AN ACT

- Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in the Adjutant General, further providing for appointment of Adjutant General, deputies and assistants and for general powers and duties of Adjutant General; in State Veterans' Commission and Deputy Adjutant General for Veterans' Affairs, further providing for State 6 Veterans' Commission, for Deputy Adjutant General for 7 Veterans' Affairs, for qualifications and status, for specific duties and for accreditation; in veterans' 9 organizations, further providing for grants to veterans' 10 service officer programs; and making editorial changes. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 13 14 Section 1. Sections 901(a) and 902 introductory paragraph 15 and (12), Chapter 17 heading, section 1702(b)(1) and (2) introductory paragraph, (c) and (e), Subchapter B heading of 16 17 Chapter 17 and sections 1711, 1712, 1731(c)(5)(i) and (d) 18 introductory paragraph and 9304(h) introductory paragraph and 19 (j) of Title 51 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are 20 amended to read:
- 21 § 901. Appointment of Adjutant General, deputies and

- 1 assistants.
- 2 (a) Appointment. -- The Governor shall appoint the Adjutant
- 3 General with the advice and consent of the Senate. The Adjutant
- 4 General may appoint a Deputy Adjutant General for Army and a
- 5 Deputy Adjutant General for Air, and such other Deputy
- 6 <u>Secretaries</u>, Deputy Adjutants General and Assistant Adjutants
- 7 General as in [his] the Adjutant General's discretion are needed
- 8 for the efficient functioning of the department. The positions
- 9 of Assistant Adjutant General, Army, and Assistant Adjutant
- 10 General, Air, in the grades of brigadier general or major
- 11 general, shall be authorized. Deputy Adjutants General and such
- 12 additional Assistant Adjutants General as may be required may
- 13 also have at least the rank of brigadier general in the
- 14 Pennsylvania National Guard or Pennsylvania Guard after
- 15 appointment.

- 17 § 902. General powers and duties of Adjutant General.
- 18 The Adjutant General as head of the department is responsible
- 19 to the Commonwealth and to the Governor for the organization and
- 20 functioning of said department, and the performance and carrying
- 21 out of all the duties, powers and responsibilities given or
- 22 delegated. In addition [he] the Adjutant General is hereby
- 23 authorized and directed to:

- 25 (12) Appoint a Deputy [Adjutant General] <u>Secretary</u> for
- 26 Veterans' Affairs, who shall serve as the Director of the
- 27 Bureau for Veterans' Affairs.

1 AND DEPUTY [ADJUTANT GENERAL] SECRETARY 2 FOR VETERANS' AFFAIRS § 1702. State Veterans' Commission. 3 4 * * * (b) Composition. -- The commission shall be composed of: 5 6 The Adjutant General, ex officio, or [his] a_ 7 designee. 8 The State commander, commandant or head, or [his] a_ 9 designee, of each of the following named veterans' 10 organizations: * * * 11 12 (c) Officers. -- The commission shall annually elect a 13 [chairman] chairperson and vice [chairman] chairperson at the 14 first meeting of the commission after October 1. The Deputy [Adjutant General] Secretary for Veterans' Affairs shall serve 15 16 as the executive secretary to the commission. 17 18 (e) Meetings and quorum. -- The commission shall meet upon the 19 call of the [chairman] chairperson or the Adjutant General. Nine 20 members of the commission shall constitute a quorum. * * * 21 22 SUBCHAPTER B 23 DEPUTY [ADJUTANT GENERAL] SECRETARY 24 FOR VETERANS' AFFAIRS 25 § 1711. Oualifications and status. 26 Deputy [Adjutants General] Secretary. -- In addition to such other Deputy Adjutants General as may be named in the 27 28 department, there shall be a Deputy [Adjutant General] Secretary 29 for Veterans' Affairs, who shall perform the duties under section 1712 (relating to specific duties) and such other duties 30

- 1 as the Adjutant General may assign.
- 2 [(b) Appointment. -- The Deputy Adjutant General for Veterans'
- 3 Affairs shall be selected and appointed as other Deputy
- 4 Adjutants General are selected and appointed. He shall be a
- 5 veteran and an active member of at least one of the veterans'
- 6 organizations listed under section 1702(b) (relating to State
- 7 Veterans' Commission).]
- 8 (b) Appointment. -- The Deputy Secretary for Veterans' Affairs
- 9 shall be selected and appointed by the Adjutant General. To be
- 10 eligible for appointment under this subsection, the individual
- 11 <u>must:</u>
- 12 (1) Be a veteran of the armed forces of the United
- 13 <u>States, which shall include the National Guard of any state</u>
- or territory of the United States and other reserve
- components of the United States military.
- 16 (2) Have demonstrated, to the satisfaction of the
- 17 Adjutant General, successful executive leadership in an
- 18 organization.
- 19 (3) Have attained the necessary educational requirements
- 20 to fulfill the requirements of the position as determined by
- 21 the Adjutant General.
- 22 (4) Have experience with services and benefits for
- 23 veterans or experience working in a nonprofit setting
- 24 providing outreach services or long-term care.
- 25 (5) Have any other qualifications as the Adjutant
- General may deem necessary to fulfill the duties outlined in
- section 1712 (relating to specific duties).
- 28 (c) Compensation. -- The compensation of the Deputy [Adjutant
- 29 General | Secretary for Veterans' Affairs shall be as established
- 30 by law.

- 1 [(d) Status. -- The Deputy Adjutant General for Veterans'
- 2 Affairs shall be accorded all the rights, emoluments and
- 3 privileges, except pay and allowances, of a brigadier general in
- 4 the Pennsylvania Guard and shall be addressed as "General."]
- 5 § 1712. Specific duties.
- In addition to such other duties as may be provided by law or
- 7 as assigned by the Adjutant General, the Deputy [Adjutant
- 8 General] <u>Secretary</u> for Veterans' Affairs shall have the
- 9 following specific duties:
- 10 (1) To recommend to the Adjutant General and the
- 11 Governor, with the advice of the State Veterans' Commission,
- new legislation and amendments to existing statutes
- 13 concerning veterans and their activities for consideration by
- 14 the General Assembly.
- 15 (2) To cooperate with all Federal and State departments
- and agencies in the interest of veterans.
- 17 (3) To aid in filing and prosecuting claims of
- Pennsylvania's veterans and their dependents under Federal or
- 19 State laws or regulations.
- 20 (4) To aid veterans in seeking employment or
- 21 reemployment after their honorable discharge from the armed
- forces of the United States.
- 23 (5) To aid veterans requiring medical care in securing
- hospitalization provided by a Federal or State medical or
- 25 care facility.
- 26 (6) To aid in the rehabilitation of injured, wounded or
- 27 compensable veterans in educational institutions or
- vocational training institutions for which they may be
- 29 eligible by law.
- 30 (7) To cooperate with and advise the Department of

- Education with respect to vocational training programs for veterans, particularly programs suited to casualties.
 - (8) To administer relief provided by the Commonwealth for veterans and their dependents.
 - (9) To administer the distribution under the direction of the Adjutant General of any compensation to veterans or their dependents that has been or may be granted by the Commonwealth.
 - (10) To investigate the work of other State agencies in administering laws affecting veterans and their dependents.
 - (11) To investigate, compile and maintain complete and accurate data concerning veterans of the armed forces of the United States and all State and municipal activities related thereto.
 - various counties of this Commonwealth a record of the burial places in this Commonwealth of deceased veterans, including such information as the Deputy [Adjutant General] Secretary for Veterans' Affairs or [his] a designee deems necessary and appropriate.
 - (13) To disseminate information concerning

 Pennsylvania's veterans and Pennsylvania's veterans' programs
 to veterans' organizations, to the public press and other

 media and to the general public.
- 25 (14) To biannually submit, through the Adjutant General, 26 to the Governor a report of State activities on behalf of 27 veterans.
- 28 (15) To serve as a clearinghouse for all problems or 29 issues related to Pennsylvania's veterans and their 30 dependents.

- 2 Veterans' Commission.
- 3 § 1731. Accreditation.
- 4 * * *
- 5 (c) Additional duties. -- In addition to the duties provided
- 6 for under a statute other than this title, a director of
- 7 veterans affairs shall do all of the following:
- 8 * * *
- 9 (5) Participate in programs provided by the department,
- 10 including:
- 11 (i) Annual training and refresher courses provided
- by the Office of the Deputy [Adjutant General] <u>Secretary</u>
- for Veterans' Affairs.

- 15 (d) Office duties. -- The Office of the Deputy [Adjutant
- 16 General] <u>Secretary</u> for Veterans' Affairs shall establish a
- 17 county director of veterans affairs training program, agreed
- 18 upon with the State Association of County Directors of Veterans
- 19 Affairs, which shall include the following:

- 23 (h) Reporting requirements. -- On or before October 1 of each
- 24 year, designated veterans' service organizations participating
- 25 in the program established by this section shall file a written
- 26 report with the Adjutant General and the Deputy [Adjutant
- 27 General] <u>Secretary</u> for Veterans' Affairs and send copies to the
- 28 [chairman] chairperson and minority [chairman] chairperson of
- 29 the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the

- paragraph.
- 27 (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect
- 28 immediately.
