1 2 4 5 6 7	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," establishing the Nellie Bly Scholarship Program and the Nellie Bly Scholarship Program Restricted Account.
8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
11	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an
12	article to read:
13	ARTICLE XX-L
14	NELLIE BLY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM
15	Section 2001-L. Definitions.
16	The following words and phrases when used in this article
17	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
18	context clearly indicates otherwise:

1	"Academic year." One complete school year, usually nine
2	months in length, commencing on or after August 1 of the
3	<u>calendar year.</u>
4	"College completion award." Funding provided by the
5	department to a community college participating in the program
6	for wraparound services to scholarship recipients, including the
7	hiring of college navigators, mental health supports, tutoring
8	and other services deemed necessary by the community college to
9	support scholarship recipients' completion of their course of
10	study.
11	"Community college." A public college or technical institute
12	established and operated in accordance with the provisions of
13	this act by a local sponsor that provides:
14	(1) a two-year, postsecondary, college-parallel,
15	terminal-general, terminal-technical, out-of-school youth or
16	adult education program or any combination of these programs;
17	or
18	(2) area career and technical education services and
19	credit, nonremedial college courses to secondary senior high
20	<u>school students.</u>
21	"Cost of attendance." The direct and indirect costs relating
22	to attendance at an institution, including tuition and fees,
23	cost of room and board or living expenses, cost of books,
24	supplies, transportation, loan fees and miscellaneous expenses,
25	including a reasonable amount for the documented cost of a
26	personal computer, allowance for child care or other dependent
27	care, costs related to a disability and reasonable costs for
28	eligible study-abroad programs.
29	"Department." The Department of Education of the
30	Commonwealth.

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1	"Eligible student." An individual who meets the eligibility
2	criteria stated in section 2006-L.
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	"FAFSA." The Free Application for Federal Student Aid.
4	"Financial aid." Funding to help pay for postsecondary
5	education, including grants, work study, loans and scholarships.
6	"Full-time enrollment." Enrollment of twelve or more
7	undergraduate credits in an academic semester or the equivalent.
8	"Funding award." An award of program funds from the Nellie
9	Bly Scholarship Program Restricted Account made by the
10	department to PHEAA to fund scholarship awards.
11	"Institutional aid." Financial aid offered to an eligible
12	student directly by an institution which shall include merit
13	aid, gift aid and athletic awards.
14	"Participating institution." A community college established
15	under Article XIX-A or a State-owned university in the
16	Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education.
17	"Pell Grant." The Federal Pell Grant or any successor
18	program to it.
19	"PHEAA." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance
20	Agency.
21	"Private scholarship." Financial aid awards funded by
22	entities other than the Federal or State government, including
23	awards by companies, service groups, foundations, organizations
24	and individuals.
25	"Program." The Nellie Bly Scholarship Program established
26	under section 2002-L.
27	"Program administration agreement." An agreement by and
28	between the department and PHEAA that specifies the duties and
29	responsibilities of PHEAA as administrator of the program and
30	such other terms and conditions deemed necessary by the
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1	department for the administration of the program.
2	"Program participation agreement." An agreement by and
3	between the department and an institution that specifies the
4	duties of the institution as a participant in the program and
5	such other terms and conditions deemed necessary by the
6	department for program participation.
7	"Promissory note." A legal agreement between a scholarship
8	recipient and the department detailing the recipient's rights
9	and responsibilities and terms and conditions for repayment.
10	"Restricted account." The Nellie Bly Scholarship Program
11	Restricted Account established under section 2002-L.
12	"Scholarship agreement." The written agreement between the
13	department and a scholarship recipient under which a scholarship
14	award is made.
15	"Scholarship award." An award of program money made by the
16	department to an eligible student toward the cost of attendance.
17	"Scholarship recipient." An eligible student who is awarded
18	<u>a scholarship award.</u>
19	Section 2002-L. Nellie Bly Scholarship Program.
20	(a) EstablishmentThe Nellie Bly Scholarship Program is
21	established in the department.
22	(b) Nellie Bly Scholarship Program Restricted Account
23	(1) The Nellie Bly Scholarship Program Restricted
24	Account is established in the State Treasury. The money in
25	the restricted account is appropriated on a continuing basis
26	to the department for the purposes specified in this article.
27	(2) The restricted account shall consist of money
28	transferred, appropriated or otherwise made available to the
29	restricted account.
30	(3) Money in the restricted account shall be allocated

1	as	follows:

2	(i) The department may use up to 4% of the money in
3	the restricted account to administer the program, in
4	cooperation with PHEAA, and to administer the college
5	completion awards.
6	(ii) The department may use up to 3% of the money in
7	the restricted account for college completion awards.
8	(iii) The remaining money in the restricted account
9	shall be allocated as a funding award to PHEAA to make
10	<u>scholarship awards to eligible students.</u>
11	(c) Condition on use of restricted accountThe allocations
12	specified in subsection (b) shall be expended only to the extent
13	money is available in the restricted account.
14	Section 2003-L. Powers and duties of department.
15	<u>(a) Program administration</u>
16	(1) The department shall enter into a program
17	administration agreement with PHEAA.
18	(2) The department shall develop the form of scholarship
19	agreement and promissory note to be used when awarding a
20	<u>scholarship award.</u>
21	(b) Audits, reviews and data collectionThe department may
22	conduct such audits, reviews and data collection of the
23	scholarship awards of PHEAA and the participating institutions
24	as the department determines to be necessary or appropriate.
25	(c) RegulationsThe department shall promulgate
26	regulations as necessary to implement, administer and enforce
27	this article.
28	(d) Temporary regulations
29	(1) In order to facilitate the prompt implementation of
30	this article, the department shall promulgate temporary

9	Section 2005-L. Duties of participating institutions.
10	(a) Agreement with departmentAn institution shall enter
11	into a program participation agreement with the department.
12	(b) Specific powers and dutiesThe powers and duties of a
13	participating institution under the program shall include the
14	<u>following:</u>
15	(1) To prepare reports and compile program data as
16	requested by the department in a form and manner as
17	prescribed by the department. The Pennsylvania State System
18	of Higher Education may prepare the reports and compile the
19	<u>data on behalf of its institutions.</u>
20	(2) To perform other program participation duties and
21	responsibilities as determined by the department.
22	Section 2006-L. Eligible scholarship recipients.
23	<u>(a) Initial eligibility requirementsTo receive an initial</u>
24	scholarship award, an individual must meet all of the following
25	eligibility requirements:

27	equivalency credential or the equivalent.

29	seeking student at a participating institution.

8	in the poverty guidelines issued annually by the United

12	(b) Renewal eligibility requirementsTo receive a renewal
13	of an initial scholarship award, an individual shall meet all
14	the following requirements:

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1	department for each year the student receives a scholarship
2	award. Each year the eligible student receives a scholarship
3	award, the eligible student must reaffirm the intention to
4	reside in this Commonwealth upon graduation.
5	(d) PriorityEligible students pursuing programs of study
6	in health care, education and public service shall be given
7	priority when initial and renewal scholarship awards are made.
8	(e) DefaultA scholarship recipient shall repay the full
9	amount of the scholarship award received without interest if the
10	recipient fails to reside in this Commonwealth for a period of
11	4.5 months for each semester, or the equivalent the scholarship
12	recipient received a scholarship award. This requirement shall
13	commence upon completion of an undergraduate degree program or
14	upon termination of enrollment at a participating institution,
15	whichever occurs first. If a scholarship recipient transfers
16	from one participating institution to another participating
17	institution, the transfer shall not be considered as a
18	termination of enrollment.
19	(f) Deferral of residency requirementNotwithstanding
20	subsection (e), the department may defer the Commonwealth
21	residency requirement for an eligible student under the
22	following circumstances:
23	(1) Full-time enrollment in a baccalaureate degree
24	program or a graduate degree program within six months of
25	receipt of an undergraduate degree from a participating
26	institution. The recipient shall provide PHEAA with
27	documentation of the student's continual status as a graduate
28	<u>student on a half-time basis.</u>
29	(2) Other extenuating circumstances as determined by the
30	Secretary of Education.

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1	(g) Notice of change to departmentA scholarship recipient
2	shall inform the department of a change in the recipient's
3	permanent address within 30 days of the effective date of the
4	<u>change.</u>
5	(h) Forgiveness of repaymentRepayment shall not be
6	required under the following circumstances:
7	(1) The scholarship recipient enlists in the Armed
8	Forces or National Guard.
9	(2) The scholarship recipient is deceased or is
10	permanently and totally disabled.
11	(3) Other extenuating circumstances as determined by the
12	Secretary of Education.
13	Section 2007-L. Refund of scholarship award by institution.
14	<u>A scholarship award to an eligible student who disenrolls</u>
15	during the participating institution's full refund drop period
16	shall be refunded by the institution to PHEAA no later than the
17	beginning of the academic year following the academic year in
18	which the eligible student was enrolled.
19	Section 2008-L. Need-based eligibility tiers for scholarship
20	awards.
21	(a) Order of financial aidA participating institution
22	shall apply the financial aid received by an eligible student in
23	the following order:
24	(1) Pell Grant.
25	<u>(2) Pennsylvania State Grant.</u>
26	<u>(3) Institutional aid.</u>
27	<u>(4) Private scholarship.</u>
28	(5) Scholarship award under this article.
29	<u>(6) Federal work study.</u>
30	<u>(7) Federal student loans.</u>

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1	(b) Amount of scholarship awardThe amount of a
2	scholarship award shall be determined annually by the department
3	<u>based upon availability of program money. An eligible student</u>
4	attending:
5	(1) a community college may receive up to \$2,000 per
6	year; and
7	(2) a State-owned university may receive up to \$4,000
8	per year.
9	(c) Application of scholarship awardAfter application of
10	the financial aid specified in subsection (a)(1), (2), (3) and
11	(4), the scholarship award shall first be applied against direct
12	charges at the participating institution which include tuition,
13	fees, room and board owed by an eligible student to the
14	institution. Any remaining scholarship award may be used by the
15	scholarship recipient for other costs of attendance.
16	(d) LimitationA scholarship award may not exceed the cost
17	of attendance after all other financial aid has been applied to
18	<u>a student's account.</u>
19	Section 2009-L. College completion award.
20	The department shall establish and administer a competitive
21	completion award program for community colleges to provide
22	scholarship recipients with wraparound services to support
23	degree completion. Community colleges shall submit proposals in
24	the manner and format prescribed by the department. The
25	department may expand the entities eligible for college
26	completion awards by promulgating regulations.
27	Section 2010-L. Disqualification from program participation.
28	An individual who knowingly or intentionally procures,
29	obtains or aids another to procure or obtain a scholarship award
30	under this article through fraudulent means shall be
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- 1 <u>disqualified from participation in the program and shall be</u>
- 2 <u>liable to the department for an amount equal to three times the</u>
- 3 <u>amount awarded.</u>
- 4 <u>Section 2011-L. Taxability.</u>
- 5 <u>A scholarship award received by an eligible student shall not</u>

6 be considered taxable income for purposes of Article III of the

- 7 act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code
- 8 <u>of 1971.</u>
- 9 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
