## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in emergency management services, providing for counterterrorism planning, preparedness and response; in emergency management assistance compact, providing for construction; and making a related repeal.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
9	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

4 <u>This chapter relates to counterterrorism planning</u>,

5 preparedness and response.

6 <u>§ 7202. Definitions.</u>

7 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter

8 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

9 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>

10 "Disaster medical assistance team." A complement of

11 individuals organized in accordance with standards developed by

12 the agency and applicable Federal agencies to provide medical

13 service at the scene of disasters and mass casualty incidents.

14 "Disaster mortuary response team." A complement of

15 individuals organized in accordance with standards developed by

16 the agency and applicable Federal agencies to provide mortuary

17 service at the scene of disasters and mass casualty incidents.

18 "FEMA." The Federal Emergency Management Agency.

19 "Letter of agreement." A written agreement between a

20 regional counterterrorism task force and a public, semipublic,

21 private or nonprofit corporation, business, association,

22 partnership, authority, individual or other entity that provides

23 <u>for:</u>

24 (1) Personnel, equipment, supplies, training facilities

25 <u>or other resources either directly to or in support of the</u>

26 <u>task force's specialized regional counterterrorism response</u>

27 <u>team.</u>

28 (2) Workers' compensation and death benefits.

29 (3) Use of county 911 communications centers, county

30 <u>emergency management agencies or the State emergency</u>

A city, borough, incorporated 4 5 town, township or home rule municipality of this Commonwealth. "Mutual aid." A county's, municipality's or volunteer 6 7 service organization's affirmative act of sending its personnel, 8 equipment or resources to the scene of an actual or potential disaster, whether inside or outside the boundaries of this 9 10 Commonwealth, in response to an official dispatch request from a county 911 communications center, county emergency management 11 12 agency or the State emergency operations center. "Mutual aid agreement." A written agreement between a 13 14 regional counterterrorism task force and a county, municipality or volunteer service organization that provides for: 15 (1) The county, municipality or volunteer service 16 organization to provide personnel, equipment or other 17 18 resources in response to an actual or potential disaster. 19 (2) Workers' compensation and death benefits. (3) Use of county 911 communications centers, county 20 emergency management agencies or the State emergency 21 operations center. 22 23 (4) Member participation in training exercises, drills 24 and actual activation and deployment. "Regional counterterrorism task force." A complement of 25 26 Federal, State, county and municipal emergency management, health, law enforcement, public safety and other officials and 27 28 representatives from volunteer service organizations, private 29 business and industry, hospitals and medical care facilities and other entities within a multicounty area as determined by the 30

4	complement of individuals established by a regional
5	counterterrorism task force and organized in accordance with
6	standards developed by the agency and applicable Federal

8	potential disaster. The term includes a disaster medical
9	assistance team and disaster mortuary response team.
10	"Specialized Statewide response team." A complement of
11	individuals organized by the Commonwealth to provide specialized
12	personnel, equipment and other support capabilities in response
13	to an actual or potential disaster in this Commonwealth. The
14	term includes a disaster medical assistance team and disaster
15	mortuary response team.
16	"Type 1 urban search and rescue task force." An urban search
17	and rescue task force organized by the agency that meets or
18	exceeds the minimum requirements of a Type 1 urban search and
19	rescue task force as designated by FEMA in the National Incident
20	<u>Management System (NIMS) guidelines.</u>
21	"Urban search and rescue task force." A multidisciplined
22	complement of individuals organized by the agency in accordance
23	with standards developed by the agency and FEMA to provide
24	emergency response and search and rescue capabilities and
25	resources at the scene of a disaster consistent with National
26	Incident Management System (NIMS) guidelines.
27	"Volunteer service organization." A volunteer fire company,
28	volunteer ambulance or medical company, volunteer rescue squad
29	or any other volunteer entity organized and chartered or
30	incorporated in this Commonwealth or chartered by the Congress

18	(a) General ruleThe agency shall coordinate and consult
19	with other State agencies, departments and offices, including
20	the Office of Homeland Security of the Commonwealth, to
21	establish, develop and maintain a counterterrorism planning,
22	preparedness and response program to promote and protect the
23	health, safety and welfare of emergency responders, public
24	officials and the general public from actual or potential
25	disasters in this Commonwealth.
26	(b) Agency responsibilitiesThe agency shall:
27	(1) Define the necessary components and composition of
28	regional counterterrorism task forces and specialized
29	regional counterterrorism response teams and the respective
30	regional counterterrorism zones for each, but shall not be

4	(2) Provide training and technical assistance for
5	counterterrorism planning, preparedness and response.
6	(3) Establish guidelines and policies to coordinate
7	emergency response activities with Federal, State, county and
8	municipal emergency management, health, law enforcement,
9	public safety and other officials and representatives from
10	volunteer service organizations, private business and
11	industry, hospitals and medical care facilities and other
12	entities responsible for the health, safety and welfare of
13	the residents of this Commonwealth. The agency shall consult
14	with representatives of the regional counterterrorism task
15	forces to develop such policies and guidelines necessary to
16	carry out this chapter.
17	(4) Require the regional counterterrorism task forces to
18	prepare counterterrorism emergency response plans or
19	protocols, readiness evaluation reports or other documents
20	deemed necessary by the agency.
21	(5) Provide grants and other funding assistance as
22	required by this chapter.
23	(6) Conduct terrorist incident exercises.
24	(7) Provide technical assistance to regional
25	counterterrorism task forces in developing and entering into
26	mutual aid agreements and letters of agreement.
27	(8) Establish a certification program for specialized
28	regional counterterrorism response teams that may include
29	standards for the administration, composition, training and
30	equipping of the teams.

2	(a) EstablishmentThe agency, in coordination with State,
3	county and municipal emergency management, health, law
4	enforcement, public safety and other officials and
5	representatives from volunteer service organizations, private
6	business and industry, hospitals and medical care facilities and
7	other entities responsible for the health, safety and welfare of
8	the residents of this Commonwealth, shall establish regional
9	counterterrorism task forces throughout this Commonwealth.
10	(b) Response plansA regional counterterrorism task force
11	shall prepare a counterterrorism preparedness and response plan
12	in accordance with guidelines developed by the agency. The
13	agency shall review and approve each plan in a timely manner,
14	but no later than 90 days after its submission to the agency.
15	The task force shall review and update the plan on an annual
16	basis.
17	(c) MeetingsRegional counterterrorism task force meetings
18	that are called to discuss sensitive or classified law
19	enforcement, terrorist threat assessment or other confidential
20	public and private facility safety information shall not be
21	deemed a public record subject to disclosure under 65 Pa.C.S.
22	Ch. 7 (relating to open meetings).
23	§ 7213. Regional counterterrorism response and preparedness.
24	<u>(a) Specialized regional counterterrorism response teamsA</u>
25	regional counterterrorism task force shall establish specialized
26	regional counterterrorism response teams.
27	(b) Regional counterterrorism response zonesThe agency
28	shall establish primary and secondary regional response zones
29	within this Commonwealth for specialized regional
30	counterterrorism response teams. The regional response zones may

3	(c) Activation and deployment A specialized regional
4	counterterrorism response team may be activated and deployed by

7	§ 7214. Urban search and rescue task forces.
8	(a) EstablishmentThe agency shall establish urban search
9	and rescue task forces, including:
10	(1) At least one Type 1 urban search and rescue task
11	force within a regional counterterrorism task force covering
12	a county of the first class, which shall be called
13	<u>Pennsylvania Task Force 1 (PA-TF1).</u>
14	(2) At least one urban search and rescue task force
15	within a regional counterterrorism task force covering a
16	county of the second class, which shall be called
17	Pennsylvania Task Force 2 (PA-TF2) and, no later than January
18	1, 2026, shall be a Type 1 urban search and rescue task
19	force.
20	(a.1) SupportThe task forces shall also provide
21	professional, logistical, material and other forms of support to
22	regional counterterrorism task forces and specialized regional
23	<u>counterterrorism response teams.</u>
24	(b) OrganizationAn urban search and rescue task force
25	shall be organized in accordance with guidelines developed by
26	the agency in coordination with FEMA and members of the task
27	force.
28	(c) ResponsibilitiesAn urban search and rescue task force
29	shall respond to actual or potential disasters in this
30	Commonwealth and shall also perform search and rescue functions

6	(d) Activation and deployment
7	(1) An urban search and rescue task force or any of its
8	components, subgroups or regional elements may only be
9	activated and deployed to the scene of a disaster by either:
10	(i) the Governor or the Governor's designee; or
11	(ii) the President of the United States or a FEMA-
12	designated official.
13	(2) During an activation and deployment by the Governor,
14	the administrative and operational costs of the task force,
15	its individual members and their employers, State agencies
16	and other parties shall be paid under the Governor's
17	declaration of disaster emergency, including paying or
18	reimbursing any parties for workers' compensation and death
19	benefits in the event of injury or death of an urban search
20	and rescue task force member.
21	(e) Workers' compensation and death benefitsA member of
22	an urban search and rescue task force shall be eligible to
23	receive workers' compensation and death benefits in the event of
24	injury or death that occurs during the period of activation or
25	deployment.
26	(f) Funding, grants and donationsIn addition to money
27	that is provided to a task force under section 7216 (relating to
28	grant program) or the authority of section 1508 of the act of
29	April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as the Fiscal Code, the
30	urban search and rescue task force may be eligible to receive

1	grants, donations of equipment and supplies and other funds from
2	any source. As an agent of the Commonwealth, a task force is
3	entitled to tax-exempt status from the Federal Government.
4	<u>§ 7215. Specialized Statewide response teams.</u>
5	(a) EstablishmentThe Commonwealth may establish one or
6	more specialized Statewide response teams. These specialized
7	statewide response teams shall also provide professional,
8	logistical, material and other forms of support to the regional
9	counterterrorism task forces and specialized regional
10	counterterrorism response teams organized in this Commonwealth.
11	The Commonwealth may enter into an agreement with a One Call
12	System as defined in the act of December 10, 1974 (P.L.852,
13	No.287), referred to as the Underground Utility Line Protection
14	Law, for the provision of specialized communications services.
15	(b) Organization and responsibilitiesSpecialized
16	Statewide response teams shall be organized in accordance with
17	guidelines developed by the Commonwealth in consultation with
18	applicable Federal or State agencies.
19	(c) ActivationSpecialized Statewide response teams may
20	only be activated and deployed to the scene of a disaster by the
21	<u>Governor or the Governor's designee.</u>
22	<u>§ 7216. Grant program.</u>
23	(a) AuthorizationThe agency may make grants to regional
24	counterterrorism task forces, specialized regional
25	counterterrorism response teams, specialized Statewide response
26	teams and urban search and rescue task forces to assist them in
27	carrying out this chapter, including entering into letters of
28	agreement or mutual aid agreements or providing mutual aid.
29	(b) Grants and fundingRegional counterterrorism task
30	forces, specialized regional counterterrorism response teams,

2	task forces may receive grants and funding from the Federal

7	the extent that funding is available.
8	<u>§ 7217. Miscellaneous provisions.</u>
9	(a) Immunity from liabilityThe provisions of 42 Pa.C.S. §
10	8331 (relating to medical good Samaritan civil immunity), 8332
11	(relating to emergency response provider and bystander good
12	<u>Samaritan civil immunity) or 8332.4 (relating to volunteer-in-</u>
13	public-service negligence standard) shall apply to a member of a
14	specialized regional counterterrorism response team, an urban
15	search and rescue task force or a specialized Statewide response
16	team and an individual who provides logistical, material or
17	other forms of emergency response support to a team or task
18	force during activation or deployment of a team or task force to
19	a potential or actual disaster or while engaged in a task force
20	<u>or team drill or training exercise.</u>
21	(b) Effect on workers' compensation premiumsNothing in
22	this chapter shall be construed to permit an insurer to raise
23	workers' compensation premiums due to the participation or
24	membership of a county, municipality, volunteer service
25	organization, individual or employer on a regional
26	counterterrorism task force, specialized regional
27	counterterrorism response team, specialized Statewide response
28	team or urban search and rescue task force.
29	<u>§ 7218. Commonwealth indemnification.</u>
30	The Commonwealth shall indemnify a county or municipality for

8	(2) The damage to county or municipal property occurs
9	outside of the primary regional counterterrorism response
10	zone.
11	(3) The county's or municipality's insurance does not
12	cover the property damage.
13	(4) The property damage was not caused by the willful
14	misconduct of the county or municipality or any of its
15	employees or agents.
16	Section 2. Title 35 is amended by adding a section to read:
17	<u>§ 7605. Construction.</u>
18	For purposes of Article VI of the compact, "officers or
19	employees of a party state" shall be construed to include urban
20	search and rescue task forces as defined in section 7202
21	(relating to definitions) that are assets of the Federal
22	Emergency Management Agency or Pennsylvania Emergency Management
23	Agency and the components, subgroups and regional elements of
24	the task forces based in this Commonwealth.
25	Section 3. Repeals are as follows:
26	(1) The General Assembly finds that the repeals under
27	paragraphs (2) and (3) are necessary to effectuate the
28	addition of 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 72.
29	(2) The definitions, excluding the definitions of
30	"department" and "local health department," in section 102 of

Section 4. The addition of 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 72 is a
continuation of the act of December 16, 2002 (P.L.1967, No.227),
known as the Counterterrorism Planning, Preparedness and
Response Act. The following apply:

10 Except as otherwise provided in 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 72, (1)all activities initiated under the Counterterrorism Planning, 11 12 Preparedness and Response Act, shall continue and remain in 13 full force and effect and may be completed under 35 Pa.C.S. 14 Ch. 72. Orders, regulations, rules and decisions which were 15 made under the Counterterrorism Planning, Preparedness and Response Act and which are in effect on the effective date of 16 this section shall remain in full force and effect until 17 18 revoked, vacated or modified under 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 72. 19 Contracts, obligations and collective bargaining agreements 20 entered into under the Counterterrorism Planning, 21 Preparedness and Response Act are not affected nor impaired 22 by the repeal of the Counterterrorism Planning, Preparedness 23 and Response Act.

(2) Except as set forth in paragraph (3), any difference
in language between 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 72 and the
Counterterrorism Planning, Preparedness and Response Act is
intended only to conform to the style of the Pennsylvania
Consolidated Statutes and is not intended to change or affect
the legislative intent, judicial construction or
administration and implementation of the Counterterrorism

9 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
