AN ACT

- 1 Providing for retaining health care innovations during the
- 2 COVID-19 pandemic and imposing duties on the Joint State
- 3 Government Commission.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Retaining
- 8 Health Care Innovations Act.
- 9 Section 2. Purposes.
- 10 This act provides legal authority for administrative
- 11 flexibilities to continue despite the termination or expiration
- 12 of the COVID-19 disaster declaration and requires the
- 13 development of recommendations to retain innovations adopted
- 14 during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 15 Section 3. Definitions.
- 16 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 17 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

- 1 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 2 "Administrative flexibilities." As follows:
- 3 (1) Executive orders, proclamations or regulations
- 4 issued, amended or rescinded under the COVID-19 disaster
- 5 declaration as authorized by 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(b) (relating
- 6 to general authority of Governor).
- 7 (2) The term includes changes to policies, procedures
- 8 and practices adopted by State administrative agencies to
- 9 assist health care facilities, FEDERALLY QUALIFIED HEALTH
- 10 CENTERS, RURAL HEALTH CLINICS, health care practitioners and
- 11 health care providers in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 12 "Commission." The Joint State Government Commission.
- "COVID-19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an infectious
- 14 disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus
- 15 2 that was first identified during December 2019 in Wuhan,
- 16 China.
- "COVID-19 disaster declaration." The proclamation of
- 18 disaster emergency issued by the Governor on March 6, 2020,
- 19 published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and renewed on June <---
- 20 3, AUGUST 29, 2020, and any renewal of the state of disaster <--
- 21 emergency, to address COVID-19, in accordance with 35 Pa.C.S. §
- 22 7301(c).
- "Extension period." The one-year 90-DAY period from the date <--
- 24 of the termination or expiration of the COVID-19 disaster
- 25 declaration during which administrative flexibilities provided
- 26 to health care facilities and health care practitioners remain
- 27 in force.
- 28 "FEDERALLY QUALIFIED HEALTH CENTER." A HEALTH CENTER AS

- 29 DEFINED IN SECTION 1861(AA)(4) OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT (49
- 30 STAT. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 1395X(AA)(4)).

- 1 "Health care facility." As defined in section 103 OR 802.1 <-
- 2 of the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the
- 3 Health Care Facilities Act.
- 4 "Health care practitioner." As defined in section 103 of the
- 5 Health Care Facilities Act.
- 6 "Health care provider." As defined in section 103 of the
- 7 Health Care Facilities Act.
- 8 "RURAL HEALTH CLINIC." A CLINIC AS DEFINED IN SECTION

- 9 1861(AA)(2) OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT.
- 10 Section 4. Administrative flexibilities.
- 11 (a) Authorization. -- Administrative flexibilities provided to
- 12 a health care facility, FEDERALLY QUALIFIED HEALTH CENTER, RURAL <--
- 13 HEALTH CLINIC, health care practitioner or a health care
- 14 provider and adopted under the authority of the COVID-19
- 15 disaster declaration shall be extended through the extension
- 16 period or until the Joint State Government Commission issues a <--
- 17 report in accordance with section 6, whichever is later.
- 18 (b) Emergency operations plan. -- A health care facility may
- 19 take advantage of administrative flexibilities during the
- 20 extension period even if the emergency operations plan of the
- 21 health care facility is closed.
- 22 Section 5. Advisory committee.
- 23 In developing the report under section 6, the commission
- 24 shall establish an advisory committee comprised of, but not
- 25 limited to, the following individuals:
- 26 (1) A representative recommended by the Department of
- Health.
- 28 (2) A representative recommended by the Department of
- 29 Human Services.
- 30 (3) A representative recommended by the Bureau of

- 1 Professional and Occupational Affairs of the Department of
- 2 State.
- 3 (4) A representative recommended by the Hospital and
- 4 Healthsystem Association of Pennsylvania.
- 5 (5) A representative recommended by the Pennsylvania
- 6 Medical Society.
- 7 (6) A representative recommended by the Rehabilitation
- 8 and Community Providers Association.
- 9 (7) A representative recommended by the Pennsylvania
- 10 State Nurses Association.
- 11 (8) A representative recommended by LeadingAge PA.
- 12 (9) A representative recommended by the Pennsylvania
- 13 Health Care Association.
- 14 (10) A representative recommended by the Pennsylvania
- 15 Association of Community Health Centers.
- 16 (11) A representative recommended by the Pennsylvania
- 17 Psychiatric Society.
- 18 (12) A REPRESENTATIVE RECOMMENDED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA
- 19 HEALTH LAW PROJECT.
- 20 (13) AN INDIVIDUAL WITH A PHYSICAL DISABILITY WHO
- 21 PROVIDES SUPPORT THROUGH THE CENTER FOR INDEPENDENT LIVING.
- 22 (14) A REPRESENTATIVE RECOMMENDED BY THE SERVICE
- 23 EMPLOYEES INTERNATIONAL UNION HEALTHCARE PENNSYLVANIA.
- 24 (15) A REPRESENTATIVE RECOMMENDED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA
- 25 ASSOCIATION OF STAFF NURSES AND ALLIED PROFESSIONALS.
- 26 (16) A REPRESENTATIVE RECOMMENDED BY THE NURSES OF
- 27 PENNSYLVANIA.
- 28 (17) A REPRESENTATIVE RECOMMENDED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA
- 29 ASSOCIATION OF MANAGED CARE ORGANIZATIONS.
- 30 (18) A REPRESENTATIVE RECOMMENDED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA

- 1 COALITION OF AFFILIATED HEALTHCARE AND LIVING COMMUNITIES.
- 2 (19) A REPRESENTATIVE RECOMMENDED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA
- 3 HOME CARE ASSOCIATION.
- 4 (20) A REPRESENTATIVE RECOMMENDED BY THE COALITION FOR
- 5 THE COMMONHEALTH.
- 6 (21) A REPRESENTATIVE RECOMMENDED BY THE PENNSYLVANIA
- 7 MENTAL HEALTH CONSUMERS' ASSOCIATION.
- 8 (22) A REPRESENTATIVE RECOMMENDED BY A BEHAVIORAL HEALTH
- 9 ADVOCATE ORGANIZATION.
- 10 (23) A REPRESENTATIVE RECOMMENDED BY THE NATIONAL
- 11 ALLIANCE FOR MENTAL ILLNESS KEYSTONE PENNSYLVANIA.
- 12 (12) (24) Any other representatives from other

- organizations that are deemed appropriate by the commission.
- 14 Section 6. Report.
- 15 (a) Duty of commission. -- The commission shall perform an
- 16 analysis of the administrative flexibilities described in
- 17 section 4 and issue a report to the General Assembly at least <--
- 18 180 days prior to the expiration of the extension period.
- 19 (b) Contents of report. -- The report under this section
- 20 shall, at a minimum:
- 21 (1) Describe the administrative flexibilities granted
- 22 under the COVID-19 disaster declaration.
- 23 (2) Describe the impact of each administrative
- flexibility on patient access and quality of care.
- 25 (3) Describe the financial impact of each administrative
- 26 flexibility on both the Commonwealth and the health care
- 27 facilities, health care practitioners and health care
- 28 providers affected by the waivers.
- 29 (4) Include recommendations to the General Assembly on
- 30 whether the administrative flexibilities should be

- 1 maintained.
- 2 Section 7. Limitations.
- 3 Nothing in this act shall require the Commonwealth to
- 4 maintain administrative flexibilities that would violate Federal
- 5 law or disqualify the Commonwealth from receiving Federal
- 6 matching funds for Medicaid services.
- 7 SECTION 8. CONSTRUCTION.
- 8 NOTHING IN THIS ACT SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO PROHIBIT A STATE

- 9 ADMINISTRATIVE AGENCY FROM ENDING ANY WAIVER OR SUSPENSION OF
- 10 REGULATIONS DEEMED TO BE NO LONGER NECESSARY DURING THE PERIOD
- 11 OF THE COVID-19 DISASTER DECLARATION.
- 12 SECTION 9. APPLICABILITY.
- 13 THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT SHALL NOT APPLY TO ADMINISTRATIVE
- 14 FLEXIBILITIES NO LONGER IN EFFECT ON THE DATE THE COVID-19
- 15 DISASTER DECLARATION EXPIRES OR IS TERMINATED BY EXECUTIVE
- 16 ORDER, PROCLAMATION OR OPERATION OF LAW. IF A STATE
- 17 ADMINISTRATIVE AGENCY HAS SUBMITTED A PUBLIC NOTICE TO THE
- 18 LEGISLATION REFERENCE BUREAU FOR PUBLICATION IN THE PENNSYLVANIA
- 19 BULLETIN THAT PROVIDES FOR THE EXPIRATION OR TERMINATION DATE OF
- 20 AN ADMINISTRATIVE FLEXIBILITY BEFORE THE EXPIRATION OR
- 21 TERMINATION OF THE COVID-19 DISASTER DECLARATION, THE
- 22 ADMINISTRATIVE FLEXIBILITY SHALL BE DEEMED EXPIRED OR TERMINATED
- 23 FOR PURPOSES OF THIS ACT BEFORE THE END OF THE COVID-19 DISASTER
- 24 DECLARATION.
- 25 Section $\frac{8}{10}$ 10. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect immediately.
