## AN ACT

Amending the act of June 24, 1968 (P.L.237, No.111), entitled "An act specifically authorizing collective bargaining 2 between policemen and firemen and their public employers; 3 providing for arbitration in order to settle disputes, and 4 requiring compliance with collective bargaining agreements 5 and findings of arbitrators," further providing for powers 6 and procedures regarding arbitration. 7 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 6 of the act of June 24, 1968 (P.L.237, 11 No.111), referred to as the Policemen and Firemen Collective 12 Bargaining Act, is amended to read: 13 Section 6. (a) Each of the arbitrators selected in accordance with section 4 [hereof] shall have the power to 14 15 administer oaths and compel the attendance of witnesses and 16 physical evidence by subpoena. 17 (b) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c), a 18 hearing at which evidence of record is presented by a party or

witness under this act shall be open to the public. The

- 1 (1) All documents and evidence of record submitted by a
- 2 party at the public hearing shall be public records subject to
- 3 disclosure under the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3),
- 4 known as the Right-to-Know Law.
- 5 (2) A stenographic recording of the public hearing shall be
- 6 made.
- 7 (c) Subsection (b) shall not apply to:
- 8 (1) A bargaining session between the parties conducted
- 9 <u>before the hearing.</u>
- 10 (2) An executive session.
- 11 (3) Other meetings between the arbitrators conducted before,
- 12 <u>during or after the hearing.</u>
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
