8	Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
9	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 1 5903. Definitions.
- 2 § 5901. Scope of chapter.
- 3 This chapter relates to the promotion of a healthy
- 4 <u>environment that protects the public from the risks of toxic</u>
- 5 <u>herbicides by prohibiting their use on public grounds.</u>
- 6 § 5902. Findings and declarations.
- 7 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 8 (1) As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and in an
- 9 <u>effort to avoid spreading the virus as individuals shelter in</u>
- 10 place, unprecedented numbers of residents of all ages are
- 11 <u>seeking exercise, recreation and access to natural beauty in</u>
- the public grounds throughout this Commonwealth.
- 13 (2) It is imperative that public grounds be free of
- 14 <u>toxic substances, which have been shown in scientific studies</u>
- to cause disease and compromise immune systems.
- 16 (3) Healthy, sustainably and organically managed soils
- increase organic nutrients and soil microorganisms, allowing
- 18 grasses and other desirable plants to out-compete other plant
- 19 <u>species over time, ultimately resulting in a reduction of</u>
- weeds and pests.
- 21 (4) Implementation of organic land management practices
- 22 affirms the right of all residents to have access to healthy
- food and clean water, in addition to green space and healthy
- 24 waterways.
- 25 (5) Currently, some municipalities use synthetic
- herbicides throughout their public grounds.
- 27 (6) Scientific studies conducted by the World Health
- Organization, the National Academy of Sciences and the
- National Research Council, among others, have linked exposure
- 30 to certain toxic chemicals with asthma, cancer, developmental

- 1 and learning disabilities, nerve and immune system damage,
- 2 liver and kidney damage, reproductive impairment, birth
- 3 defects and disruption of the endocrine system and the
- 4 microbiome.
- 5 § 5903. Definitions.
- 6 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 7 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 8 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 9 "Advisory committee." The Advisory Committee on Healthy
- 10 Outdoor Public Grounds established under section 5912 (relating
- 11 to advisory committee).
- "Commonwealth agency." As defined in 62 Pa.C.S. § 103
- 13 <u>(relating to definitions).</u>
- 14 <u>"Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.</u>
- 15 "Municipality." A county, city, borough, incorporated town,
- 16 township, home rule municipality, optional plan municipality,
- 17 optional charter municipality or similar general purpose unit of
- 18 government that may be created or authorized by statute.
- "Organic land management." A problem-solving strategy that:
- 20 (1) Prioritizes the following:
- 21 (i) A natural and organic approach to turfgrass and
- landscape management.
- 23 (ii) The care of trees and shrubs without the use of
- 24 pesticides.
- 25 (2) Mandates the use of natural and organic practices
- that promote healthy soil and plant life as a preventative
- 27 <u>measure against the onset of turf and landscape pest</u>
- 28 problems.
- 29 <u>"Pesticide."</u> As follows:
- 30 (1) A substance or mixture of substances intended for

1	preventing, destroying, repelling or mitigating a plant,
2	insect or fungal pest.
3	(2) The term includes a herbicide, insecticide or
4	fungicide.
5	"Public grounds." As follows:
6	(1) Publicly owned land of this Commonwealth or a
7	municipality, including any of the following:
8	(i) A park.
9	(ii) A trail.
10	(iii) Open space.
11	(iv) A lawn.
12	(v) A recreation center.
13	(vi) A playground.
14	(vii) A sports or athletic field.
15	(viii) A golf course.
16	(ix) Other real property.
17	(2) The term does not include the following:
18	(i) The interior spaces of a building.
19	(ii) A parking lot.
20	(iii) Land or other real estate that is not open for
21	use by the general public.
22	"Synthetic herbicide." As follows:
23	(1) A herbicide containing a synthetic substance,
24	including any material or agent containing a synthetic
25	substance that harms, adversely affects or kills a plant.
26	(2) The term does not include a synthetic herbicide that
27	is allowed on the National List of Allowed Substances under
28	the Organic Foods Production Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-624,
29	104 Stat. 3935), as published by the National Organic
30	Standards Board in accordance with 7 CFR 205.601 (relating to

- 1 <u>synthetic substances allowed for use in organic crop</u>
- 2 <u>production</u>).
- 3 <u>"Synthetic substance."</u> As follows:
- 4 (1) A substance that is formulated or manufactured by a
- 5 <u>chemical process or by a process that chemically changes a</u>
- 6 <u>substance extracted from naturally occurring plant</u>, animal or
- 7 mineral sources.
- 8 (2) The term shall not apply to a substance created by
- 9 <u>naturally occurring biological processes.</u>

- 20 § 5911. Administration.
- 21 The department, in consultation and coordination with the
- 22 <u>Department of Agriculture</u>, the <u>Department of Environmental</u>
- 23 Protection and other relevant Commonwealth agencies, shall
- 24 <u>administer the provisions of this chapter.</u>
- 25 § 5912. Advisory committee.
- 26 (a) Establishment.--The department shall establish the
- 27 Advisory Committee on Healthy Outdoor Public Grounds.
- 28 (b) Composition.--The advisory committee shall consist of
- 29 individuals with knowledge and expertise in matters involving
- 30 public health, agriculture, environmental protection and

- 1 recreation.
- 2 (c) Powers and duties. -- The advisory committee shall:
- 3 (1) Consult with and provide technical assistance for
- 4 <u>Commonwealth agencies and municipalities regarding the</u>
- 5 <u>administration of this chapter.</u>
- 6 (2) Evaluate and make recommendations to the department
- 7 <u>regarding waivers requested under section 5913(b) (relating</u>
- 8 <u>to prohibited use of synthetic herbicides).</u>
- 9 § 5913. Prohibited use of synthetic herbicides.
- 10 (a) General rule. -- Except as provided in subsection (b), a
- 11 person may not use or apply synthetic herbicides on public
- 12 grounds.
- 13 (b) Exception. -- Upon request for a waiver by an applicant,
- 14 the department may authorize the use or application of a
- 15 synthetic herbicide on public grounds after receiving a
- 16 recommendation from the advisory committee, if the department
- 17 determines the following criteria are met regarding the use or
- 18 <u>application:</u>
- 19 <u>(1) The use or application is appropriate to address an</u>
- 20 emergency that:
- 21 (i) threatens the public health, safety or welfare
- of persons; or
- 23 (ii) involves an invasive species that threatens the
- overall health of the ecosystem and is necessary after
- 25 <u>organic methods prove insufficient.</u>
- 26 (2) The applicant has carefully evaluated all
- 27 <u>alternative methods and materials, including nonherbicide</u>
- 28 management tactics and nonsynthetic herbicides, and is
- 29 requesting to use the minimum amount of the least toxic and
- 30 most effective herbicide necessary.

- 1 (3) The person using or applying the synthetic herbicide
- will, to the greatest extent practical, minimize the impact
- 3 <u>of the application on abutting properties.</u>
- 4 (4) The authorized use or application of the synthetic
- 5 <u>herbicide will not be detrimental to the public's health,</u>
- 6 <u>safety or welfare.</u>
- 7 <u>(c) Application process.--</u>
- 8 (1) The department shall develop an application process
- 9 <u>for a waiver under subsection (b) that addresses the criteria</u>
- specified under subsection (b) (1), (2), (3) and (4).
- 11 (2) The application shall be posted on the publicly
- 12 <u>accessible Internet website of the department.</u>
- 13 § 5914. Advance posting of notice of anticipated pesticide use.
- 14 Each Commonwealth agency and municipality shall post signs
- 15 prominently providing notice in advance of the application of
- 16 pesticides. The following apply:
- 17 (1) The notice must include:
- 18 (i) The date that the pesticide application will be
- 19 occurring.
- 20 (ii) A contact number for questions.
- 21 (2) The signage must be posted 48 hours prior to the
- 22 pesticide application and remain for 72 hours after the
- 23 pesticide application.
- 24 § 5915. Organic land management.
- 25 <u>(a) Development.--The Department of Environmental</u>
- 26 Protection, in consultation with the Department of Agriculture,
- 27 <u>shall develop an organic land management plan for the</u>
- 28 Commonwealth, which shall be used by Commonwealth agencies and
- 29 municipalities as the method of choice to understand, prevent
- 30 and control actual and potential plants considered to be noxious

- 1 weeds.
- 2 (b) Components. -- The essential practices of organic land
- 3 management shall include:
- 4 <u>(1) Regular soil testing.</u>
- 5 (2) The addition of approved soil amendments as
- 6 <u>necessitated by soil test results, following recommendations</u>
- 7 by appropriate farming and agricultural associations, as
- 8 <u>determined by the Department of Environmental Protection in</u>
- 9 <u>consultation with the Department of Agriculture.</u>
- 10 (3) The selection of plantings using criteria of:
- 11 <u>(i) Hardiness and suitability to native conditions.</u>
- 12 <u>(ii) Drought, disease and pest resistance.</u>
- 13 <u>(iii) Ease of maintenance.</u>
- 14 (4) Modification of outdoor management practices to
- 15 <u>comply with organic horticultural science</u>, including
- scouting, monitoring, watering, mowing, pruning, proper
- 17 spacing and mulching.
- 18 (5) The use of physical controls, including hand-weeding
- 19 and over-seeding.
- 20 (6) The use of biological controls, including the
- 21 introduction of natural predators, and enhancement of the
- 22 <u>environment of a pest's natural enemies.</u>
- 23 (7) Through observation, determining the most effective
- treatment time based on pest biology and other variables,
- 25 such as weather and local conditions.
- 26 (8) Eliminating pest habitats and conditions supportive
- of pest population increases.
- 28 § 5916. Reports on pesticide usage.
- 29 (a) Required notice. -- Beginning six months after the
- 30 effective date of this subsection, each Commonwealth agency and

- 1 municipality shall:
- 2 (1) Report and update information regarding the usage of
- any kind of pesticide to the department.
- 4 (2) Post the information under paragraph (1) on the
- 5 <u>publicly accessible Internet website of the Commonwealth</u>
- 6 <u>agency or municipality.</u>
- 7 (b) Contents. -- Each required report and update under
- 8 <u>subsection</u> (a) must include the following information:
- 9 <u>(1) The common name of the pesticide.</u>
- 10 (2) The trade name of the pesticide.
- 11 (3) The registration number designated by the United
- 12 <u>States Environmental Protection Agency.</u>
- 13 <u>(4) The amount of pesticide applied.</u>
- 14 (5) The method of application.
- 15 (6) The location where the pesticide was applied.
- 16 <u>(7) The square footage of area where the pesticide was</u>
- 17 applied.
- 18 (8) The name of the person applying the pesticide.
- 19 (9) The name of the entity employing or directing the
- 20 person applying the pesticide.
- 21 (10) Whether the person applying the pesticide posted
- 22 any notices informing the public that the pesticide was
- 23 <u>applied</u>.
- 24 § 5917. Rules and regulations.
- 25 The department shall promulgate or adopt any rules or
- 26 regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this
- 27 <u>chapter.</u>
- 28 Section 2. The prohibition under 35 Pa.C.S. § 5913(a) shall
- 29 apply as follows:
- 30 (1) For public grounds in the nature of a golf course or

- a sports or athletic field, the prohibition shall apply on or after 36 months after the effective date of this paragraph.
- 3 (2) For public grounds other than a golf course or a 4 sports or athletic field, the prohibition shall apply on or 5 after 18 months after the effective date of this paragraph. 6 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
