AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
- 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in particular rights and
- immunities, providing for protected business operations.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 8340.4. Protected business operations.
- 9 (a) General rule. -- Except as set forth in subsection (b), a
- 10 person is immune from civil and criminal liability and from
- 11 imposition of an administrative sanction, including any
- 12 liability or sanction imposed by a professional or occupational
- 13 <u>licensing board or commission, for engaging in a protected</u>
- 14 <u>business operation</u>.
- 15 (b) Exception. -- Subsection (a) does not apply to a liability
- 16 arising from, or an imposition based upon, the person causing
- 17 <u>actual harm.</u>
- 18 (c) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following

- 1 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 2 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 3 "Actual harm." A documented injury or illness that is
- 4 directly and proximately caused by the interaction with the
- 5 person or the agents of the person.
- 6 <u>"Protected business operation."</u> Any of the following during
- 7 <u>a declared disaster emergency made under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c)</u>
- 8 (relating to general authority of Governor) or after an order is
- 9 <u>issued under the act of April 23, 1956 (1955 P.L.1510, No.500),</u>
- 10 known as the Disease Prevention and Control Law of 1955:
- 11 (1) Conducting a business transaction.
- 12 (2) Keeping a physical business location open.
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
