## AN ACT

Amending Title 65 (Public Officers) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in open meetings, further providing 2 for definitions, for minutes of meetings, public records and 3 recording of meetings, for public participation and for use 4 of equipment during meetings. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 7 hereby enacts as follows: 8 Section 1. The definition of "public notice" in section 703 of Title 65 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is amended by adding a definition to read: 10 11 § 703. Definitions. 12 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter 13 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 14 \* \* \* 15 16 "Authorized telecommunications device." A device which 17 permits, at a minimum, audio communication between individuals. 18 "Public notice." 19 20 (1) For a meeting:

1 (i)Publication of notice of the place, date [and], 2 time, method of broadcast and acceptance of remote public 3 comment, if applicable, of a meeting in a newspaper of general circulation, as defined by 45 Pa.C.S. § 101 4 5 (relating to definitions), which is published and circulated in the political subdivision where the meeting 6 7 will be held, or in a newspaper of general circulation 8 which has a bona fide paid circulation in the political subdivision equal to or greater than any newspaper 9

- (ii) Posting a notice of the place, date [and], time, method of broadcast and acceptance of remote public comment, if applicable, of a meeting prominently at the principal office of the agency holding the meeting or at the public building in which the meeting is to be held.
- (iii) Giving notice to parties under section 709(c) (relating to public notice).

	(2) A rule under this subsection may include:
	(i) A requirement that an individual seeking to
	offer public comment must demonstrate that the individual

	(ii) A process to allow an individual seeking to be
	recognized for remote public comment to be placed on a
	<u>list or in a virtual queue.</u>
	(iii) A contingency plan to allow remote public
	comment to be received during a meeting by telephone
	audible throughout the meeting location by amplification
	<pre>only if:</pre>
	(A) the advertised authorized telecommunications
	device is unable to be utilized by the political
	subdivision or authority during the meeting because
	of an Internet service outage or other technological
	failure impacting the device's operation at the
	meeting location; and
	(B) a notice placed on the posted meeting agenda

1	provides contact information for the telephone.
2	(3) Nothing in this section shall be construed to
3	authorize the acceptance of written comments through a social
4	media platform, email or web platform as a substitute for
5	<pre>public comment under section 710.1.</pre>
6	Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
