 19 COMMONWEALTH, THE RESETTLEMENT OF ACCOUNTS AND APPEALS TO THE
 20 COURTS, REFUNDS OF MONEYS ERRONEOUSLY PAID TO THE
 21 COMMONWEALTH, AUDITING THE ACCOUNTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH AND
 22 ALL AGENCIES THEREOF, OF ALL PUBLIC OFFICERS COLLECTING
 23 MONEYS PAYABLE TO THE COMMONWEALTH, OR ANY AGENCY THEREOF,
 24 AND ALL RECEIPTS OF APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE COMMONWEALTH,
 25 AUTHORIZING THE COMMONWEALTH TO ISSUE TAX ANTICIPATION NOTES
 26 TO DEFRAY CURRENT EXPENSES, IMPLEMENTING THE PROVISIONS OF
 27 SECTION 7 (A) OF ARTICLE VIII OF THE CONSTITUTION OF
 28 PENNSYLVANIA AUTHORIZING AND RESTRICTING THE INCURRING OF
 29 CERTAIN DEBT AND IMPOSING PENALTIES; AFFECTING EVERY
 30 DEPARTMENT, BOARD, COMMISSION, AND OFFICER OF THE STATE
 31 GOVERNMENT, EVERY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE, AND
 32 CERTAIN OFFICERS OF SUCH SUBDIVISIONS, EVERY PERSON,

1 ASSOCIATION, AND CORPORATION REQUIRED TO PAY, ASSESS, OR
2 COLLECT TAXES, OR TO MAKE RETURNS OR REPORTS UNDER THE LAWS
3 IMPOSING TAXES FOR STATE PURPOSES, OR TO PAY LICENSE FEES OR
4 OTHER MONEYS TO THE COMMONWEALTH, OR ANY AGENCY THEREOF,
5 EVERY STATE DEPOSITORY AND EVERY DEBTOR OR CREDITOR OF THE
6 COMMONWEALTH," IN EMERGENCY COVID-19 RESPONSE, FURTHER
7 PROVIDING FOR MONEY IN ACCOUNT AND PROVIDING FOR
8 MUNICIPALITIES; IN FINANCIALLY DISTRESSED MUNICIPALITIES,
9 PROVIDING FOR LOCAL SERVICES TAX; IN SPECIAL FUNDS, FURTHER
10 PROVIDING FOR DISPOSITION OF BUDGET STABILIZATION RESERVE
11 FUND; IN ADDITIONAL SPECIAL FUNDS AND RESTRICTED ACCOUNTS,
12 FURTHER PROVIDING FOR RETURN OF COVID-19 RESPONSE TRANSFERS
13 AND PROVIDING FOR WORKERS' COMPENSATION SECURITY FUND
14 TRANSFER; IN GENERAL BUDGET IMPLEMENTATION, FURTHER PROVIDING
15 FOR DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, FOR
16 DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION AND NATURAL RESOURCES, FOR
17 DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION, FOR DEPARTMENT OF
18 GENERAL SERVICES, FOR PENNSYLVANIA GAMING CONTROL BOARD, FOR
19 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, FOR DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AND VETERANS
20 AFFAIRS, FOR DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES AND FOR DEPARTMENT
21 OF REVENUE AND PROVIDING FOR LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT AND FOR

26 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
27 hereby enacts as follows:

28 ~~Section 1. Title 53 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated~~ <--
29 ~~Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:~~

30 ~~§ 8121.1. Emergency tax anticipation notes.~~

31 ~~(a) Legislative findings. The General Assembly finds and~~
32 ~~declares that the proclamation of disaster emergency issued by~~
33 ~~the Governor on March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March~~
34 ~~21, 2020), and the resulting global pandemic from COVID-19, has~~
35 ~~had an unexpected and sudden effect on the citizens, governments~~
36 ~~and businesses of the Commonwealth, including a material~~
37 ~~negative effect on the revenues of many local government units.~~

38 ~~(b) Emergency borrowing authorized. Notwithstanding any~~
39 ~~other provision of this title or law, a local government unit~~
40 ~~may borrow money under section 8121 (relating to power to issue~~
41 ~~tax anticipation notes) with the following additional terms:~~

42 ~~(1) For the purposes of this subsection, the governing~~

~~body's anticipation of current taxes or current revenues may include an anticipation that the taxes levied or revenues receivable may not be received, in full or in part, until after the end of the current fiscal year due to the extension of tax filing deadlines, administrative break down during the proclamation of disaster emergency issued by the Governor on March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and any renewal of the state of disaster emergency, unexpected severe economic contraction or the inability to timely enforce collection due to the proclamation of disaster emergency.~~

~~(2) In addition to the other requirements under this subchapter, a governing body shall establish a maturity date for a tax anticipation note issued under this subsection which shall not be later than the last day of the following fiscal year of the local government which ends not less than 15 months nor more than 26 months following the effective date of this subsection. LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT'S FISCAL YEAR IN 2022.~~ <--

~~(c) Expiration. No local government unit may borrow money under the authorization of this section after December 31, 2021.~~

~~Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.~~

SECTION 1. THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS FOLLOWS: <--

(1) THE INTENT OF THIS ACT IS TO PROVIDE FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 2020-2021 COMMONWEALTH BUDGET.

(2) THE CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA CONFERS NUMEROUS EXPRESS DUTIES UPON THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, INCLUDING THE PASSAGE OF A BALANCED BUDGET FOR THE COMMONWEALTH.

(3) SECTION 24 OF ARTICLE III OF THE CONSTITUTION OF

1 PENNSYLVANIA REQUIRES THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO ADOPT ALL
2 APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE OPERATION OF GOVERNMENT IN THIS
3 COMMONWEALTH, REGARDLESS OF THEIR SOURCE. THE SUPREME COURT
4 HAS REPEATEDLY AFFIRMED THAT "IT IS FUNDAMENTAL WITHIN
5 PENNSYLVANIA'S TRIPARTITE SYSTEM THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY
6 ENACTS THE LEGISLATION ESTABLISHING THOSE PROGRAMS WHICH THE
7 STATE PROVIDES FOR ITS CITIZENS AND APPROPRIATES THE FUNDS
8 NECESSARY FOR THEIR OPERATION."

9 (4) PURSUANT TO SECTION 13 OF ARTICLE VIII OF THE
10 CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IS
11 EXPLICITLY REQUIRED TO ADOPT A BALANCED COMMONWEALTH BUDGET.
12 GIVEN THE UNPREDICTABILITY AND POTENTIAL INSUFFICIENCY OF
13 REVENUE COLLECTIONS, VARIOUS CHANGES IN STATE LAW RELATING TO
14 SOURCES OF REVENUE, THE COLLECTION OF REVENUE AND THE
15 IMPLEMENTATION OF STATUTES WHICH IMPACT REVENUE MAY BE
16 REQUIRED TO DISCHARGE THIS CONSTITUTIONAL OBLIGATION.

17 (5) SECTION 11 OF ARTICLE III OF THE CONSTITUTION OF
18 PENNSYLVANIA REQUIRES THE ADOPTION OF A GENERAL APPROPRIATION
19 ACT THAT EMBRACES "NOTHING BUT APPROPRIATIONS." WHILE ACTUAL
20 ITEMS OF APPROPRIATION CAN BE CONTAINED IN A GENERAL
21 APPROPRIATION ACT, THE ACHIEVEMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF A
22 COMPREHENSIVE BUDGET INVOLVES MORE THAN SUBJECTS OF
23 APPROPRIATIONS AND DOLLAR AMOUNTS. ULTIMATELY, THE BUDGET HAS
24 TO BE BALANCED UNDER SECTION 13 OF ARTICLE VIII OF THE
25 CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA. THIS MAY NECESSITATE CHANGES TO
26 SOURCES OF FUNDING AND ENACTMENT OF STATUTES TO ACHIEVE FULL
27 COMPLIANCE WITH THESE CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISIONS.

28 (6) FOR THE REASONS SET FORTH IN PARAGRAPHS (1), (2),
29 (3), (4) AND (5), IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY
30 THROUGH THIS ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE

1 2020-2021 COMMONWEALTH BUDGET.

2 (7) EVERY PROVISION OF THIS ACT RELATES TO THE
3 IMPLEMENTATION OF THE OPERATING BUDGET OF THE COMMONWEALTH
4 FOR THIS FISCAL YEAR, ADDRESSING IN VARIOUS WAYS THE FISCAL
5 OPERATIONS, REVENUES AND POTENTIAL LIABILITIES OF THE
6 COMMONWEALTH. TO THAT END, THIS ACT IS INTENDED TO IMPLEMENT
7 THE 2020-2021 COMMONWEALTH BUDGET WITHOUT SPECIFICALLY
8 APPROPRIATING PUBLIC MONEY FROM THE GENERAL FUND. THIS ACT
9 PROVIDES ACCOUNTABILITY FOR SPENDING AND MAKES TRANSFERS OR
10 OTHER CHANGES NECESSARY TO IMPACT THE AVAILABILITY OF REVENUE
11 IN ORDER TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 13 OF ARTICLE
12 VIII OF THE CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA AND TO IMPLEMENT THE
13 ACT OF MAY 29, 2020 (P.L. , NO.1A), KNOWN AS THE GENERAL
14 APPROPRIATION ACT OF 2020, AND THE ACT OF (P.L. , NO.),
15 KNOWN AS THE SUPPLEMENT TO THE GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT OF
16 2020.

17 SECTION 2. SECTION 111-C OF THE ACT OF APRIL 9, 1929
18 (P.L.343, NO.176), KNOWN AS THE FISCAL CODE, ADDED MAY 29, 2020
19 (P.L.186, NO.24), IS AMENDED TO READ:

20 SECTION 111-C. MONEY IN ACCOUNT.

21 (A) CONTINUATION.--EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER [SUBSECTION (B)]
22 SUBSECTIONS (D.1) AND (D.2), ALL MONEY IN THE ACCOUNT,
23 INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, MONEY CREDITED TO THE ACCOUNT
24 UNDER SECTION 110-C, PRIOR YEAR ENCUMBRANCES AND ANY EARNED
25 INTEREST, SHALL NOT LAPSE OR BE TRANSFERRED TO ANY OTHER FUND OR
26 ACCOUNT.

27 [(B) COUNTY BLOCK GRANTS.--MONEY IN THE ACCOUNT THAT REMAINS
28 UNEXPENDED FROM THE STATE TREASURY AS OF DECEMBER 1, 2020, SHALL
29 BE TRANSFERRED BY THE STATE TREASURER TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
30 COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOR DISTRIBUTION TO COUNTIES

1 ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE FUNDS UNDER SUBARTICLE (D).

2 (C) DISTRIBUTION.--BY DECEMBER 15, 2020, MONEY TRANSFERRED
3 UNDER SUBSECTION (B) SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF
4 COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT TO EACH COUNTY ELIGIBLE TO
5 RECEIVE FUNDS UNDER SUBARTICLE (D) ON A PRO RATA BASIS USING THE
6 POPULATION PROPORTION AMOUNT CALCULATED UNDER SECTION 130-C(E).

7 (D) USE OF FUNDS.--MONEY TRANSFERRED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
8 COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND DISTRIBUTED TO COUNTIES
9 UNDER SUBSECTION (C) MAY BE USED ONLY FOR ELIGIBLE USES UNDER
10 SECTION 131-C.]

11 (D.1) UNEXPENDED FUNDS.--THE FOLLOWING SHALL APPLY:

12 (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTIONS (D.2) AND (D.3),
13 MONEY RECEIVED BY THE COMMONWEALTH FROM THE FEDERAL
14 GOVERNMENT UNDER DIVISION A OF TITLE V OF THE CARES ACT AND
15 INITIALLY DEPOSITED INTO THE ACCOUNT THAT REMAINS UNEXPENDED
16 AS OF DECEMBER 1, 2020, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, ANY
17 MONEY PREVIOUSLY APPROPRIATED TO THE PENNSYLVANIA HOUSING
18 FINANCE AGENCY AND THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC
19 DEVELOPMENT, INCLUDING DISTRIBUTIONS TO THE COUNTIES, SHALL
20 BE RETURNED TO THE ACCOUNT BY DECEMBER 15, 2020.

21 (2) THE MONEY IN THE ACCOUNT UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) AS OF
22 DECEMBER 22, 2020, IS APPROPRIATED AND SHALL BE TRANSFERRED
23 BY THE STATE TREASURER TO THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS TO
24 MEET PAYROLL EXPENSES FOR PUBLIC SAFETY AND HEALTH CARE OR
25 SIMILAR EMPLOYEES WHOSE SERVICES ARE SUBSTANTIALLY DEDICATED
26 TO MITIGATING OR RESPONDING TO THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH
27 EMERGENCY.

28 (D.2) EXTENSION OF TIME FOR REGIONAL RESPONSE HEALTH
29 COLLABORATION.--MONEY APPROPRIATED FOR COVID RELIEF - LONG-TERM
30 LIVING PROGRAMS FOR DISTRIBUTION UNDER SECTION 105-B(1) THAT

1 REMAINS UNEXPENDED FROM THE STATE TREASURY AS OF DECEMBER 30,
2 2020, IS APPROPRIATED AND SHALL BE TRANSFERRED BY THE STATE
3 TREASURER TO THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS TO MEET PAYROLL
4 EXPENSES FOR PUBLIC SAFETY AND HEALTH CARE OR SIMILAR EMPLOYEES
5 WHOSE SERVICES ARE SUBSTANTIALLY DEDICATED TO MITIGATING OR
6 RESPONDING TO THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY.

7 (D.3) SUPPLEMENT TO THE GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT OF 2020.--
8 MONEY APPROPRIATED UNDER THE ACT OF (P.L. , NO.), KNOWN AS
9 THE SUPPLEMENT TO THE APPROPRIATION ACT OF 2020, FROM THE
10 ACCOUNT IS NOT SUBJECT TO SUBSECTIONS (D.1) AND (D.2).

11 (E) NOTIFICATION BY TREASURER.--

12 (1) BY NOVEMBER 29, 2020, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL
13 NOTIFY THE CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE
14 APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE AND THE CHAIRPERSON
15 AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF
16 THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE AMOUNT OF MONEY [IN THE
17 ACCOUNT] UNDER SUBSECTION (D.1) THAT IS ESTIMATED TO REMAIN
18 UNEXPENDED AS OF DECEMBER 1, 2020, AND WILL BE TRANSFERRED
19 [TO THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT]
20 UNDER SUBSECTION (D.1).

21 (2) BY DECEMBER 29, 2020, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL
22 NOTIFY THE CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE
23 APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE AND THE CHAIRPERSON
24 AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF
25 THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE AMOUNT OF MONEY UNDER
26 SUBSECTION (D.2) THAT IS ESTIMATED TO REMAIN UNEXPENDED AS OF
27 DECEMBER 30, 2020, AND WILL BE TRANSFERRED UNDER SUBSECTION
28 (D.2).

29 [(F) NOTIFICATION.--BY DECEMBER 31, 2020, THE SECRETARY OF
30 COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SHALL NOTIFY THE CHAIRPERSON

1 AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE
2 SENATE AND THE CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE
3 APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
4 AMOUNT OF MONEY DISTRIBUTED TO EACH COUNTY UNDER SUBSECTION

9 (A) PROGRAM.--MONEY APPROPRIATED FOR COVID RELIEF - STATE
10 UNIVERSITIES SHALL BE USED BY THE STATE SYSTEM OF HIGHER
11 EDUCATION TO MAKE PAYMENTS TO STATE UNIVERSITIES FOR COSTS
12 RESULTING FROM THE PROCLAMATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY ISSUED BY
13 THE GOVERNOR ON MARCH 6, 2020, PUBLISHED AT 50 PA.B. 1644 (MARCH
14 21, 2020), AND ANY RENEWAL OF THE STATE OF DISASTER EMERGENCY.

28 (D) REPORT.--BY JULY 31, 2020, THE CHANCELLOR OF THE STATE
29 SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION SHALL ISSUE A REPORT TO THE
30 CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE APPROPRIATIONS

1 COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE AND THE CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY
2 CHAIRPERSON OF THE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF

12 (4) THE TOTAL PAYMENTS MADE TO ALL STATE UNIVERSITIES
13 UNDER THIS SECTION.

14 (E) DEFINITIONS.--AS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE FOLLOWING
15 WORDS AND PHRASES SHALL HAVE THE MEANINGS GIVEN TO THEM IN THIS
16 SUBSECTION UNLESS THE CONTEXT CLEARLY INDICATES OTHERWISE:

17 "FALL HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT." THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS ENROLLED
18 IN CREDIT-BEARING COURSES AND THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS ENROLLED IN
19 CLOCK-HOUR PROGRAMS.

20 "STATE UNIVERSITY." A UNIVERSITY WHICH IS PART OF THE STATE
21 SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION UNDER ARTICLE XX-A OF THE ACT OF
22 MARCH 10, 1949 (P.L.30, NO.14), KNOWN AS THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CODE

4 MONEY RECEIVED UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF ARTICLE III OF THE TAX
5 REFORM CODE OF 1971 TO THE PROPERTY TAX RELIEF FUND. IF THE
6 SECRETARY OF THE BUDGET DETERMINES A TRANSFER IS NECESSARY,
7 THE SECRETARY OF THE BUDGET SHALL ISSUE A REVISED

18 OTHER FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR PROPERTY TAX RELIEF PAYMENTS.

16 (11) FROM FUNDS DEPOSITED IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT
17 CAPITAL PROJECT LOAN FUND, \$2,000,000 SHALL BE TRANSFERRED
18 INTO THE GENERAL FUND.

19 (12) FROM FUNDS DEPOSITED IN THE MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT
20 LOAN FUND, \$5,000,000 SHALL BE TRANSFERRED INTO THE GENERAL
21 FUND.

22 (13) FROM FUNDS DEPOSITED IN THE MEDICAL MARIJUANA

5 (18) FROM FUNDS DEPOSITED IN THE RECYCLING FUND,
6 \$50,000,000 SHALL BE TRANSFERRED INTO THE GENERAL FUND.

7 (19) FROM FUNDS DEPOSITED IN THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION
8 SECURITY FUND, \$185,000,000 SHALL BE TRANSFERRED INTO THE
9 GENERAL FUND.

10 SECTION 17. THIS ACT SHALL APPLY AS FOLLOWS:

11 (1) THE AMENDMENT OF SECTION 111-C OF THE ACT SHALL
12 APPLY RETROACTIVELY TO MAY 29, 2020.

13 (2) THE AMENDMENT OF ARTICLES XVII-L AND XVII-M OF THE
14 ACT SHALL APPLY RETROACTIVELY TO JULY 1, 2020.

15 SECTION 18. THE PROVISIONS OF 4 PA.C.S. §§ 13A03, 13B03,
16 13C03, 13F07 AND 3303 ARE REPEALED INsofar AS THEY ARE
17 INCONSISTENT WITH THE ADDITION OF SECTION 1724.1-E(F) OF THE
18 ACT.

19 SECTION 19. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.
