AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled "An act relating to the finances of the State government; 2 providing for cancer control, prevention and research, for 3 ambulatory surgical center data collection, for the Joint 4 Underwriting Association, for entertainment business financial management firms, for private dam financial assurance and for reinstatement of item vetoes; providing for 7 the settlement, assessment, collection, and lien of taxes, 8 bonus, and all other accounts due the Commonwealth, the 9 collection and recovery of fees and other money or property 10 due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 11 including escheated property and the proceeds of its sale, the custody and disbursement or other disposition of funds 12 13 and securities belonging to or in the possession of the 14 15 Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims against the Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and appeals to the 16 courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to the Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth and 17 18 19 all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 20 and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth, 21 authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes 22 to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of 23 section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of 24 25 Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of 26 certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every department, board, commission, and officer of the State 27 government, every political subdivision of the State, and 28 certain officers of such subdivisions, every person, 29

association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws 2 imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or 3 other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 4 every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the 5 Commonwealth, "in general budget implementation, further providing for Department of Human Services; and providing for 7 2022-2023 budget implementation. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: 11 Section 1. Section 1729-E of the act of April 9, 1929 12 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, is amended by 13 adding a paragraph to read: Section 1729-E. Department of Human Services. 14 15 The following shall apply to appropriations for the Department of Human Services: 16 * * * 17 18 (8) The following shall apply: 19 (i) The reimbursement rate for personal assistance 20 services under the Office of Long-Term Living within the 21 department and a community-based waiver shall be no less 22 than the established fee-for-service rate under the 23 Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1987 (Public Law 24 100-203, 101 Stat. 1330). 25 (ii) The department shall establish fee schedule rate payments that are consistent with efficiency, 26 27 economy and quality of care and are sufficient to enlist 28 providers to make services available to at least the 29 general population in a geographic area. 30 (iii) The department shall update the data every

(iii) The department shall update the data every
three years. After the data is updated, the department
shall transmit a summary of the data to the Legislative
Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania

Bulletin for public comment.

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1	<u>(iv) Using a market-based approach, the department</u>
2	shall examine and use data relating to the following
3	<pre>factors:</pre>
4	(A) The service needs of the individuals.
5	(B) Staff wages, including education, experience
6	and licensure and certification requirements.
7	(C) Staff-related expenses, including benefits,
8	training, recruitment and supervision.
9	(D) Productivity of staff, including the amount
10	of service delivered relative to the level of
11	staffing provided.
12	(E) The cost related to occupying a space,
13	including rent, taxes, insurance, depreciation and
14	amortization expenses.
15	(F) Direct and indirect program-related and
16	administration-related expenses.
17	(G) Geographic costs based on the location where
18	the home and community-based service is provided.
19	(H) Federally approved home and community-based
20	services definitions in the waiver and determinations
21	made about cost components that reflect reasonable
22	and necessary costs related to the delivery of each
23	home and community-based service.
24	(I) The cost of implementing applicable Federal
25	and local laws.
26	(J) Other factors that impact cost.
27	(v) The department shall establish a fee schedule
28	that reimburses an agency-employer for paid overtime to
29	align agency-employers with consumer-employers.
