AN ACT

Amending the act of February 11, 1998 (P.L.58, No.15), entitled "An act providing for the regulation of combustible and flammable liquids; allocating functions of the Department of 3 Labor and Industry and the Pennsylvania State Police; 4 imposing penalties; and making repeals," further providing 5 for regulations. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 4(d) of the act of February 11, 1998 10 (P.L.58, No.15), known as the Combustible and Flammable Liquids 11 Act, is amended by adding paragraphs to read: 12 Section 4. Regulations. 13 14 Operating requirements for attended self-service motor fuel-dispensing facilities .--15 16 17 (1.1) No later than July 1, 2016, each retail service 18 station must be capable of operating using an alternate generated power source for a minimum of 72 hours. Each retail 19 20 service station must have an alternate power source available

1	for operation no later than 24 hours after the declaration of
2	a disaster emergency as defined under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7102
3	(relating to definitions).
4	(1.2) The following shall apply:
5	(i) Each newly constructed or substantially
6	renovated retail service station for which a certificate
7	of occupancy is issued on or after July 1, 2015, must be
8	prewired with an appropriate transfer switch and capable
9	of operating all dispensing devices and equipment, life-
10	safety systems and payment-acceptance equipment using an
11	alternate generated power source.
12	(ii) Each retail service station subject to this
13	<pre>paragraph must keep:</pre>
14	(A) a copy of the certificate of occupancy on
15	site or at the retail service station's corporate
16	headquarters; and
17	(B) a written statement attesting to the
18	periodic testing of and ensured operational
19	capability of the equipment.
20	(iii) The documents required under subparagraph (ii)
21	must be made available, upon request, to the Pennsylvania
22	Emergency Management Agency and to the county emergency
23	management coordinator where the retail service station
24	is located.
25	(iv) For purposes of this paragraph, the term
26	"substantially renovated" means a renovation that results
27	in an increase of greater than 50% in the assessed value
28	of the retail service station.
29	(1.3) No later than July 1, 2015, each of the following
30	retail service stations which are located within one-half

1	mile proximate to an Interstate highway or federally or
2	State-designated evacuation route must be prewired with an
3	appropriate transfer switch and be capable of operating all
4	dispensing devices and equipment, life-safety systems and
5	payment-acceptance equipment using an alternate generated
6	<pre>power source within 24 hours:</pre>
7	(i) A retail service station:
8	(A) located in a county with a population of at
9	<pre>least 300,000, based on the most recent Federal</pre>
10	decennial census; and
11	(B) which has at least 16 fuel-dispensing
12	devices.
13	(ii) A retail service station:
14	(A) located in a county with a population of at
15	<pre>least 100,000, but less than 300,000, based on the</pre>
16	most recent Federal decennial census; and
17	(B) which has at least 12 fuel-dispensing
18	devices.
19	(iii) A retail service station:
20	(A) located in a county with a population of at
21	<pre>least 100,000, based on the most recent Federal</pre>
22	decennial census; and
23	(B) which has at least eight fuel-dispensing
24	devices.
25	(1.4) Installation of an appropriate wiring and transfer
26	switch required under this subsection must be performed by a
27	certified electrical contractor.
