10	Section 1. The act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known
11	as the Workers' Compensation Act, is amended by adding a section
12	to read:
13	Section 452. (a) The department shall create an addendum
14	for each form that may be used, referenced or relied on to
15	suspend or terminate benefits under this act that includes the
16	following in Spanish and any other language determined by the
17	<u>department to be in significant use:</u>
18	(1) An explanation that important rights under this act may
19	be impacted by inaction and that translation services are
20	available.

- 1 (2) Contact information for translation services, including
- 2 <u>a toll-free telephone number, email address, mailing address or</u>
- 3 other relevant information.
- 4 (b) If an employe is a non-native English speaker and
- 5 interpreter fees or translation fees were required during
- 6 litigation and if the decision of the referee is in favor of the
- 7 <u>employe</u>, the employer shall reimburse the employe for the costs
- 8 of interpreter fees or translation fees as a cost of the
- 9 <u>litigation.</u>
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
