AN ACT

Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled 1 "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, 2 special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, 3 primary and election expenses and election contests; creating 4 and defining membership of county boards of elections; 5 imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, 6 courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and 7 8 9 repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to 10 elections," in nomination of candidates, further providing 11 for nomination petitions to be filed. 12 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 hereby enacts as follows: 15 Section 1. Section 907 of the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, 16 No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code, is amended to 17 read: 18 Section 907. Nomination Petitions to Be Filed.--[The] (a) Except as provided under subsection (b), the names of candidates 19 20 for nomination as President of the United States, and the names 21 of all other candidates for party nominations, and for election as delegates, alternate delegates, members of committees and 22 23 other party officers, shall be printed upon the official primary

ballots or ballot labels of a designated party, upon the filing 1 2 of separate nomination petitions in their behalf, in form 3 prescribed by the Secretary of the Commonwealth, signed by duly registered and enrolled members of such party who are qualified 4 electors of the State, or of the political district, as the case 5 6 may be, within which the nomination is to be made or election is to be held. Nomination petitions of delegates and alternate 7 8 delegates to National conventions committed to support a particular presidential candidate must be signed by the 9 10 particular presidential candidate to whom support is pledged 11 before it can be certified by the Secretary of the Commonwealth. The name of no candidate shall be placed upon the official 12 ballots or ballot labels of a political party to be used at any 13 14 primary, unless such petition shall have been filed in his 15 behalf. In no event shall any person's name be printed upon the 16 official ballots or ballot labels of any party for the office of delegate, alternate delegate, member of committee or other party 17 18 officer, unless he is a duly registered and enrolled member of 19 said party.

20 (b) The names of candidates that are serving as magisterial district judges and that are seeking party nomination shall be 21 printed upon the official primary ballots or ballot labels of 22 23 all parties eligible to hold a primary, upon the filing of a 24 declaration of candidacy and candidate affidavit, both in a form prescribed by the Secretary of the Commonwealth, if the 25 26 magisterial district judge was elected to the office he holds at the time of filing the declaration of candidacy and candidate 27 28 affidavit. The declaration of candidacy and candidate affidavit 29 shall be filed with the office of the board of elections of the county in which the magisterial district lies and shall be filed 30

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- 1 no later than January 15 of the year in which the term of office
- 2 <u>expires.</u>
- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
