1 2 3	Amending Title 27 (Environmental Resources) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in environmental protection, providing for polystyrene food container prohibition.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 27 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

3	<u>§ 4301. Purpose.</u>
4	The intent of this chapter is to reduce the adverse
5	environmental impact of polystyrene food containers by
6	prohibiting a food establishment from dispensing prepared food
7	to a customer in a polystyrene food service container.
8	<u>§ 4302. Definitions.</u>
9	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
10	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
11	context clearly indicates otherwise:
12	"Department." The Department of Environmental Protection of
13	the Commonwealth.
14	"Food establishment." All sales outlets, stores, shops or
15	other places of business located within this Commonwealth which
16	operate primarily to sell or convey food directly to the
17	ultimate consumer, which food is predominately contained,
18	wrapped or held in or on packaging. The term shall include, but
19	not be limited to, any place where food is prepared, mixed,
20	cooked, baked, smoked, preserved, bottled, packaged, handled,
21	stored, manufactured and sold or offered for sale, including,
22	but not limited to, any fixed or mobile restaurant, drive-in,
23	coffee shop, cafeteria, short order cafe, delicatessen,
24	luncheonette, grill, sandwich shop, soda fountain, tavern, bar,
25	cocktail lounge, nightclub, roadside stand, prepared food take-
26	out place, industrial feeding establishment, catering kitchen,
27	commissary, grocery store, public food market, food stand or
28	similar place in which food or drink is prepared for sale or for
29	service on the premises or elsewhere, and any other
30	establishment or operation, including homes, where food is

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1	processed, prepared, stored, served or provided for the public
2	for charge.
3	"Polystyrene food service container." As follows:
4	(1) A single-use polystyrene foam food service container
5	such as a cup, bowl, plate and clamshell-style container in
6	addition to a foam cooler that is not encased in another
7	material.
8	(2) A single-use polystyrene solid plastic food
9	<u>container such as a cup, bowl, plate, clamshell-style</u>
10	container, cutlery, straw and cup lid.
11	"Prepared food." Food or beverage prepared for public
12	consumption by a food establishment using any cooking or food
13	preparation technique. The term does not include raw or uncooked
14	meat, fish or eggs, provided for public consumption without
15	further food preparation.
16	"Retailer." A person that purchases or receives products
17	from any source for the purpose of sale to a consumer.
18	<u>§ 4303. Prohibition.</u>
19	(a) Food establishmentA food establishment is prohibited
20	from the following:
21	(1) Dispensing prepared food in or on a polystyrene food
22	service container.
23	(2) Selling, giving or providing eating utensils or
24	straws composed of polystyrene.
25	(b) RetailerA retailer is prohibited from selling, giving
26	or providing a polystyrene food service container except for the
27	following:
28	<u>(1) Meat trays.</u>
29	(2) Egg cartons.
30	(3) Packing materials.

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1	<u>§ 4304. Complaints.</u>	
2	The department shall prescribe a procedure for a person to	
3	file a complaint with the department for a violation of this	
4	<u>chapter.</u>	
5	<u>§ 4305. Compliance.</u>	
6	The department shall develop and maintain a publicly	
7	accessible Internet website with all of the following:	
8	(1) A description of the information necessary to comply	
9	with the prohibition under section 4303 (relating to	
10	prohibition).	
11	(2) A description of the procedure to file a complaint	
12	with the department for a violation of the prohibition under	
13	section 4304 (relating to complaints).	
14	<u>§ 4306. Regulations.</u>	
15	The department may promulgate rules and regulations necessary	
16	to implement the provisions of this chapter.	
17	<u>§ 4307. Penalties.</u>	
18	(a) ImpositionThe department may impose a civil penalty	
19	in the following amounts for a violation of this chapter:	
20	<u>(1) For a first violation, \$500.</u>	
21	<u>(2) For a second violation, \$1,000.</u>	
22	(3) For a third or subsequent violation, \$2,000.	
23	(b) PaymentAny civil penalty collected under subsection	
24	(a) shall be paid to the department.	
25	(c) Local lawThis chapter shall preempt any ordinance or	
26	resolution passed or adopted by any political subdivision that	
27	is effective on or before or after the effective date of this	
28	chapter to the extent that the ordinance or resolution conflicts	
29	or is inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter.	
30	<u>§ 4308. Applicability.</u>	
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- 1 <u>This act shall apply to transactions consummated after</u>
- 2 <u>December 31, 2018.</u>
- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
