1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22	Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined," in powers and duties generally, further providing for departmental reports.

25	Section 1. Section 504 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
26	No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended to

28	Section 504. Departmental Reports <u>(a)</u> The head of each

administrative department and each independent administrative 1 board and commission shall, not later than October first of each 2 even-numbered year, report in writing to the Governor concerning 3 4 the condition, management, and financial transactions, of the department, board, or commission; such reports shall, except 5 where impracticable, be for the two-year period ending May 6 thirty-first of the year in which they are made. Each 7 departmental administrative board and commission, and each 8 9 advisory board and commission, shall, not later than September 10 first of each even-numbered year, report in writing to the head 11 of the department of which such board or commission is a part. 12 All such reports shall be attached as exhibits to the report 13 made by the head of the department to the Governor.

Except as otherwise in this act specifically provided, the reports required by this section shall be in lieu of all other reports heretofore required by law to be made by the several administrative departments, boards, and commissions, either to the Governor or to the General Assembly.

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(b) Reports required under subsection (a) shall:

20 (1) contain a thorough assessment of the weaknesses and

21 risks within each administrative department and each independent

22 administrative board and commission that could negatively affect

23 the ability of the department or board or commission to respond

24 to a future emergency in this Commonwealth; and

25 (2) detail the actions necessary to address or otherwise

26 resolve the weaknesses and risks within each administrative_

27 <u>department and each independent administrative board and</u>

28 <u>commission</u>.

29 Section 2. This act shall take effect 60 days.

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
