## AN ACT

Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in grants to fire companies and emergency medical services companies, establishing the 3 Firefighter Safety Equipment Grant Program in the Office of 4 State Fire Commissioner and the Firefighter Safety Equipment Grant Fund. 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 8 9 Section 1. Chapter 78 of Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subchapter to read: 10 11 SUBCHAPTER F 12 FIREFIGHTER SAFETY EQUIPMENT GRANT PROGRAM 13 Sec. 7851. <u>Definitions</u>. 14

- 4 § 7851. Definitions.
- 5 The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter
- 6 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 7 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 8 "Airport fire company." A fire company that does all of the
- 9 following:
- 10 (1) Is associated with an airport.
- 11 (2) Has a mutual aid agreement with a neighboring
- 12 <u>municipality</u>.
- 13 (3) Has responded to at least 15 fire or rescue
- 14 emergency calls annually to neighboring fire companies as
- provided in documentation requested by the commissioner.
- 16 "Commissioner." The State Fire Commissioner.
- 17 "Eliqible fire company." A fire company that is eliqible
- 18 under section 7854(b) (relating to fire company eligibility) to
- 19 receive reimbursement from the fund.
- 20 "Fire company." A volunteer fire company, a municipal fire
- 21 company or a combined volunteer and municipal fire company
- 22 located in this Commonwealth. The term includes an airport fire
- 23 company.
- 24 "Firefighter." A career firefighter or volunteer firefighter
- 25 <u>in good standing with a fire company who actively responded to</u>
- 26 at least 15 fire or rescue emergencies as determined by the
- 27 <u>firefighter's fire company during the previous calendar year.</u>
- 28 "Fund." The Firefighter Safety Equipment Grant Fund
- 29 <u>established under section 7852(b) (relating to Firefighter</u>
- 30 <u>Safety Equipment Grant Program</u>).

- 1 "Municipality." A county, city, borough, incorporated town,
- 2 township or home rule municipality.
- 3 <u>"Office." The Office of the State Fire Commissioner.</u>
- 4 <u>"Personal protective gear."</u> Firefighting equipment,
- 5 including boots, pants, jacket, hood and helmet that meet
- 6 <u>occupational safety and health standards under 29 CFR</u>
- 7 1910.156(e) (relating to fire brigades) for fire response.
- 8 "Program." The Firefighter Safety Equipment Grant Program
- 9 <u>established under section 7852(a).</u>
- 10 "Volunteer fire company." A nonprofit chartered corporation,
- 11 <u>association or organization located in this Commonwealth that</u>
- 12 provides fire protection or rescue services within this
- 13 <u>Commonwealth.</u>
- 14 § 7852. Firefighter Safety Equipment Grant Program.
- 15 <u>(a) Establishment.--The Firefighter Safety Equipment Grant</u>
- 16 Program is established within the office for the purposes of
- 17 this subchapter.
- 18 (b) Firefighter Safety Equipment Grant Fund. -- The
- 19 Firefighter Safety Equipment Grant Fund is established as a
- 20 special fund within the State Treasury. The fund shall consist
- 21 of money appropriated or transferred to the fund by act of the
- 22 General Assembly, in addition to any grants, gifts, donations or
- 23 other payments from other sources. Money in the fund is
- 24 appropriated on a continuing basis to the office for the
- 25 purposes of subsection (c).
- 26 (c) Use.--Money in the fund shall be used for:
- 27 (1) Reimbursing eligible fire companies for costs
- incurred for personal protective gear or other protective
- 29 equipment for firefighters.
- 30 (2) Administering the provisions of this subchapter.

§ 7853. Applications. 1 2 (a) Notice. -- The following shall apply: (1) By September 8 of each year, the commissioner shall 3 provide application forms and written instructions for 4 5 reimbursements from the fund to: (i) The fire chief and president of each volunteer 6 7 fire company. (ii) The chief executive of each municipality in 8 9 which a municipal fire company is located. (iii) The head of each combined volunteer and 10 municipal fire company and each airport fire company. 11 (2) The application forms and written instructions for 12 13 reimbursements from the fund shall be posted on the publicly 14 accessible Internet website of the office. 15 (b) Contents. -- An application for reimbursement from the fund must contain the following: 16 17 (1) The name, address, telephone number and other 18 contact information of the fire company requesting 19 reimbursement. 20 (2) The name of all firefighters to receive a 21 reimbursement for personal protective gear or other 22 protective equipment. 23 (3) Documentation reflecting the out-of-pocket costs 24 borne by the fire company or the firefighter for personal 25 protective gear or other protective equipment to be 26 reimbursed, as well as any certification requirements 27 otherwise prescribed. (4) Any other information required by the office to 28 29 assist in processing reimbursement from the fund. (c) Completion. -- The following shall apply: 30

1	(1) The period to submit applications for reimbursement
2	from the fund shall remain open for 45 days each year.
3	(2) Completed applications for reimbursement from the
4	fund shall be submitted to the office within the designated
5	time frames and in the form and manner prescribed by the
6	office.
7	(d) Determination Within 60 days of the application
8	submission deadline each year, the commissioner shall act to
9	approve or disapprove submitted applications for reimbursement
10	from the fund. Applications that have not been approved or
11	disapproved within 60 days after the close of the application
12	period each year shall be deemed approved.
13	§ 7854. Fire company eligibility.
14	(a) Mandate Reimbursement from the fund may only be made
15	to an eligible fire company.
16	(b) Criteria To be considered an eligible fire company, a
17	<pre>fire company must:</pre>
18	(1) Actively participate in the Pennsylvania Fire
19	Information Reporting System (PennFIRS) under a signed
20	agreement. The following apply:
21	(i) The commissioner shall develop guidelines
22	specifying the criteria necessary to determine the level
23	of participation in PennFIRS for fire companies to remain
24	eligible for reimbursement from the fund.
25	(ii) The commissioner shall transmit notice of the
26	guidelines under subparagraph (i) to the Legislative
27	Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania
28	Bulletin.
29	(2) Certify that a firefighter be in good standing with
30	the fire company for at least the last 24 months to receive

- 1 reimbursement from the fund.
- 2 (3) Certify that a firefighter who obtained personal
- 3 protective gear and for whom reimbursement is sought from the
- 4 <u>fund has received the minimum level of Firefighter 2 under</u>
- 5 <u>the Pennsylvania State Fire Academy standards before the</u>
- 6 reimbursement application is made.
- 7 (4) Certify that a firefighter to receive reimbursement
- 8 <u>or for whom a fire company is receiving reimbursement:</u>
- 9 <u>(i) has not received reimbursement for gear under</u>
- the program for the preceding five years; or
- 11 <u>(ii) is replacing personal protective gear</u>
- 12 permanently taken out of service due to incident response
- or training exercise.
- 14 § 7855. Reimbursements.
- 15 (a) Retention of reimbursement. -- If a fire company receives
- 16 <u>reimbursement for costs that were paid directly by the fire</u>
- 17 company on behalf of a firefighter, the fire company may retain
- 18 the reimbursement.
- 19 (b) Distribution of reimbursement.--If a fire company
- 20 receives reimbursement for costs that were paid directly by the
- 21 <u>firefighter</u>, the fire company shall distribute the reimbursement
- 22 to the firefighter as soon as practicable.
- 23 (c) Amount.--The amount of a reimbursement under subsection
- 24 (a) shall be commensurate with the actual expenses incurred and
- 25 shall not exceed \$4,500 per firefighter.
- 26 (d) Pro rata reimbursements.--Reimbursements shall be made
- 27 on a pro rata basis if the total dollar amount of the approved
- 28 applications exceeds the amount of money available in the fund
- 29 to provide the reimbursements.
- 30 § 7856. Annual reports.

- 1 (a) Requirement. -- No later than September 1 of each year,
- 2 the office shall issue an annual report, which shall include all
- 3 <u>of the following information:</u>
- 4 (1) The money in the fund at the beginning of the
- 5 previous fiscal year and the balance in the fund at the end
- of the previous fiscal year.
- 7 (2) The number of reimbursement applications received by
- 8 the office during the previous fiscal year.
- 9 <u>(3) The number of reimbursements made during the</u>
- 10 previous fiscal year.
- 11 (4) The fire companies to which reimbursements were made
- 12 during the previous fiscal year.
- 13 <u>(5) The total dollar amount of reimbursements made</u>
- 14 <u>during the previous fiscal year.</u>
- 15 (b) Submittal.--Each report under this section shall be
- 16 posted on the publicly accessible Internet website of the office
- 17 and submitted to the following:
- 18 (1) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 19 Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the
- 20 Senate.
- 21 (2) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 22 Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the
- 23 House of Representatives.
- 24 § 7857. Distribution of information.
- 25 The office shall annually distribute information on the fund
- 26 to all fire companies in this Commonwealth, including
- 27 reimbursement procedures and eligibility criteria.
- 28 § 7858. Appropriation.
- 29 Money necessary to administer this chapter shall be provided
- 30 by an annual appropriation by the General Assembly.

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
