatory fees, that may be expected to carry a fiscal impact in excess of \$25,000,000 \$50,000,000 in any fiscal <-year, proposed or considered as part of a bill or amendment in either house of the General Assembly. If the proposed change in law will have a fiscal impact in excess of \$25,000,000 \$50,000,000 in any fiscal year, the estimate <-shall be prepared on the basis of assumptions that consider the probable behavioral responses of taxpayers, businesses and other persons and any potential dynamic or macroeconomic impacts in response to the proposed changes and shall include a statement identifying those assumptions. The information may be used to revise the revenue estimate under subsection
