5	(a) AuthorizationExcept for the limitations under
6	subsection (b), a borough, city, township or town may enact an
7	ordinance providing for conditions, prohibitions and limitations
8	on the use of consumer fireworks that are not in conflict with
9	Article XXIV of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as
10	the Tax Reform Code of 1971. Notwithstanding a valid license
11	issued by the department on the effective date of this section,
12	<u>a borough, city, township or town may enact an ordinance</u>
13	providing for conditions, prohibitions and limitations on the
14	sale of consumer fireworks that are not in conflict with Article
15	XXIV of the Tax Reform Code of 1971.
16	(b) OrdinancesThe ordinance permitted under subsection
17	(a) shall comply with the provisions of use and sale of consumer
18	fireworks under Article XXIV of the Tax Reform Code of 1971 and
19	provide for the following:
20	(1) A person may only use consumer fireworks between the
21	hours of 10:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. on Sunday through Thursday
22	and 10:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. on Friday and Saturday, except:
23	(i) When July 4 is a Friday or Saturday, consumer
24	fireworks may be used until midnight and an additional
25	hour into the following day before consumer fireworks can
26	resume in accordance with the time frames set forth under
27	this paragraph;
28	(ii) When July 4 is a Sunday through Thursday,
29	consumer fireworks may be used until midnight;
30	(iii) On Memorial Day and Labor Day, consumer

1	fireworks may be used until midnight; and
2	(iv) On December 31, consumer fireworks may be used
3	until midnight and an additional hour into the following
4	day before consumer fireworks can resume in accordance
5	with the time frames set forth under this paragraph.
6	(2) A facility licensed by the department under section
7	2408 of the Tax Reform Code of 1971 shall conspicuously post
8	or provide written notice with each purchase of consumer
9	fireworks that provides the conditions and prohibitions for
10	use of consumer fireworks under section 2404 of the Tax
11	Reform Code of 1971, notification of the provisions under
12	paragraph (1) providing for hours and times of usage and that
13	additional conditions, prohibitions and limitations may be
14	implemented by a borough, city, township or town.
15	(c) PenaltiesA person using consumer fireworks in
16	violation of the provisions of this subchapter commits:
17	(1) For the first offense, a summary offense and, upon
18	conviction, shall, in addition to any other penalty
19	authorized by law, be punishable by a fine of not less than
20	<u>\$100 nor more than \$500.</u>
21	(2) A subsequent offense under this subsection committed
22	within one year of a prior conviction under this paragraph
23	shall constitute a misdemeanor of the third degree and, upon
24	conviction, shall, in addition to any other penalty
25	authorized by law, be punishable by a fine of not less than
26	<u>\$500 and not more than \$1000.</u>
27	(d) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
28	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
