- "Current fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1,
- 14 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.
- 15 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau
- 16 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant
- 17 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,
- 18 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,
- 19 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,
- 20 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and
- 21 other assistants in a department, board or commission.
- "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding
- 23 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,
- 24 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and
- 25 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage,
- 26 telecommunication devices and telecommunication rentals and toll
- 27 charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising
- 28 by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water,
- 29 minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of
- 30 equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and

- 1 equipment, premiums on workers' compensation, insurance premiums
- 2 on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on
- 3 medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer
- 4 workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee
- 5 and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance,
- 6 payment of Commonwealth share of Social Security taxes and
- 7 unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the
- 8 purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery
- 9 and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment
- 10 to the Department of General Services of mileage and other
- 11 charges for the use of motor vehicles and rental payments for
- 12 permanently assigned motor vehicles and of expenses or costs of
- 13 services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term
- 14 "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the
- 15 treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must
- 16 be transferred to an outside hospital, provided that in no case
- 17 shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that
- 18 provided under the State medical assistance program.
- "Prior fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1 of the
- 20 fiscal year immediately prior to the current fiscal year.
