AN ACT

- Providing for continuing education in Lyme disease and related tick-borne diseases for health care professionals.
- 3 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- (1) In the last six years, this Commonwealth ranked highest in the country in the number of confirmed cases of
- 6 Lyme disease and in 2016, reported 12,200 new cases of Lyme
- 7 disease.
- 8 (2) The Department of Environmental Protection published 9 a study in 2015 that confirmed a high risk of Lyme disease in 10 every county of this Commonwealth and found all 67 counties 11 had the blacklegged tick.
- 12 (3) The early clinical diagnosis and appropriate
- treatment of these tick-borne disorders and diseases can
- greatly reduce the risks of continued, diverse and chronic
- symptoms that can affect every system and organ of the human
- 16 body and often every aspect of an individual's life.
- 17 (4) Approximately 10% to 40% of Lyme disease patients

- 1 may go on to suffer from a complex, chronic disease which is
- 2 much more difficult to treat.
- 3 (5) There are multiple diagnostic and treatment
- 4 guidelines for diagnosis and treatment of Lyme disease and
- 5 tick-borne illness.
- 6 (6) Residents of this Commonwealth should be aware of
- 7 early disseminated and persistent symptoms and should know
- 8 that a negative Lyme test cannot rule out Lyme disease.
- 9 (7) Scientific understanding of these complex tick-borne
- 10 illnesses is expected to evolve rapidly in the next decade,
- including diagnosis and treatment options.
- 12 (8) The high burden of tick-borne diseases in this
- 13 Commonwealth requires an urgent and ongoing response. Health
- care practitioner education is a specific strategy
- 15 recommended.
- 16 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 17 hereby enacts as follows:
- 18 Section 1. Short title.
- 19 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Lyme Disease
- 20 and Related Tick-Borne Disease Continuing Education Act.
- 21 Section 2. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 23 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 24 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 25 "Licensee." A physician, physician assistant or nurse
- 26 practitioner.
- 27 "Licensing board." The State Board of Medicine or the State
- 28 Board of Nursing.
- 29 "Lyme disease." Signs or symptoms compatible with acute,
- 30 late-stage, persistent infection with Borrelia burgdorferi or

- 1 complications related to the infection or with other strains of
- 2 Borrelia, including, but not limited to, B. miyamotoi, B.
- 3 mayonii, B. garinii and B. afzelii, that are recognized by the
- 4 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as a cause of Lyme
- 5 disease. The term includes infection that meets the surveillance
- 6 criteria established by the Centers for Disease Control and
- 7 Prevention and other acute and persistent manifestations of the
- 8 infection as determined by a health care practitioner.
- 9 "Related tick-borne disease." The presence of signs or
- 10 symptoms compatible with infection with bartonella,
- 11 babesiosis/piroplasmosis, anaplasmosis, ehrlichiosis, Rocky
- 12 Mountain spotted fever, rickettsiosis, Powassan or other tick-
- 13 transmissible illness or complications related to the
- 14 infections. The term does not include Lyme disease.
- 15 Section 3. Continuing education requirement.
- 16 (a) General rule. -- A licensing board shall require that a
- 17 licensee complete at least two hours of continuing education in
- 18 the assessment and diagnosis of and treatment options for Lyme
- 19 disease and other related tick-borne diseases as a portion of
- 20 the total continuing education required for license renewal.
- 21 (b) Content.--A licensing board shall establish the content
- 22 of continuing medical education required under this section. The
- 23 content shall address, at a minimum, the most current, evidence-
- 24 based research on tick data/pathogens Statewide, patient profile
- 25 and symptom presentation in regards to assessment and diagnosis,
- 26 current diagnostic options and current treatment options and
- 27 prevention.
- 28 (c) Input.--In establishing the content required for
- 29 continuing medical education required under this section, the
- 30 licensing board shall seek input from persons with knowledge

- 1 about Lyme disease or related tick-borne diseases, including,
- 2 but not limited to, universities involved in the research of
- 3 Lyme disease and related tick-borne diseases. To ensure quality
- 4 and balanced medical education, the licensing board shall take
- 5 into consideration the philosophies of the Centers for Disease
- 6 Control and Prevention, the guidelines established by the
- 7 National Institutes of Health, International Lyme and Associated
- 8 Diseases Society and the Infectious Diseases Society of America,
- 9 as well as the latest scientific evidence and research.
- 10 Section 4. Construction.
- 11 Nothing in this act shall be construed to provide treatment
- 12 recommendations for Lyme disease or related tick-borne disease.
- 13 Section 5. Regulations.
- 14 The licensing board shall promulgate regulations necessary to
- 15 effectuate this act no later than 18 months from the effective
- 16 date of this section.
- 17 Section 6. Expiration.
- This act shall expire December 31, 2023.
- 19 Section 7. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect immediately.
