1 2 3	Amending Title 3 (Agriculture) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for the Agriculture Innovation Grant Program; and promulgating regulations.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:

- 6 <u>This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the</u>
- 7 Agriculture Innovation Grant Program.
- 8 <u>§ 11002. Purpose.</u>
- 9 It is the intent of the General Assembly to offer
- 10 reimbursement grants to promote and support agricultural
- 11 innovation to ensure the competitiveness, resiliency,
- 12 environmental stewardship and vitality of farms and
- 13 agribusinesses in this Commonwealth. Grants will assist

14 producers of agricultural commodities, agriculture service

- 15 providers, cooperatives, packers and processors in the
- 16 implementation of innovation that increases efficiency,
- 17 <u>encourages sustainable practices, utilizes renewable energy or</u>
- 18 <u>sequesters carbon.</u>
- 19 <u>§ 11003. Definitions.</u>
- 20 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter

21 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

- 22 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 23 "Agricultural commodity." As defined in the act of June 10,
- 24 1982 (P.L.454, No.133), referred to as the Right-to-Farm Law.
- 25 "Board." The Agriculture Innovation Board established under
- 26 <u>section 11005 (relating to board membership)</u>.
- 27 <u>"Commission." The State Conservation Commission.</u>
- 28 <u>"Cooperative association." Any cooperative marketing</u>
- 29 association of producers which the Secretary of Agriculture
- 30 determines, after application by the cooperative association,

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1 <u>to:</u>

2	(1) be qualified under the provisions of the Cooperative
3	Marketing Association Act (42 Stat. 388, 7 U.S.C. §§ 291 and
4	292) and organized as a cooperative agricultural association
5	under the laws of this Commonwealth and any other state; and
6	(2) have full authority in the sale of affected
7	agricultural commodity of its members and to be engaged in
8	making collective sales of or marketing the commodity or its
9	products for its members.
10	"Department." The Department of Agriculture of the
11	Commonwealth.
12	"Eligible applicant." An applicant that meets one of the
13	following criteria:
14	(1) A person who grows an agricultural commodity and who
15	has anticipated sales greater than \$2,000 a year.
16	(2) A person who provides technical assistance or
17	services to farmers for conservation, engineering, plant
18	inspection, crop protection, soil amendments, nutrient
19	management and similar services.
20	(3) A person or cooperative association that utilizes
21	agricultural commodities to create products or energy.
22	"Innovation." The practical implementation of ideas that
23	result in new products, processes or services.
24	"Lending institution." As defined under section 603
25	(relating to definitions).
26	"Person." An individual, partnership, association, firm,
27	corporation or any other legal entity.
28	"Program." The Agriculture Innovation Grant Program
29	established under section 11004 (relating to Agriculture
30	Innovation Grant Program).

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1	<u>§ 11004. Agriculture Innovation Grant Program.</u>
2	The Agriculture Innovation Grant Program is established
3	within the department. The program shall be administered by the
4	department, in consultation with the commission and the board,
5	to provide reimbursement grants to eligible applications for
6	costs associated with one or more of the following:
7	(1) Utilization of innovation to improve energy
8	efficiency, improve water quality, reduce water consumption,
9	reduce odors or address solid waste concerns.
10	(2) Increased processing of agricultural commodities
11	that sequester carbon into durable goods.
12	(3) Technology that produces energy from agricultural
13	sources, including manure, food waste or biomass.
14	(4) Technology that reduces the amount of greenhouse
15	gases used or emitted by farms.
16	(5) Equipment that provides low-carbon or no-carbon
17	energy sources from agriculture commodities.
18	(6) Technology that assists eligible applicants with the
19	management of their farms, including diagnostic tools and
20	services.
21	(7) Technology that assists a packer, processor or
22	cooperative in the sorting, grading or production of
23	agricultural commodities more efficiently.
24	(8) Innovations that improve biosecurity or health of
25	plants and animals.
26	(9) Innovations that support cybersecurity or data
27	analytics.
28	<u>§ 11005. Board membership.</u>
29	The Agriculture Innovation Board is established and shall
30	consist of the following members, with a majority of members
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1	constituting a quorum:
2	(1) The Secretary of Agriculture or a designee, who
3	<u>shall serve as chairperson.</u>
4	(2) The Secretary of Community and Economic Development,
5	<u>or a designee.</u>
6	(3) The Executive Director of the State Conservation
7	<u>Commission or a designee.</u>
8	(4) A representative of a higher educational facility
9	located in this Commonwealth.
10	(5) A board member of a rural electric cooperative
11	located in this Commonwealth.
12	(6) A member of a cooperative association located in
13	this Commonwealth.
14	(7) An employee of a lending institution located in this
15	Commonwealth.
16	(8) A person or an employee of a person engaged in the
17	production or processing of an agricultural commodity in this
18	Commonwealth.
19	(9) An employee of a conservation organization doing
20	work in this Commonwealth.
21	<u>§ 11006. Grant funds and eligibility.</u>
22	(a) Planning project grantAn eligible applicant may apply
23	for a grant for a project focused on developing strategic plans
24	to improve agricultural practices, technologies, operations or
25	approaches within a specific business, geographic area or
26	network, to which the following shall apply:
27	(1) The amount of a grant shall be no less than \$7,500
28	and no more than \$50,000.
29	(2) A grantee must use non-State sourced matching funds
30	equal to at least 30% of the grant amount for the project.
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1	(b) On-farm project grantAn eligible applicant may apply
2	for a grant for a project that focuses on implementing
3	practices, technologies or approaches on an individual farm or
4	property producing an agricultural commodity, to which the
5	following shall apply:
6	(1) The amount of the grant shall be no less than \$5,000
7	and no more than \$200,000.
8	(2) A grantee must use non-State sourced matching funds
9	equal to at least 50% of the grant amount for the project.
10	(c) Regional impact project grantAn eligible applicant
11	may apply for a grant for a project designed to address
12	challenges, promote efficiencies or achieve specific goals for
13	multiple eligible applicants, to which the following shall
14	apply:
15	(1) The amount of the grant shall be no less than
16	<u>\$100,000 and no more than \$2,000,000.</u>
17	(2) The grantee must use non-State sourced matching
18	funds equal to at least 50% of the grant amount for the
19	project.
20	(3) The project must impact two or more persons or
21	businesses or be a cooperative association that grows,
22	harvests, processes, packs or manages agricultural
23	commodities.
24	<u>§ 11007. Funding.</u>
25	The department shall accept funds from the following sources:
26	(1) Money appropriated to the department for the
27	purposes of this chapter.
28	(2) Gifts or donations of money, securities or other
29	personal property except real estate, which, or the income of
30	which, shall be used to carry out the purposes of this

2	§ 11008. Limitation of grants.
3	(a) LimitationA grant under section 11006 (relating to
4	grant funds and eligibility) may only be awarded to the extent
5	money is appropriated by the General Assembly or provided by
6	<u>other sources.</u>
7	(b) Approval of grantThe board may approve a grant that
8	is less than the requested amount.
9	(c) ConditionsThe department may impose restrictions or
10	special conditions upon issuance of a grant.
11	(d) Reimbursement grants
12	(1) A grant awarded under section 11006 shall be a
13	reimbursement grant. The amount of reimbursement shall be
14	based on actual eligible costs submitted by an approved
15	applicant for an approved project during any fiscal year in
16	which grants are offered.
17	(2) Grant money shall not be used to reimburse any
18	portion of an in-kind contribution to an eligible project.
19	(3) Grant money may not be used to pay or reimburse
20	wages or salaries of grant recipient staff.
21	(4) Grant money may not be used to reimburse any portion
22	of project costs that are paid or reimbursed under another
23	<u>Federal or State grant program.</u>
24	(e) Cap on grantsA single eligible applicant may not be
25	awarded more than \$2,000,000 in a one-year period, calculated
26	from the date on which the department awards the initial grant.
27	<u>§ 11009. Applications.</u>
28	(a) SubmissionApplications for grants shall be submitted
29	in a manner and on a form as prescribed by the department.
30	(b) EvaluationThe board shall meet at least twice each

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1	year to evaluate and award grants to eligible applicants based
2	on the following application criteria:
3	(1) The ability of the applicant to complete the
4	project.
5	(2) The ability of the applicant to incorporate one or
6	more of the innovations under section 11004 (relating to
7	Agriculture Innovation Grant Program).
8	(3) How the project fulfills one or more of the
9	innovations under section 11004.
10	(4) The number of jobs created or retained due to the
11	project.
12	(5) The ability of the applicant to sustain the project.
13	(6) Any other criteria as determined by the department.
