13	regulations shall not be subject to:

16	Documents Law.
17	(2) Section 204(b) of the act of October 15, 1980
18	(P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth Attorneys Act.

3 (b) Expiration.--Temporary regulations promulgated under

4 this section shall expire no later than three years following

- 5 the publication of the temporary regulations in the Pennsylvania
- 6 Bulletin. Regulations adopted after expiration of temporary
- 7 regulations promulgated under this section shall be promulgated
- 8 as provided by law.
- 9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
