AN ACT

1 2 4 5 6 7 8	Amending the act of March 23, 1972 (P.L.136, No.52), entitled "An act relating to the practice of psychology, providing for licensing of psychologists, making certain acts illegal and providing penalties," further providing for definitions; and providing for conditional prescription certificate, for prescription certificate, for prescribing practices, for prescriptive authority and for coordination with State Board of Pharmacy.
9	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
10	hereby enacts as follows:
11	Section 1. Section 2 of the act of March 23, 1972 (P.L.136,
12	No.52), known as the Professional Psychologists Practice Act, is
13	amended by adding definitions to read:
14	Section 2. DefinitionsAs used in this act:
15	* * *
16	"Collaborative relationship" means a cooperative working
17	relationship between a prescribing psychologist and a patient's
18	primary health care provider in the provision of patient care,
19	including cooperation in the management and delivery of physical
20	and mental health care, to ensure optimal patient care.

2	"Conditional prescription certificate" means a certificate_
3	issued by the board to a licensed psychologist that permits the
4	holder to prescribe psychotropic medication under the direction
5	of a licensed physician or a prescribing psychologist in
6	accordance with section 6.1.
7	"Controlled substance" means any drug, substance or immediate_
8	precursor included in Schedules I through V under the act of
9	April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as "The Controlled
10	Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act."
11	<u>"Drug" means a drug:</u>
12	(i) limited by the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (52
13	Stat. 1040, 21 U.S.C. § 301 et seq.) to being dispensed by
14	prescription; and
15	(ii) the product label of which is required to contain the
16	following statement: "CAUTION: FEDERAL LAW PROHIBITS DISPENSING
17	WITHOUT A PRESCRIPTION."
18	* * *
19	"Prescribing psychologist" means a licensed psychologist who
20	holds a valid prescription certificate.
21	"Prescription" means any written or oral order issued by a
22	licensed physician in the course of professional practice for a
23	controlled substance, other drug or device or medication which
24	is dispensed for use by a patient. Except for opioid antagonists
25	used to treat opioid addiction, the term does not include any
26	written or oral order for a Schedule II controlled substance.
27	"Prescription certificate" means any document issued by the
28	board that permits the holder to prescribe psychotropic
29	medication in accordance with section 6.2.
30	"Prescriptive authority" means any of the following:
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1	(i) The authority to prescribe, administer, discontinue or
2	distribute without charge a drug or controlled substance
3	recognized or customarily used in the diagnosis, treatment and
4	management of an individual's psychiatric, mental, cognitive,
5	<u>nervous, developmental, emotional or behavioral disorder.</u>
6	(ii) The authority to order and review laboratory tests in
7	conjunction with a prescription under subclause (i) or any other
8	procedure directly related to the laboratory tests within the
9	scope of practice of psychology in accordance with the rules and
10	regulations of the board.
11	"Psychopharmacology clinical experience" means a period of
12	supervised clinical training and practice in which clinical
13	diagnoses and interventions are learned as authorized by a
14	conditional prescription certificate.
15	"Psychotropic medication" means a medicine that is not
16	dispensed or administered without a prescription and has been
17	explicitly approved by the United States Food and Drug
18	Administration for the treatment of a mental disorder as defined
19	by the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders,
20	Fifth Edition (DSM-5-TR) or the International Classification of
21	Diseases, 11th Revision.
22	Section 2. The act is amended by adding sections to read:
23	Section 6.1. Conditional Prescription Certificate(a) An
24	applicant for a conditional prescription certificate shall be
25	qualified for a conditional prescription certificate after
26	submission of proof satisfactory to the board that the applicant
27	meets all of the following requirements:
28	(1) Has a current license to practice psychology in this
29	Commonwealth.
30	(2) Has a doctoral degree in psychology from an accredited
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1 <u>college or university.</u>

2	(3) Has a master's degree in clinical psychopharmacology
3	from an accredited college or university. For the purpose of the
4	education requirement under this clause, the necessary
5	prerequisites for the education requirement shall be determined
6	by the accredited college or university and, in the judgment of
7	the accredited college or university, shall include sufficient
8	biomedical education to ensure the necessary knowledge and
9	skills to prescribe psychotropic medications in a safe manner.
10	The didactic portion of the education shall consist of an
11	appropriate number of hours to ensure acquisition of the
12	necessary knowledge and skills to prescribe in a safe and
13	effective manner. The coursework shall include, but not be
14	limited to, the following core areas of instruction:
15	<u>(i) Basic life science.</u>
16	<u>(ii) Anatomy.</u>
17	<u>(iii) Physiology.</u>
18	(iv) Neuroscience.
19	(v) Clinical and research pharmacology and
20	psychopharmacology.
21	(vi) Clinical medicine and pathophysiology.
22	(vii) Physical assessment and laboratory exams.
23	(viii) Clinical pharmacotherapeutics.
24	(ix) Research.
25	(x) Professional, ethical and legal issues.
26	(4) Has passed a national certification examination approved
27	by the board that tests the applicant's general knowledge of
28	pharmacology in the diagnosis, care and treatment of mental
29	<u>disorders.</u>
30	(5) Possesses professional liability insurance that will

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1	cover the psychologist during the period that the conditional
2	prescription certificate is in effect.
3	(6) Within five years preceding the date of the application,
4	has been certified by the applicant's supervising physician as
5	having completed psychopharmacology clinical experience in
6	accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the
7	board sufficient to attain competency in psychopharmacological
8	treatments. The clinical experience required under this clause
9	shall include the treatment of at least one hundred patients and
10	four hundred direct contact clinical hours.
11	(7) Meets any other requirements specified in the rules and
12	regulations of the board.
13	(b) A conditional prescription certificate shall be valid
14	for a period of four years. Upon the elapse of the four-year
15	period, the holder of the conditional prescription certificate
16	may apply for a renewal of the conditional prescription
17	certificate.
18	(c) A holder of a conditional prescription certificate may
19	prescribe psychotropic medications under the supervision of a
20	licensed physician or prescribing psychologist under the
21	following conditions:
22	(1) The holder shall continue to maintain a license to
23	practice psychology in this Commonwealth and the professional
24	liability insurance that covers prescribing practices.
25	(2) The holder shall inform the board of the name of the
26	supervising licensed physician or prescribing psychologist and
27	promptly inform the board of any change of the supervising
28	licensed physician or prescribing psychologist.
29	Section 6.2. Prescription Certificate(a) An applicant
30	for a prescription certificate shall qualify for a prescription
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1	certificate after submission of proof satisfactory to the board
2	that the applicant meets all of the following requirements:
3	(1) Possesses a conditional prescription certificate and has
4	successfully completed two years of prescribing psychotropic
5	medication as certified by the supervising licensed physician or
6	prescribing psychologist under section 6.1(c).
7	(2) Holds a current license to practice psychology in this
8	Commonwealth.
9	(3) Possesses professional liability insurance that covers
10	the prescribing of psychotropic medication.
11	(4) Meets any other requirements specified in the rules and
12	regulations of the board.
13	(b) An applicant for a prescription certificate who holds
14	prescriptive authority as a psychologist in another state with
15	requirements for prescriptive authority equivalent to the
16	requirements in this Commonwealth as deemed by the board may be
17	exempt from the requirements under subsection (a)(1) if the
18	applicant practiced psychology in this Commonwealth for at least
19	five years without a founded or unresolved disciplinary action.
20	The board may, at its discretion, require the applicant to
21	complete supplemental education or training to attain a
22	prescription certificate.
23	(c) The board shall promulgate rules and regulations for
24	procedures to renew the prescription certificate. A prescribing
25	psychologist shall complete a minimum of sixteen hours of
26	continuing medical education per renewal period relevant to the
27	practice of the prescribing psychologist.
28	Section 6.3. Prescribing Practices(a) A prescribing
29	psychologist may do any of the following:
30	(1) Prescribe, orally or in writing, administer, discontinue

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1	or distribute without charge a psychotropic medication or
2	controlled substance recognized or customarily used in the
3	diagnosis, treatment and management of an individual with any
4	psychiatric, mental, cognitive, nervous, emotional or behavioral
5	<u>disorder.</u>
6	(2) Order and review laboratory tests in conjunction with a
7	prescription under clause (1) or any other procedure directly
8	related to the laboratory tests within the scope of practice of
9	psychology in accordance with the rules and regulations of the
10	board.
11	(b) A prescription under subsection (a)(1) shall meet all of
12	the following requirements:
13	(1) Be relevant to the practice of psychology or another
14	procedure directly related to the practice of psychology.
15	(2) Be within the scope of the prescribing psychologist's
16	license and prescription certificate.
17	(3) Be within the scope of training or specialization of the
18	prescribing psychologist.
19	(4) Be prescribed only to a patient who has identified a
20	primary health care provider.
21	(5) Be prescribed in accordance with a collaborative
22	relationship with a licensed physician, an advanced practice
23	<u>nurse or a licensed physician's assistant.</u>
24	(6) Be identified as written in accordance with the rules
25	and regulations of the board.
26	(7) Comply with all applicable Federal and State laws and
27	regulations.
28	(c) A licensed psychologist may not issue a prescription
29	under subsection (a)(1) unless the licensed psychologist holds a
30	prescription certificate. A prescribing psychologist may not
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1	prescribe a narcotic, except an opioid antagonist approved by
2	the United States Food and Drug Administration for the treatment
3	of drug addiction or the prevention of relapse of drug
4	addiction.
5	(d) The prescribing psychologist shall maintain a
6	collaborative relationship with the primary health care provider
7	of the patient. The prescribing psychologist shall maintain a
8	record of all prescriptions under subsection (a)(1) in the
9	patient's record. The prescribing psychologist may not delegate
10	the authority to prescribe to the patient under this section to
11	any other person.
12	<u>Section 6.4. Prescriptive Authority(a) Upon receipt of</u>
13	prescriptive authority, a licensed psychologist shall, in a
14	timely manner, file the licensed psychologist's Drug Enforcement
15	Agency (DEA) registration number with the board.
16	(b) The board shall maintain current records of each
17	licensed psychologist who has prescriptive authority, including
18	each licensed psychologist's DEA registration number.
19	Section 6.5. Coordination with State Board of Pharmacy(a)
20	The board shall transmit an initial list of each licensed
21	psychologist who has prescriptive authority, including all of
22	the following information:
23	(1) The name of each licensed psychologist.
24	(2) The identification number assigned by the board for each
25	licensed psychologist.
26	(3) The effective date of prescriptive authority.
27	(b) The board shall, in a timely manner, transmit any
28	addition to the initial list under subsection (a) to the State
29	Board of Pharmacy. The board shall, in a timely manner, notify
30	the State Board of Pharmacy upon the termination, suspension or

- 3 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
