AN ACT

Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in COVID-19 disaster emergency, 2 providing for certain public events not subject to shutdowns 3 by government. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: 8 § 5702. Certain public events not subject to shutdowns by 9 10 government. 11 (a) General rule. -- Notwithstanding the provisions of section 12 7301 (relating to general authority of Governor) or any other <u>law to the contrary, during the COVID-</u>19 disaster emergency, 13 14 neither the Commonwealth nor any municipality may restrict or 15 impose a limitation through an executive order, proclamation, 16 regulation, resolution or ordinance or other official action, including through means of a color code system or otherwise, on 17 the number of individuals who may lawfully gather or assemble 18

during any of the following events conducted on public or

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- 1 private property:
- 2 <u>(1)</u> Fairs.
- 3 (2) Amusement rides and attractions, including
- 4 <u>recreational activities in pools or bodies of water.</u>
- 5 <u>(3) Fire department carnivals.</u>
- 6 (4) Religious worship, including weddings, funerals,
- 7 <u>other religious rituals and religious socials.</u>
- 8 (5) Family reunions and birthday parties.
- 9 <u>(6) Festivals on public streets.</u>
- 10 (7) Fishing and hunting tournaments.
- 11 (8) Animal exhibitions, including dog shows, State 4-H
- 12 <u>Club shows and Future Farmers of America shows.</u>
- 13 <u>(9) Flea markets, farmers markets and garage sales.</u>
- 14 <u>(10) Other similar events.</u>
- 15 (b) Nonapplicability. -- Subsection (a) shall not apply to
- 16 occupancy permits issued prior to March 6, 2020, insofar as the
- 17 occupancy permits place a maximum limitation of the number of
- 18 individuals permitted to occupy a premises, such as a
- 19 restaurant, bar or other retail establishment where food,
- 20 beverages or goods or services are offered for sale to the
- 21 public.
- 22 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
